

Pastor's Note

THE HONORABLE JOSEPH R. NOLAN, R.I.P.

Catholic Boston and our parish of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes mourned the passing of a great man last in week in retired State Supreme Court Justice Joseph Nolan. He was 87 years old. "Judge Nolan", as many of us affectionately addressed him, was an individual who was accomplished, well-educated, savvy, thoroughly engaged in the rough-and-tumble of life, and at the same time thoroughly a man of Catholic faith, who was not ashamed to let people know it.

I first got to know Judge Nolan in the late 1990s through the Latin Mass Community at Holy Trinity Church in Boston. It deeply impressed me that a man of such distinction would serve the Mass as an ordinary altar server and consider it such an honor to do so. When the Latin Mass Community came to Mary Immaculate of Lourdes in 2007, Judge Nolan was still serving Mass every Sunday. Even though he bowed out in retirement, we still

considered him our senior server for the parish, and a mascot for the boys and young men of the Society of St. Tarcisius.

Even though his health was failing, Judge Nolan continued to come to Sunday Mass here at Mary Immaculate until just a few weeks ago, often accompanied by one of his daughters, Maura Nolan Brown. When I recall Judge Nolan in the front pew at Mary Immaculate I see him with his oxygen tank in one hand and his Rosary in the other. It was a powerful sign of those two things which, united to the Sacrifice of the Mass, most bring God's grace into this world—patience in suffering and humble prayer.

Those of us who attended Judge Nolan's wake and funeral Mass at St. Joseph's Church in Belmont found ourselves part of a throng of people. It was an hour-and-a-half wait to get in to pay our respects at the wake, and at the funeral Mass, people were out into the street from the main church doors, so full were the pews.

He will be much missed here at Mary Immaculate of Lourdes, but we will honor his memory and not fail to do him the charity of praying for the repose of his soul, as he himself prayed so fervently for so many others.

Vestments: White

INTROIT: Isaias 48: 20 Declare it with the voice of joy, and make it known, alleluia: declare it even to the ends of the earth: The Lord hath delivered His people, alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm 65: 1-2* Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: give glory to His praise. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, from whom all good things do proceed, grant unto Thy humble servants, that by Thy holy inspiration, we may think those things that are right, and under Thy guidance may perform the same. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: James 1: 22-27 Dearly beloved, be ye doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves. For if a man be a hearer of the word and not a doer, he shall be compared to a man beholding his own countenance in a glass: for he beheld himself and went his way, and presently forgot what manner of man he was. But he that hath looked into perfect law of liberty and hath continued therein, not becoming a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work: this man shall be blessed in his deed. And if any man think himself to be religious, not bridling his tongue but deceiving his own heart, this man's religion is vain. Religion pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: To visit the fatherless and widows in their tribulation and to keep one's self unspotted from this world.

FIRST ALLELUIA Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* Christ is risen, and hath shone upon us, whom He redeemed with His blood.

SECOND ALLELUIA: John 16: 28 Alleluia. *V.* I came forth from the Father, and am come into the world: again I leave the world and I go to the Father. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: John 16: 23-30 At that time Jesus saith to His disciples: Amen, amen, I say to you: If you ask the Father any thing in My name, He will give it you. Hitherto you have not asked any thing in My name: Ask, and you shall receive, that your joy may be full. These things I have spoken to you in proverbs. The hour cometh when I will no more speak to you in proverbs, but will show you plainly of the Father. In that day you shall ask in My name: and I say not to you that I will ask the Father for you: for the Father Himself loveth you, because you have loved Me and have believed that I came out from God. I came forth from the Father and am come into the world: again I leave the world and I go to the Father. His disciples say to Him: Behold now Thou speakest plainly and speakest no proverb. Now we know that Thou knowest all things and Thou needest not that any man should ask Thee: by this we believe that Thou camest forth from God.

OFFERTORY: Psalm 65: 8-9, 20 O bless the Lord our God, ye peoples, and make the voice of His praise to be heard: who hath set my soul to live, and hath not suffered my feet to be moved. Blessed be the Lord, who hath not turned away my prayer, nor His mercy from me, alleluia.

SECRET Receive, O Lord, the prayers and sacrifices of the faithful, that by these offices of loving devotion we may attain to heavenly glory. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION: Psalm 95: 2 Sing unto the Lord, alleluia, sing unto the Lord, and bless His name: show forth His salvation from day to day, alleluia, alleluia.

POSTCOMMUNION Grant us, O Lord, who have been nourished and strengthened at the heavenly table, both to desire that which is right, and to gain that which we desire. Through our Lord.
