



Pastor's Note

“A LITTLE CHILD SHALL LEAD THEM.”

It is fitting during these days of the year that we are particularly mindful of little children and babies. Among the prophecies of Isaias read during Advent we hear this one from Chapter 11:6: *“The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid, and the calf and the lion and the fatling together and a little child shall lead them.”* That “Child” of the prophecy is the Divine Child

Jesus Christ.


Last year at this time we were united in prayer as a parish community for a little baby Dominic Pio Gundrum, who was hanging between life and death at Children's Hospital. He had been born with a serious birth defect, an encephelocele in which his brain was exposed, covered in skin outside the middle of his face. Mark and Mary Gundrum had journeyed from their home in Wisconsin with their seven older children to Boston because that was where a plastic surgeon Dr. John Meara was who had performed a successful surgery on a Haitian boy with this condition in 2008. One of our parish families opened their home to the Gundrums and that was how the Gundrum family came in touch with Mary Immaculate of Lourdes. Although the child nearly died after the surgery, he did survive and his family took him home to Wisconsin shortly after Christmas. *The Boston Globe* did a feature story on this case which ran on January 29th, 2013. As of this month Dominic is doing well and seems to be developing normally if slowly. This is a current picture of him.



Recently one of our parish families who had moved back to France this summer, Adrien and H el ene Belign e, shared the good news that they were expecting another child. Then they learned that their unborn son, whom they have named Xavier, has trisomy 13 which is often fatal. They have accepted their cross with an admirable Christian spirit. Let us unite in prayer once again as a parish community for this other child Xavier, for his parents, and his two brothers Gauthier and Eric: that God's good purposes in this situation may be fulfilled.

KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH



GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY

Luke 5:1-11

The first thing that strikes me about this passage, is how St. Luke describes the crowd "pressing in on Jesus" to hear Him, so much so, that He had to get into a boat and teach them a little off the shore. Do we hear the Gospel at Mass with the same eagerness? Do we anticipate that the Lord is addressing *us*, and

not that we are merely rehearsing the things He said long ago? In an Orthodox Church that I once attended in college, there was a custom for the people to draw a little nearer to the deacon as he chanted the Gospel in the nave (many Orthodox Churches do not have pews, thus facilitating this kind of movement). This particular congregation replicated the same phenomenon of the crowds "pressing in" upon the Lord to hear Him. Perhaps, as we hear the Gospel at Mass, and read our Bibles during the week, we could approach the Lord's words with increased devotion and obedience.

After finishing his teaching (we wonder what He might have been teaching them), He instructs Simon Peter to go fishing in the middle of the day (when fish were least likely to be caught). Simon Peter protests, but immediately acquiesces. As he says, "at your command, I will lower the nets" (v. 5). It is not a surprise that he responds to Jesus in this way, because he had just witnessed the power of Jesus' command over the demon-possessed

man, as well as over his ailing mother-in-law (cf. 4:35, 39).

To Simon Peter's great surprise, he and his partners draw in a *massive* catch, so great even, that their boats take on water! The lesson for us, here, is that our Lord always operates on the principles of grace and "abundance," not "scarcity," as one of my professors put it. Perhaps you have heard the phrase, "God can never be outdone in generosity." This passage, among many others, proves precisely this point.

There is an application to our stewardship here, too. No matter how great the sacrifices we make, (which for many of us are often quiet and unappreciated), God will never fail to reap an abundant harvest of fruit from our labors, and to reward us abundantly out of his sheer gratuity, both now, and infinitely more in eternity. Let us take the risk to give more, like Simon Peter, and let us not be surprised to see what happens when we sacrifice in faith. God will not, indeed, He cannot, be outdone in generosity.

As with all things, the Lord commands Simon Peter's obedience in this task (which is seemingly destined for failure), because through it, He powerfully demonstrates that He is worthy of Simon Peter's complete trust. The miraculous catch manifests Jesus' absolute Lordship. Thus, Jesus forecasts that the Church he builds upon Simon Peter ultimately rests upon His divine protection and authority, and will always weather every storm (cf. Mt. 16:18-19). Following the Tradition of the Church, we can think of the boat in this passage as an analogy for the Church gathering all men, and journeying to the port of heaven through the storms of life. Jesus Himself hints at this when He says to Simon Peter, "from now on, you will be catching men" (v. 10).

Simon Peter falls at Jesus' feet in adoration, recognizing Him as the Lord of creation. His gesture of falling before Jesus is unmistakably an act of worship. In fact, he feels so unworthy in the divine presence, that he exclaims, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man" (v. 8). *Domine, non sum dignus...* "Lord, I am not worthy." Nevertheless, the Lord reassures him: "Do not be afraid" (v. 10). *Sed tantum dic verbo, et sanabitur anima mea...* "But only say the word..." (emphasis mine). As with Simon Peter, the

Lord reassures us of his love for us at every Mass. When we kneel before Jesus at Mass, or in our private prayers, let us be more fully conscious of the *authority and worthiness* of the One before whom we kneel. As St. Peter says in his first epistle (likely reflecting on this and many other instances where the Lord merited his trust), "Cast all your worries upon him because he cares for you" (1 Pet. 5:7). Finally, let us be grateful, as was Simon Peter, for the abundance of graces he gives us, both temporal and spiritual.


CHRISTMAS FLOWER DONATIONS

And he answered: No. They said therefore unto him: Who art thou, that we may give an answer to them that sent us? What sayest thou of thyself? He said: I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness, make straight the way of the Lord, as said the Prophet Isaias. And they that were sent were of the Pharisees. And they asked him, and said to him: Why then dost thou baptize, if thou be not Christ, nor Elias, nor the Prophet? John answered them, saying: I baptize with water: but there hath stood one in the midst of you, whom you know not. The same is He that shall come after me, who is preferred before me: the latchet of whose shoe I am not worthy to loose. These things were done in Bethania, beyond the Jordan, where John was baptizing.




