



THE LEGEND OF PROVENCE

In the Lives of the Saints there is a pious tradition which recounts the fate of St. Mary Magdalene, her sister St. Martha, and her brother St. Lazarus (the one whom Christ raised from the dead) after the Ascension. According to this tradition, the three siblings were caught up in the persecution of Jewish Christians by their fellow Jews during the 40’s of the Christian era. They, together with other followers of Jesus, were put in a boat without oar or sail, and pushed out into the Mediterranean Sea to die. Aided by a special dispensation of Divine Providence their boat was guided across the waters until they landed in the south of present-day France near Marseilles, which was a well-developed Roman

Province (Provence). There they began to preach the Gospel to the local inhabitants. This 15th century painting shows the scene of St. Mary Magdalene preaching to the inhabitants of Marseilles.



St. Martha converted the people of the lower Rhone when she, by Christian gentleness, tamed an amphibious, flesh-eating creature called the “Tarasque” and brought it into the town on a leash. St. Martha’s relics are preserved at a shrine-church in Tarascon where this episode is supposed to have taken place. St. Martha died around the year 68 A.D.

St. Mary Magdalene sought a life of solitude and retired to the wilderness of Provence. She lived out the rest of her days deep in prayer. This place is called the Sainte Baume and is a

pilgrimage site to this day.

This legendary sojourn of SS. Mary Magdalene, Martha and Lazarus in Provence is not, of course, a dogma of faith, nor is it verifiable according to the very recent criteria established by the academic discipline of scientific history. (For that matter, hardly any pre-Modern historical accounts of any human event are verifiable by the measure of scientific history: they have all been passed down to us through good stories and any antique manuscripts that may have survived are often but written accounts of the same good stories.)

St. Louis de Montfort writes in *The Secret of the Rosary* how we ought to apply three different kinds of faith to three different kinds of stories:

*To the stories of Holy Scripture we owe **divine faith**; to stories concerning other than religious subjects, which do not militate against common sense and which are written by trustworthy authors, we pay the tribute of **human faith**; whereas to stories about holy subjects which are told by good authors and are not in the slightest degree contrary to reason, faith, or morals (even though they may sometimes deal with happenings which are the above the ordinary run of events) we pay the tribute of **pious faith**.*



It is under this last category of “pious faith” that the Legend of Provence falls. This is not to say that there is no documentary or archaeological evidence at all to suggest its basis in fact. There is.

A French Archbishop’s testimony on the evangelization carried out in Provence by Mary Magdalene and her fellow Christians from Judea has survived from the early 9th century. He makes reference to the destruction of the whole civilization of Provence by the Saracen (Muslim) invasion of the 8th century. Furthermore, archaeological investigation in modern times has established that there was a colony of Christians in Provence during the First Century A.D.

We may turn again to St. Louis de Montfort for a standard on how we may accept the wonderful stories we read of in the Lives of the Saints as an extension of the virtue of charity:

I agree that we must be neither too credulous nor too critical and that we should remember that “virtue takes the middle course”—keeping a happy medium in all things in order to find just where truth and virtue lie. But on the other hand I know equally well that charity easily leads us to believe all that is not contrary to faith and morals: “Charity...believeth all things;” (I Cor. 13) in the same way pride induces us to doubt even well authenticated stories on the plea that they are not to be found in the Bible.




