Pastor's Note

“IF YOU WOULD BE PERFECT...”

In the second half of the Third Christian century, a young Christian man in Egypt named Anthony inherited a modest fortune upon his parents' death. Six months after their death, as he was on his way to church, he was thinking of how the Apostles had left everything to follow Christ and how the early Christians in Jerusalem had renounced their personal property and held all their goods in common. Then, upon entering the church as the Gospel was being read, he heard the words of Christ to the rich young man: *If thou wouldst be perfect, go and sell all you have and give the money to the poor—thou wilt have riches in heaven. Then come and follow me.*

Believing that God was speaking directly to him,

young Anthony did just that. He embarked upon a life of prayer and renunciation until his death at 105 in the year A.D. 356. Many followed his example and he eventually gave many of these monks direction, laying the first foundations of common life. He is venerated as “St. Anthony of Egypt” and his feast-day is observed on January 17th.

This coming week on January 17th, one of our parishioners, Erika da Silva, will enter the convent in order to test her vocation to the consecrated religious life. She is entering the convent of a small, traditional religious community in Still River, Massachusetts—the Sisters of the Slaves of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Sisters staff the Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic school. Their name, “Slaves of the Immaculate Heart of Mary”, is drawn from the True Devotion to Mary spirituality of St. Louis de Montfort.

It is a wonderful thing for any one, particularly a young person, to aspire to the consecrated religious life, which so closely resembles that life of the first Christians in Jerusalem which we read about in the Acts of the Apostles. Indeed it is a blessing for our whole parish.

But we should not think that this is a step which requires a superhuman strength or that it comes as a result of God bombarding a person with miraculous signs. A desire for such a vocation comes quite naturally out of living by the Commandments, frequently receiving the Sacraments, and learning how good God is. He invites, but He does not force the choice upon us. A true interior vocation must come from the “yes” that the individual gives and keeps renewing.

Our prayers and our love go with our parishioner Erika as she becomes a postulant with the Sisters this week. And we know that her prayers will come back to us.

Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good: loving one another with the charity of brotherhood: with honor preventing one another: in carefulness not slothful: in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: rejoicing in hope: patient in tribulation: instant in prayer: communicating to the necessities of the saints: pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep: being of one mind towards one another; not minding high things, but consenting to the humble.

GRADUAL: Psalm 106. 20-21 The Lord sent His word, and healed them: and delivered them from their destruction. *V.* Let the mercies of the Lord give glory to Him: and His wonderful works to the children of men.

ALLELUIA: Psalm 148. 2 Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* Praise ye the Lord, all His Angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: John 2. 1-11 At that time there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus was also invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the

mother of Jesus saith to Him: They have no wine. And Jesus saith to her: Woman, what is that to Me and to Thee? My hour is not yet come. His mother saith to the waiters: Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set six water-pots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three measures apiece*. Jesus saith to them: Fill the water-pots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus said to them: Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. And they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth the bridegroom, and saith to him: Every man at first setteth forth good wine: and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee; and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.




