OUR BLESSED MOTHER MARY

As you have noticed since last Sunday, we have a new banner hanging on a stand in the sanctuary of the church next to our Holy Name banner. This is the new banner for our Ladies' and Young Ladies' Sodality. It is a copy of the painting of the Mystery of the Immaculate Conception by Bartolomé Esteban Murillo (A.D. 1645). The banner is about 100 years old (the age of our parish church). The banner was

was purchased for the Sodality and the parish last year. Since then the Sodality has had some restoration work done and on the back of the banner is embroidered the name of our parish Sodality. We are grateful to the Sodality and to the individuals who have brought this beautiful banner to our church for all of us to enjoy.



Last Sunday we had a glorious May Procession after the 9 AM Mass First Holy Communion. Today we have a second group of children for their First Holy Communion at the 10:30 AM Latin Mass, and we will have a second May Procession also, culminating with the May Crowning in the parish gardens.

This Mother's Day Sunday offers us the opportunity to bring spiritual bouquets to Our Blessed Mother Mary as we gratefully recall all that her motherly merciful intercession does for us in this life.






