

## MARCH IS THE MONTH OF SAINT JOSEPH

### Pastor's Note

### POPE FRANCIS

Last Wednesday, on the second day of voting, on the fifth ballot, the College of Cardinals selected Jorge Mario Cardinal Bergoglio, S.J., the Archbishop of Buenos Aires, Argentina, as the next Pope. When the Cardinals asked him what name he would take as Pope, he answered: “*Francis, in memory of St. Francis of Assisi.*” The anniversary dates of his election and installation will be easy to remember. The date of his election 3-13-13 is a good figure of Trinitarian Mystery—the God who is One-in-Three: three Divine Persons in One Unity of Godhead. The date of his installation as Pope is March 19th, St. Joseph’s Day, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Patron Saint of the Catholic Church.

Here at our parish of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes, the day of the Pope’s election coincided with the final safety check of the repairs we have been making on our bell-tower. This enabled us to turn on the electrical power to the bell tower after several months and peal our church bells to herald the joyous news: *Habemus Papam!*

We will enjoy getting to know our new Pope over these next few months and learn to love him as Holy Father, just as we have loved his illustrious predecessors in living memory.

Francis Cardinal George of Chicago, when asked by the press why the Conclave had chosen such an “old” Pope at 76 years, replied that the electors were not concerned whether the new Pope’s reign would be a long one or a short one: their concern was with electing the right man for this moment in time. I am sure that faithful Catholics will see this guiding principle validated by the way things unfold during the course of Pope Francis’s reign.

There has been a great deal of digging into Cardinal Bergoglio’s past since last week’s election. He seems very consistently to have shown a priestly-pastoral heart while at the same time not shying away from speaking those difficult to hear truths which a Bishop has the duty to say. One such pastoral statement, which struck me as particularly insightful, was Cardinal Bergoglio’s denunciation of the insidious withdrawal of health-care coverage for the elderly sick in Argentina. He said:

*In Argentina there is clandestine euthanasia. Social services pay up to a certain point; if you pass it, ‘Die, you are very old.’ Today, elderly people are discarded when, in reality, they are the seat of wisdom of the society. ... The right to life means allowing people to live and not killing, allowing them to grow, to eat, to be educated, to be healed, and to be permitted to die with dignity.*

The insight is not only that it is unjust to deny the elderly sick proper treatment because they are old, but that the whole society itself is harmed because the elderly are “*the seat of wisdom of the society*”, the very opposite of what a utilitarian society thinks. May Pope Francis have a long and fruitful reign.

### Traditional Propers

#### Palm Sunday

Vestments: Violet

**INTROIT: Psalm 21: 20, 22** O Lord, keep not Thy help far from me: look to my defense: deliver me from the lion's mouth, and my lowness from the horns of the unicorns. Psalm 21: 2 O God, my God, look upon me; why hast Thou forsaken me? Far from my salvation are the words of my sins. Lord, keep not...

**COLLECT** Almighty and everlasting God, who didst will that our Saviour should take upon Him our flesh and suffer death upon the cross, that all mankind should follow the example of His great humility; mercifully grant that we may both follow the example of His patience and also be made partakers of His resurrection. Through the same Christ our Lord.

**EPISTLE: Philippians 2: 5-11** Brethren, let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus: who being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God; but emptied Himself, taking the form of a servant, being made in the likeness of men, and in habit found as a man, He humbled Himself, becoming obedient unto death, even to the death of the cross. For which cause God also hath exalted Him, and hath given Him a name which is above all names: (*Here all genuflect*) that in the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth, and under the earth: and that every tongue should confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father.

**GRADUAL: Psalm 72: 24, 1-3** Thou hast held me by my right hand; and by Thy will Thou hast conducted me, and with Thy glory Thou hast received me. V. How good is God to Israel, to those of an upright heart! but my feet were almost moved, my steps had well-nigh slipped: because I was jealous of sinners, seeing the prosperity of sinners.

**TRACT: Psalm 21:2-9, 18, 19, 22, 24, 32** O God, my God, look upon me; why hast Thou forsaken me? V. Far from my salvation are the words of my sins. V. O my God, I shall cry by day, and Thou wilt not hear; and by night, and it shall not be reputed as folly in me. V. But Thou dwellest in the holy place, the praise of Israel. V. In Thee have our fathers hoped: they have hoped, and Thou hast delivered them. V. They cried to Thee, and they

were saved: they trusted in Thee, and were not He delighteth in Him. V. But they have looked and stared confounded. V. But I am a worm, and no man: the reproach of men and the outcast of the people. V. All they that saw me have laughed me to scorn: they have spoken with the lips and wagged the head. V. He hoped in the Lord, let Him deliver Him: let Him save Him, seeing upon me: they parted my garments amongst them, and upon my vesture they cast lots. V. Deliver me from the lion's mouth: and my lowness from the horns of the unicorns. V. Ye that fear the Lord, praise Him: all ye the seed of Jacob, glorify Him. V. There shall be declared to the Lord a generation to come; and the heavens shall show forth His justice. V. To a people that shall be born, which the Lord hath made.

**THE PASSION: Matthew 26: 1-75; 27: 1-66** At that time Jesus said to His disciples: You know that after two days shall be the Pasch, and the Son of man shall be delivered up to be crucified . . . And the next day, which followed the day of preparation, the chief priests and the Pharisees came together to Pilate, saying: Sir, we have remembered that that seducer said, while He was yet alive: After three days I will rise again. Command therefore the sepulcher to be guarded until the third day, lest perhaps His disciples come and steal Him away and say to the people: He is risen from the dead; and the last error shall be worse than the first. Pilate saith to them: You have a guard; go, guard it as you know. And they departing, made the sepulcher sure, sealing the stone and setting guards.

**OFFERTORY: Psalm 68: 21-22** My heart hath expected reproach and misery; and I looked for one that would grieve together with Me, but there was none: I sought for one that would comfort Me, and I found none; and they gave Me gall for My food, and in My thirst they gave Me vinegar to drink.

**SECRET** Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that the offering made in the presence of Thy majesty may procure us the grace of devotion, and effectually obtain for us a blessed eternity. Through our Lord.
