THE FUTURE POPE'S CHILDHOOD CHRISTMAS LETTER:

Recently a childhood Christmas letter from Pope Benedict XVI as a 7 year old boy was discovered among his deceased sister Maria's papers. It is a 1934 letter he wrote to the Christ Child who brings good children gifts on Christmas Eve:

Dear Baby Jesus,

Quickly come down to earth. You will bring joy to children. Also bring me joy. I would like a Volks Schott, green clothing for Mass, and a Heart of Jesus. I will always be good.
—Greetings from Josef Ratzinger

(The “Volks Schott” was a German/Latin hand-missal, the “green clothing” referred to clothes which resembled the clerical garb of priests. His mother, a seamstress, made these clothes for him and his older brother Georg when they played the game of priest. The “Heart of Jesus” is an emblem of the Sacred Heart.)



Traditional Propers: Second Sunday after Epiphany

Vestments: Green

INTROIT: APOC. 5. 12; 1. 26, Let all the earth adore Thee, O God, and sing to Thee: let it sing a psalm to Thy name, O Most High. *Ps.65:4* Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: give glory to His praise.

V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT: Almighty and everlasting God who dost govern all things in heaven and earth, mercifully hear the prayers of Thy people, and grant us Thy peace all the days of our life. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Romans 2:6-16 Brethren: Having different gifts, according to the grace that is given us: either prophecy, to be used according to the rule of faith; or ministry, in ministering; or he that teacheth, in doctrine; he that exhorteth, in exhorting; he that giveth, with simplicity; he that ruleth, with carefulness; he that showeth mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good: loving one another with the charity of brotherhood: with honour preventing one another: in carefulness not slothful: in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: rejoicing in hope: patient in tribulation: instant in prayer: communicating to the necessities of the saints: pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep: being of one mind one towards another; not minding high things, but consenting to the humble.

GRADUAL: PS. 106.20-21 The Lord sent His word, and healed them: and delivered them from their destruction. *V.* Let the mercies of the Lord give glory to Him: and His wonder-ful works to the children of men.

ALLELUIA: PS. 148.2 Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* Praise ye the Lord, all His Angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: John 2. 1-11 At that time there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the mother of Jesus saith to Him: They have no wine.

And Jesus saith to her: Woman, what is that to Me and to thee? My hour is not yet come. His mother saith to the waiters: Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set there six water-pots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three measures apiece. Jesus saith to them: Fill the water-pots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus said to them: Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. And they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth the bride-groom, and saith to him: Every man at first setteth forth good wine: and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee; and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him. **CREED**




