PENTECOST WEEK

The story is told of how Pope Paul VI, on the Monday after Pentecost, 1970, went into the sacristy to prepare for Mass. He was irritated when he saw green vestments laid out and demanded to know where the red vestments were for the Mass of Pentecost Monday. The sacristan informed the Pope that according to the New Order of Mass which had just been

been implemented for Advent 1969, the Holy Spirit Masses of Pentecost Week had been eliminated from the liturgical calendar. Pope Paul, who had a personal devotion to the Holy Spirit, then demanded to know who had made such a decision. “You did, Your Holiness,” was the reply. At that, the Pope began to weep.

Up until then, the Church celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost for a full week. There were three distinct parts to the Easter Season: Eastertide—Ascensiontide—and Whitsuntide/Pentecost Week. According to the Pauline Missal of 1970, the Easter season ends abruptly on Pentecost Sunday, and Ordinary Time resumes on the next day. This drastic change of the liturgists displeased even the promulgator of the Reform himself, Pope Paul VI.

According to the 1970 Missal, provision is explicitly given to continue Pentecost into Monday and Tuesday, with the repeating of the Mass of Pentecost Sunday or a Votive Mass of the Holy Spirit, but the distinct Pentecost Week Masses for each day of the week Monday-Saturday found in the Tridentine Missal have not been retained. This is a loss, and, perhaps, in a future revision of the Missal, Pentecost Week may be fully restored.

There is no reason, however, why we cannot keep the “spirit” of the Coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost at the forefront of our minds throughout this week. The miracle at Pentecost which defines the beginning of the Catholic Church touches upon the life of every individual Catholic believer. We are “Temples of the Holy Ghost”, we experience (insofar as we remain in the state of grace) the Divine Indwelling. Our lives here on earth take on more and more the character of pre-Heavenly living, even while we are still being marked by the Cross in the sufferings of the present.

Traditional Propers for Pentecost Sunday

Vestments: Red

INTROIT: Wisdom 1: 7 The Spirit of the Lord hath filled the whole world, alleluia; and that which containeth all things hath knowledge of the voice, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm 67:2* Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered: and let them that hate Him flee from before His face.

COLLECT O God, who on this day didst teach the hearts of Thy faithful people by the light of Thy Holy Spirit, grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgment in all things and ever rejoice in His holy consolation. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Acts of the Apostles 2: 1-11 When the days of the Pentecost were accomplished, they were all together in one place; and suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a mighty wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues as it were of fire, and it sat upon every one of them; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they began to speak with divers tongues, according as the Holy Ghost gave them to speak. Now there were dwelling at Jerusalem Jews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven. And when this was noised abroad, the multitude came together, and were confounded in mind, because that every man heard them speak in his own tongue. And they were all amazed, and wondered, saying: Behold, are not all these that speak Galileans? And how have we heard every man our own tongue wherein we were born? Parthians and Medes, and Elamites, and inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia, and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the parts of Lybia about Cyrene, and strangers of Rome, Jews also, and Proselytes, Cretes, and Arabians: we have heard them speak in our own tongues the wonderful works of God.

PASCHAL ALLELUIA: (*Psalm 103:30*) Alleluia, alleluia. V. Send for Thy Spirit, and they shall be created, and Thou shalt renew the face of the earth.

(*All kneel*) Alleluia. V. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful: and kindle in them the fire of Thy love.




