SEEKERS ON THE WAY

During Advent I attended a Day of Recollection for priests of the West Region of the Archdiocese of Boston. The presenter was Fr. Stephen Linehan, pastor of St. Margaret Mary Parish in Westwood and a retired military chaplain from the U.S. Navy. Upon his recent retirement from the military and before returning to priestly ministry in the Archdiocese of Boston, he had made one of Christianity's oldest pilgrimages, the *Camino Santiago Compostela*, in the company of another retiring military priest. These two priests walked 500 miles across northern Spain from the Pyrenees in France to the western coast. The object of the pilgrimage is the tomb of St. James the Apostle, who was the Apostle who brought the Gospel to Spain.

On this *Camino* (The "Way") the two priests encountered many other pilgrims. Using the modern technology of their phones they put together a short film of their experience. One part of it was a sequence of short interviews with the other pilgrims they met: people from the U.S. and Europe, many young people, and not a few sturdy middle-aged and older people

people as well, men and women both. Each person in the film was asked the same question: *Why are you on the Camino?* One after another came answers like, "I dunno...still trying to figure it out", "Can't say," "It was something I felt I had to do..." The clearest answers were from people who were walking in memory of someone else in the way that people do charity walks for medical research.

Yet, here they all were, on the well-trodden pilgrimage road with such a long history, such a clear association with Christian faith, all kinds of shrines and markers...and making their exertions and sacrifices in a spiritual fog. They were, in fact, on the Way of the Gospel, but still looking for something else: on the Way, trying to find their way.

Fr. Linehan used this experience to suggest to us the larger implications of preaching the Gospel in our day. Are not those confused pilgrims on the *Camino* representative of so many people in our day: always seeking, but never quite finding?

Canadian priest Fr. Raymond J. De Souza, commenting on a recent Forum Research Poll in which 65% of Canadians identified themselves as "spiritual", but only 50% as "religious", sees the need for a vigorous re-presentation of historic, dogmatic Christianity in preaching and in living:

The only option is to abandon managing a largely superficial spirituality in favor of a persuasive invitation to go deeper than the generation previous, to propose again the truths of faith in all their depth and complete with the demands they make. That's called evangelization, and it was once what the churches did. They have to do it again.


WHAT DOES "A.D." MEAN?

The Christian calendar reckons all time as either
before or after the birth of Jesus Christ (the Year
1). In English usage, the initials "B.C." are
commonly used for the time "Before Christ", but
the Latin initials "A.D." are retained for the time
since Christ's birth. "A.D." means "Anno
Domini"—In the Year of the Lord (Jesus), since
Christ is very much alive.

For so it is written by the Prophet: And thou Bethlehem, the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come forth the Captain that shall rule My people Israel. Then Herod, privately calling the wise men, learned diligently of them the time of the star which appeared to them: and sending them into Bethlehem, said: Go and diligently inquire after the Child, and when you have found Him, bring me word again, that I also may come and adore Him. 


