THE MERCY MEAL

My family and I wish to express our heartfelt gratitude to you, the parishioners of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes, for all of your kind support at the time of my mother Joyce Higgins's death. You were to us our friends and as our extended family. We will never forget it.

Several people asked me about the term used for the meal my family hosted after the funeral Mass and burial: the "Mercy Meal". They had never heard it before. Here is how I understand it as a specifically Christian expression.

At the funeral Mass of a Christian, we believe that we are witnessing a complete act of the Divine Mercy. The pledge of a future life made first at the baptismal font has now become a reality with the end of earthly life. Even as we


make generous use of the Masses and suffrages on behalf of the faithful departed, we know that Eternal Life has been secured for those whom God found pleasing at their passing from this life.

The Mass itself has a dual significance as the renewal of the one Sacrifice of Christ on Mount Calvary and the foretaste of the heavenly banquet. The proper understanding of the altar rail for receiving Holy Communion is not that it is a barrier to keeping the People of God away from the sanctuary, but rather that it is an extension of the altar itself to the People. In the Mystery of the Mass the altar of the Cross becomes transformed into the table of the heavenly banquet at the Lamb's (that is Christ's) High Feast, where the Lord Himself feeds us with His Risen Body.

Calling the after-funeral Mass dinner a "Mercy Meal" suggests that we who are left here on earth not only celebrate the Victory of the deceased person's entry into Eternal Life, but also that our feasting is in a somewhat mysterious way connected to the joy of Heaven, where we one day hope to be, and where we hope to be reunited forever with our dear ones who have gone before.

My niece Lucy Higgins (now a freshman in High School) noted the relaxed and friendly mood of her grandmother's Mercy Meal. Observing the parishioners out in the picnic area of the parish gardens and the young people's volleyball game going on, she said that was as it should be since, "It's a joyful occasion." And she was right—at the deepest level.

Wherefore, casting away all uncleanness and abundance of naughtiness, with meekness receive the ingrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

I have yet many things to say to you: but you cannot bear them now. But when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will teach you all truth. For He shall not speak of Himself: but what things soever He shall hear He shall speak, and the things that are to come He shall show you. He shall glorify Me: because He shall receive of Mine and shall show it to you.






