Pastor's Note



THE COLLECT PRAYER IN THE LEONINE DEVOTIONS

As many of you who read this are aware, the current Administration in Washington will soon implement a health care plan that requires individual citizens as well as health care providers to pay for contraceptives and abortifacient drugs in their health care plans. This mandate is a serious blow to the moral fabric of our country because it endorses morally destructive practices that undermine the physical and spiritual health of families and individuals. More fundamentally, however, this mandate is a violation of religious liberty, and is not merely an issue that concerns Catholics, but all American citizens.

In the face of such a grave crisis, it can be easy for us to be discouraged and sometimes fearful. Therefore, I want to draw particular attention to a certain collect prayer used as a popular devotion at the end of Low Mass in the Extraordinary Form. No matter which Mass you may attend on Sunday, or during the week, this is relevant for all of us, because it speaks to our current national dilemma. Composed by Pope Leo XIII, the prayer reads thus:

O God, our refuge and our strength, look down with favor upon Thy people who cry to Thee; and by the intercession of the glorious and Immaculate Virgin Mary, Mother of God, St. Joseph her Spouse, of Thy Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and of all the Saints, mercifully and graciously hear the prayers which we pour forth for the conversion of sinners, and for the liberty and exaltation of our Holy Mother the Church. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

First, I emphatically note that *all* of us are sinners, and that the prayer does *not* imply

that we Catholics are no longer sinners. What the prayer *does* mean is that it is the Church's explicit mission from Christ to call people to repentance and forgiveness of sins (cf. Luke 24:46-49). This call to conversion includes our fellow human beings in offices of the public trust, some of whom are promoting and legislating sinful practices that are contrary to the dignity of the human person. We would do well not to rationalize the gravity of this truth. We as a Church have the right and responsibility to identify moral evil for what it is, and to invite the perpetrators thereof to repentance and salvation. Therefore, we should confidently turn to God for aid in this mission.

The collect immediately focuses our attention on God by hailing Him as "*our refuge and our strength*," invoking the fortifying imagery of Psalm 46:1. Whatever the circumstances, it is critical for us to have confidence in the sovereignty of God.

The collect then calls us to commend our cares to the intercession of the Mother of God and Saint Joseph, the perfect examples of marriage and family life. Likewise the collect directs us to Saints Peter and Paul, the pillar Apostles of the universal Church, who were severely persecuted (and subsequently martyred) for the message of repentance and faith that they preached throughout the Roman Empire.

It is no accident that the prayer first elicits unreserved trust in God, and then points us to the exemplars of family life, on the one hand, and the exemplars of the Church's faith and mission, on the other. Many powers have threatened and continue to threaten both the family and the Church. Our current crisis is no exception. Thus, it is crucial that we form our prayer as Catholics according to this model, and pray not only for ourselves, but for persecuted Christians throughout the world, too.

If we truly believe that the Catholic Church contains the fullness of the truth (cf. John 14:6, 1 Tim. 3:15), then we will *want* to pray for the liberty and exaltation of the Church, so that she

might engage the culture and thereby call all sinners to conversion. This is God's will for our eternal happiness (cf. John 3:16-17, 17:3; Eph. 1:9-10; 1 Tim. 1:15, 2:4)

So I say to you, there shall be joy before the angels of God upon one sinner doing penance.


POPE FRANCIS AND FR. RAPHAEL FROM BAGHDAD:

Many of the new members of our parish from the Syriac-rite/Iraqi Catholic community were originally from the parish of Our Lady of Salvation in Baghdad. This was the scene of the terrible massacre perpetrated by an Islamist terror group on October 31st, 2010 where defenseless parishioners gathered for Mass were murdered en masse. Two of the parish priests were killed: a third survived. He led some parishioners into the sacristy during the attack and bolted the heavy metal door. The assassins tried to blow the door open with grenades but did not succeed. Fr. Raphael, who was closest to the door, however, was gravely wounded, and taken to France for treatment. Recently, his French hosts took him to an audience with Pope Francis. The following pictures show the Pope kissing Fr. Raphael's hand after the Iraqi priest revered his, and then embracing him. We are grateful to parishioner Nidham Ashkouri for forwarding them.
