OUR TIMES

By next Sunday our national elections will have taken place (Tuesday, November 6th), and either we will have a re-elected President or a President-elect. One election will have been decided and yet, at the same time, with regard to the divisive issues of the day, nothing will have been definitively resolved. Therefore it is important for us as Catholic believers to take a step back, and make sure that we are viewing our times with the appropriate supernatural perspective.

First of all, Christ has won the Victory and that cannot be altered by any course of human events between Easter and the Second Coming. If it seems that Christ's side is "up" in the outcome of a contest, it does not mean that we can rest from our struggle to bear witness to Christ in the face of an unbelieving world. On the other hand, if it seems that Christ's side is "down", we should not be carried away by our own distress. God's times are long, usually, and we need to face them with the patient endurance born of real faith.

What is the petition St. Paul makes as the forces of darkness are closing in upon the early Church in the early Sixties of the first Christian century?

*I desire therefore, first of all, that supplications, prayers, intercessions and thanksgivings be made for all men: For kings and for all that are in high station: **that we may lead a quiet and a peaceable life in all piety and chastity.** (I Tim. 2:-1-2)*

No matter what is going on in the world around us, our primary goal is to be striving to live according to the ways of the Gospel.

Recently, a great intellectual figure of our age, Jacques Barzun, died at the age of 104. Born in France before the First World War, an educator at Columbia University for nearly half-a-century, Dr. Barzun articulated a theory of the long decline of Western Civilization in his master work: *From Dawn to Decadence: Five Hundred Years of Western Cultural Life from 1500 to the Present*, published when he was 93 years old. In his assessment, we are living through a profound internal crisis of the West, one in which nihilism and rebellion are both glamorized and celebrated. The implications of this civilizational decline for us as Catholics are not hard to discern.



THE FIRST LITURGICAL CHANGE OF THE SECOND VATICAN COUNCIL:

The Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) was to become known for the sweeping changes in Catholic liturgy which were introduced following its sessions: the replacement of Latin with the people's language, the free-standing altar with the priest saying Mass "towards the people" rather than "towards God", a completely re-worked rite of Mass.

Little remembered, however, is the very first liturgical change which was introduced by Pope John XXIII shortly after the Council opened in 1962. Pope John wanted St. Joseph's name introduced into the canon of the Mass (Eucharistic Prayer I in the New Roman Missal of Pope Paul VI). He did this out of his own piety in regard to St. Joseph, desiring to have St. Joseph's intercession explicitly invoked at every Mass.

The Pilgrimage to Loreto and Assisi, October 4th, 1962:



Seven days before the Second Vatican Council was to open, Pope John XXIII made a pilgrimage to the Holy House of Loreto, the Nazareth cottage of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph (which was wondrously transported from the Holy Land to Italy by angels in the 13th century),

and to Assisi to invoke the intercession of St. Francis. The Pope left the Vatican by train, and was greeted by happy and excited crowds at every stop along the way. This was the first time a reigning Pope had gone outside the walls of Rome since Pius IX in 1857. No longer was the Pope a "prisoner of the Vatican" after the loss of the Papal States in 1870. At the approach of the 50th Anniversary of the Second Vatican Council and the Opening of the Jubilee "Year of Faith", Pope Benedict XVI retraced the steps of this pilgrimage of Pope John to the House of Loreto and Assisi on

the very same day— October 4th, 2012, renewing Pope John's prayer intentions for the present day.



Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost

Vestments: Green

INTROIT: Jer. 29: 11, 12, 14 The Lord saith: I think thoughts of peace and not of affliction: you shall call upon Me, and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places. *Ps. 84:2* Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. *V.* Glory be to the Father.
