Pastor's Note

THE NEW CREATION

“In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.” (Genesis 1:1) This is the well-known first verse of the Bible. God creates the world in the figure of Six Days and on the Seventh Day He rested. “Thus the heavens and the earth were finished and all the host of them. And on the seventh day God finished His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God had rested from all His work which He had done in creation.” (Genesis 2:1-3) Because of this sequence of Seven Days the number Seven is

considered, as a mystic number, to be a figure of completeness and totality.

Christianity therefore views the miracle of Jesus Christ’s Resurrection from the Dead as the “Eighth Day” of Creation or the First Day of the New Creation. When Jesus Christ came back from the dead, by His own Divine Power, it was the effect of God creating the world anew.

As Christians we can take this astounding proclamation of Resurrection for granted only because it has been around in the world for so many centuries. But consider the claim: Jesus of Nazareth, who was tortured and crucified to death and buried in a sealed tomb, returned to life on the third day as He had foretold He would. He did not return to life, however, as if restored to His former life on earth. No, He returned to life in a new, unforeseeable, and barely describable form of His individual life. It was the new life of the Resurrection. For those who were actual eye-witnesses to its reality there could be no doubt that they there now in uncharted territory of human experience.



By Baptism, a Christian becomes a part of this New Creation even while still living on this earth. This is not magical, nor is there anything automatic about it. For anyone who is capable of reason, there must be a choice of the will for living out the promises of Baptism, and the mind and the will must reinforce each other continually. “Sleeping Christians” (that is, people baptized, but not living and practicing Christianity in any meaningful way) hardly do justice to the New Creation wrought into being by Christ’s Resurrection.

May the thrilling re-affirmation of Christ’s Resurrection on this Easter Day inspire us to live with more awareness that we are part of God’s New Creation, and that what we begin to live in Time will one day be our Eternity.

KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH



EASTER GOSPEL *Matthew 28:1-10*

The Gospel lesson for the Easter Vigil Mass (Ordinary and Extraordinary Forms) is St. Matthew's thrilling account of the myrrh-bearing women's arrival at Jesus' tomb, the subsequent earthquake, and the angelic announcement

of the resurrection. In the Ordinary Form, the next three verses are also included, which recount the unexpected meeting with Jesus on the way.

As one reads this passage, one is struck by the rapidity with which the events took place, and how charged this passage is with joyful energy. Weighed down with grief, the women were filled with sudden terror as they beheld an angel. This was no chubby cherub, but a intimidating and glorious being. Lightning is the closest approximation that St. Matthew can make for what it was like for the women to encounter him (v. 3). He was so frightening (having rolled away the multi-ton stone), that the macho guards fainted (vv. 2, 4). His very presence heralded the power, vitality, and glory of the Risen Lord, whose resurrection he then proclaimed to them (v. 6).

After all the *many* times Jesus had told His disciples that He was going to suffer, die, and rise again, one would expect the disciples to have been

anticipating the event. All of the evangelists reveal the contrary. The disciples were hiding away for fear, and the women had only showed up to finish the hurried job of Friday's embalming- they were not keeping vigil for a resurrection of any kind.

Upon receiving the news of the resurrection, they then ran to tell the disciples (v. 8). Their minds were probably racing as wildly as their bodies, trying to process it all as they were trying to catch their breath! As we hear this passage chanted, we can really sense the adrenaline and euphoria, when suddenly, it gets even better: Jesus himself meets them on the road. What a stunning moment.


We share in this moment at every Mass, but especially at Easter. Having heard the joyful pronouncement of the Gospel, we meet the risen Jesus at the moment of consecration, under the appearances of bread and wine. It is good for us to meditate on the fact that He is just as glorious and life-giving now as He was when the women saw him that first Easter morning. As St. Paul tells us, "Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him" (Rom. 6:9).

As we celebrate another Easter, may we find joy in encountering Jesus personally, just like the myrrh-bearing women. May we have a renewed sense of the importance of meeting with Him in daily prayer, Bible reading, and most especially, our weekly/daily participation in the sacraments. May we cherish these privileged encounters! May the risen Jesus bring an increase of joy and peace to our souls and our families this Easter. Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen! *Christus Surrexit! Vere Surrexit!* Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen!



EASTER SUNDAY

INTROIT: Psalm 138: 18, 5-6, I arose, and am still with Thee, alleluia: Thou hast laid Thine hand upon me, alleluia: Thy knowledge is become wonderful, alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 1-2:* Lord, Thou hast searched me, and known Me: Thou knowest my sitting down and my rising up. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, Who on this day through Thine only-begotten Son hast overcome death and opened unto us the gate of everlasting life; do Thou follow with Thine aid the desires which Thou dost put into our minds and by Thy continual help bring the same to good effect. Through the same Lord.

EPISTLE: I Corinthians 5: 7-8 Brethren, purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new paste, as you are unleavened, for Christ our Pasch is sacrificed. Therefore let us feast, not with the old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

GRADUAL: Psalm 117: 24, I This is the day which the Lord hath made: let us be glad and rejoice in it. *V.* Give praise unto the Lord, for He is good: for His mercy endureth forever. **ALLELUIA: I Corinthians 5: 7** Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* Christ our Pasch is sacrificed.

SEQUENCE Forth to the Paschal Victim, Christians, bring your sacrifice of praise. The Lamb redeems the sheep, and Christ the sinless one has to the Father sinners reconciled. Together, death and life in a strange conflict strove: the Prince of Life, who died, now lives and reigns. What thou sawest, Mary, say, as thou wentest on the way? I saw the tomb wherein the living one had lain; I saw His glory as He rose again; yea, napkin and linen clothes, and angels twain: Yea, Christ is risen, my hope, and He will go before you into Galilee. We know that Christ indeed has risen from the grave: hail, thou King of victory, have mercy, Lord, and save. Amen.

GOSPEL: Mark 16: 1-7 *At* that time, Mary Magdalen, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought sweet spices, that coming they might anoint Jesus. And very early in the morning, the first day of the week, they came to the sepulcher, the sun being now risen. And they said, one to another: Who shall roll us back the stone from the door of the sepulchre? And looking, they saw the stone rolled back. For it was very great. And entering into the sepulchre, they saw a young man sitting on the right side clothed with a white robe, and they were astonished. Who saith to them: Be not affrighted, ye seek Jesus of Nazareth, Who was crucified: He is risen, He is not here; behold the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples, and Peter, that He goeth before you into Galilee. There you shall see Him as He told you.

OFFERTORY: Psalm 75: 9-10 The earth trembled and was still when God arose in judgment, alleluia.

SECRET Accept, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the prayers of Thy people with the oblation of sacrifice; that what we have begun by these Paschal mysteries, by Thy operation may profit us for a healing remedy unto everlasting life. Through our Lord.




