



### Pastor’s Note

#### SILVER JUBILEE OF ORDINATION: AN OCCASION OF GRATEFUL THANKS


Ten years ago or so one of my former professors at the Seminary told an amusing story about himself with regard to the preparations for his 50th Anniversary celebration. He was putting together a program and he brought the draft to the printer. In it were two pictures: one of him at ordination and one as he was at 50 years ordained. The woman at the counter pointed to the picture of the young priest and asked, “And who’s that?”. “Uh, that’s me,” the priest replied. After an awkward pause, the woman at the counter recovered cheerily: “It happens to us all!”

This past Tuesday, June 25th, I marked the happy occasion of my 25th Anniversary of

priestly ordination. This Sunday, at all the parish Masses, I am adding this thanksgiving intention, and asking you for the support of your prayers: for my perseverance and the perseverance of all priests, that we may be faithful, generous priests to the end of our days.

On Ordination Day, 25 years into the future seemed a long time out. Looking back from now to then, it feels so quick, as do all of our markers in life. *“Time, how short; Eternity, how long...”*

As the ordination Class of 1988, we celebrated the day of our Silver Jubilee together at St. Joseph’s Retreat House in Milton, with a concelebrated evening Mass just for us in the Lady Chapel and then a time of fellowship with dinner in the retreat house. Our class preacher at this Mass was Fr. Steve Madden, pastor of St. Mary’s in Foxboro. I think he spoke for all of us when he stressed the spirit of gratitude felt on this occasion, as we look back on the last quarter century of our lives as ordained priests, and look forward in hope to the future. *(Fr. # SCRIPTURE STUDY COLUMN



## GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY Luke 1:26-38

Gabriel's first word to Mary, which we translate as "Hail" in the familiar Hail Mary prayer, is more literally translated from the Greek as "Rejoice!" This word is often used in the Old Testament to indicate that God has performed or is about to

perform something wonderful and miraculous. Oftentimes it is a clue word for us to identify texts that announce the coming and activity of the Messiah. More specifically, as the Ignatius Study Bible notes, the key characteristic of "the messianic age" is God's real presence among His people. How true this is for Mary, who *literally* received and bore God. Mary's "yes" to God is what brings Jesus into the world. How beautiful it is for us, who can share in Mary's joy and vocation by receiving Jesus in Holy Communion, and bring His real presence to others by the witness of our words and lives! As we read this passage, we should be encouraged to open ourselves to the movement of grace in our lives, so that we can bring Christ's presence to others.

Gabriel also calls Mary "full of grace." The Greek participle that we translate as "full of grace" can be translated more literally as, "she who has been graced." In addressing Mary this way, Gabriel "indicates that God has already 'graced' Mary previous to this point, making her a vessel who 'has been' and 'is now' filled with divine life," as the Ignatius Study Bible notes. Here, we see the seed of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception.

Gabriel goes on to describe the identity of

Mary's Son, employing royal terminology explicitly referring to the reign of king David. As the Navarre Bible explains, "the angel states that the Child marks the fulfillment of God's promises," which said that the Messiah would be a "descendant of David." But, as the notes from Navarre Bible stress, there's more: He is also the "Son of God." Here, we see Luke deliberately and clearly highlighting Jesus' identity as Son of God and Messiah, as well as the notion of promise and fulfillment. These are two of the principal recurring themes in his Gospel.

The Orthodox Study Bible notes that each member of the Trinity is mentioned in this passage. The "Most High" refers to God the Father. Jesus is called "Son of the Most High." The Holy Spirit is mentioned as the "power of the Most High," or the One who enables Mary to conceive Christ in her womb. Right from the beginning, Luke's Gospel reveals to us the two most central mysteries of our faith: God as a Trinity of Persons, and Christ as fully God and fully man. Likewise, we see the crucial role of the Holy Spirit in effecting the mystery of salvation.

Thus, this passage focuses on three key themes: Jesus' identity as Son of God and Messiah, the Person and work of the Holy Spirit, and the motif of promise and fulfillment in God's plan of salvation

**INTROIT: Psalm 27: 8-9** The Lord is the strength of His people, and the protector of the salvation of His anointed: save, O Lord, Thy people, and bless Thy inheritance, and rule them for ever. *Psalm 27: 8-9* Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent to me, lest if Thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

**COLLECT** O God of all power and might, who art the giver of all good things; implant in our hearts the love of Thy name, increase in us true religion, nourish us with all goodness and by Thy mercy keep us in the same. Through our Lord.

**EPISTLE: Romans 6: 3-11** Brethren, all we who are baptized in Christ Jesus are baptized in His death. For we are buried together with Him by baptism unto death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with Him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, and that we may serve sin no longer. For he that is dead is justified from sin. Now if ye be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall live also together with Christ. Knowing that Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more, death shall no more have dominion over Him. For in that He died to sin He died once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God. So do you also reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God; in Christ Jesus our Lord.

**GRADUAL: Psalm 89: 13, 1** Return, O Lord, a little; and be entreated in favour of Thy servants. *V.* Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation.

**ALLELUIA: Psalm 30: 2-3** Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and release me; bow down Thy ear to me, make haste to deliver me. Alleluia.

**GOSPEL: Mark 8: 1-9** At that time, when there was a great multitude with Jesus, and had nothing to eat, calling His disciples together, He saith to them: I have compassion on the multitude, for behold they have now been with Me three days, and have nothing to eat; and if I shall send them away fasting to their home, they will faint in the way: for some of them came from afar off. And His disciples answered Him: From whence can any one fill them here with bread in the wilderness? And He asked them: How many loaves have ye? Who said: Seven. And He commanded the people to sit down on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, giving thanks, He broke and gave to His disciples to set before the people. And they had a few little fishes, and He blessed them, and commanded them to be set before them. And they did eat, and were filled; and they took up that which was left of the fragments, seven baskets: and they that had eaten were about four thousand: and He sent them away.
