Pastor's Note

HEAVEN COME DOWN TO EARTH

As the Feast of Candlemas on February 2nd puts the definitive close to the celebration of Christmas each year, so the celebration of Corpus Christi after Trinity Sunday brings the spirit of the Easter Feast to a magnificent finale. On Holy Thursday, the institution of the Sacraments of the priesthood and of the Holy Eucharist by Christ at the Last Supper are remembered in the midst of the Sacred Triduum. The memory of Judas's betrayal and the beginning of the Sorrowful Passion make Holy Thursday's liturgy a somber one. All of the joy and the celebration we want to make for the gift of the Holy Eucharist is deferred until Corpus Christi. Now, in the afterglow of the Paschal Feast, we can express our happiness and gratitude to God for this gift of Himself in the Blessed Sacrament.

The Blessed Sacrament, the "Mystery of Faith", is Heaven come down to earth. Christ rose from the dead on Easter Sunday. Forty days later He

ascended into Heaven in His glorified Body. From Heaven, He extends the substance of this Body into the elements of the bread and wine consecrated during the celebration of the Mass by the priest in such a way that the appearances of bread and wine remain only. The substance of this bread and wine has been transformed into the substance of the living, glorified, resurrected and ascended Body of Jesus Christ our Lord. Catholic theology has a particular name for this miracle: *Transubstantiation*.

This transubstantiated bread and wine is a reality imperceptible to the human senses, but that does not make it less real. (On occasion, throughout history, God has allowed the consecrated Host to become sensibly bloody flesh, thus giving a sign to all.) It requires from each of us an act of faith: *Jesus Christ is really and truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar, the Holy Eucharist: Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity.*

This Eucharistic Jesus is the same Jesus we read about in the Books of the Gospels, who lived in Palestine 20 centuries ago: the same Jesus who preached the Sermon on the Mount, who raised Lazarus from the dead four days after he had been in the tomb, who multiplied a few loaves and fishes by His blessing and fed thousands upon thousands of people in superabundance there in a deserted place. This same Jesus is alive and here for us on earth *right now* in the Holy Eucharist. But so much depends on whether we really have faith or not. In the Gospels, Jesus works few or no miracles at all where there is no faith and an attitude of ill-will towards Him. So it is in our own day. Jesus will do many things for us, but one thing He will not do is take us by force and compel us to believe in and love Him against our will. He gives us freedom so that we may freely choose.

In like manner also the chalice, after He had supped, saying: This chalice is the new testament in My Blood; this do ye, as often as you shall show the death of the Lord until He come. Therefore whosoever shall eat this bread, or drink of the chalice of the Lord unworthily, shall be guilty of the Body and the Blood of the Lord. But let a man prove himself; and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of the chalice. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily

eateth and drinketh judgment to himself, not discerning the Body of the Lord.



O Patron Saints of my children, intercede in heaven for their salvation.


Angel guardians of my children, you who were appointed to the charge of my children's souls, intercede constantly before the heavenly throne of the Most Holy Trinity.

Amen.




NEW WEEKLY BIBLE STUDY: "THE GOSPEL OF LUKE"
