THE JOURNEY OF THE MAGI

The Twelve Days of Christmas, commonly reckoned from Christmas Day until January 5th (the “Twelfth Night”), are associated with the journey of the Magi Kings from the East to Bethlehem. As soon as they saw the mysterious star in the heavens, they made haste to journey west towards the land of the Jews. St. Matthew’s Gospel does not tell us how quickly these strangers from afar arrived at the Crib of the Christ Child, but it seems likely that it was soon after the Nativity. Catholic Bible commentator Juan Maldonatus, writing in the 16th century, demonstrated that it was indeed possible, given the travel times of his day, for the Magi Kings to have made it from (what would be today) the western part of Iraq to Jerusalem and Bethlehem in two weeks time, that is to say, within the Twelve Days of Christmas. There is no need to be dismissive about this popular custom of the Journey of the Magi in Twelve Days as if it were a purely fanciful tale with no possible basis in historical fact.

Traditional Epiphany carols paint a thrilling picture of this journey of a retinue across the

desert. Here is one example from an old Portuguese carol *Os Reis* (The Kings):

*Out of the Orient they came ariding
Three noble kings, of humble heart and mild;
They came to see the Blessed Lord of Heaven
Descend to earth, to be a little Child.
Precious gifts of gold and myrrh and incense,
Bringing God the gifts which God has made:
Low the kings in homage bowing,
At the feet of Mary laid.
(from Fr. Francis X. Weiser, S.J.:
The Christmas Book, A.D. 1952)*

The Magi Kings of the Epiphany are an image of to us of all human hearts seeking after God. But the journey is not an end in itself. Our present generation has a soft-spot for spiritual journeys which never reach a discovery. The Magi Kings are also an image to us of finding the object of our longing by the light of faith: “*And entering the dwelling, they found the Child with Mary, His mother, and prostrating themselves, they worshipped Him.*” (Matthew 2:11)





Sunday Within the Octave of the Nativity

Vestments: White

INTROIT: Wisdom 18: 14-15 While all things were in quiet silence, and the night was in the midst of her course, Thy almighty Word, O Lord, came down from heaven from Thy royal throne. *Psalm 92: 1* The Lord hath reigned, He is clothed with beauty: the Lord is clothed with strength, and hath girded Himself. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Almighty and everlasting God, direct our actions according to Thy good pleasure: that we may deserve to abound in good works in the name of Thy beloved Son: Who with Thee liveth.

EPISTLE: Galatians 4: 1-7 Brethren, as long as the heir is a child, he differeth nothing from a servant, though he be lord of all: but is under tutors and governors until the time appointed by the father: so we also, when we were children, were serving under the elements of the world. But when the fullness of the time was come, God sent His Son, made of a woman, made under the law, that He might redeem them who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. And because you are sons, God hath sent the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying: Abba, Father. Therefore now he is not a servant, but a son: and if a son, an heir also through God.

And Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary His mother: Behold, this child is set for the fall, and for the resurrection of many in Israel: and for a sign which shall be contradicted: and thy own soul a sword shall pierce, that out of many hearts thoughts may be revealed. And there was one Anna a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Aser: she was far advanced in years, and had lived with her husband seven years from her virginity. And she was a widow until fourscore and four years: who departed not from the temple, by fastings and prayers serving night and day. Now she, at the same hour, coming in, confessed to the Lord: and spoke of Him to all that looked for the redemption of Israel. And after they had performed all things according to the law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee to their city Nazareth. And the Child grew and waxed strong, full of wisdom: and the grace of God was in Him.




