



Pastor's Note

MEMORIAL DAY AND ASCENSIONTIDE

This Monday, May 26th, in conjunction with the national observance of Memorial Day, honoring our country's war-dead, we will have our annual open-air Mass at our parish cemetery of St. Mary's, remembering our own beloved dead who are buried there. The Mass will be at 10 o'clock in the morning, under the canopy-tent which will be set up on the road near the superintendent's office.

According to the way in which the Church calendar falls, this year's Memorial Day falls on the first of the three Rogation Days leading up to the Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord. From the perspective of faith it ought to draw us to make the connection between honoring the memory of our dead in a cemetery and praying for them, and the opening of the gates of Heaven to redeemed humanity which is a central part of the Mystery of faith regarding Christ's Ascension.

People have many different approaches to the remembrance of their dead, as we know. Some of them are of quite ancient custom and others quite contemporary, reflecting the sensibilities of America 2014. Catholic burial tradition, however, expresses the basic Christian belief in a future life, which is above and beyond this world, and in a return to life in our own bodies in a higher state of life, that is, after the manner of Christ's glorified Body when He came forth from the tomb.


Catholic cemeteries are consecrated places: the grave of a Catholic in a non-Catholic cemetery is blessed as part of the Catholic Burial Rite. Catholics believe in the immortality of the individual human soul, which survives the calamity of bodily death, and is destined to experience the Resurrection as the fullness of Christ's Redemption. *(Fr. KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH



GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY (Luke 9:7-9, 18-21)

Now that we are about a third of the way through his Gospel, St. Luke mentions King Herod's reaction to all the "buzz" about Jesus. At this point, Herod has heard of Jesus' healings and exorcisms, and about how enormous crowds flocked to Him. As St.

Luke explains, "he was greatly perplexed," because of multiple reports about who He was: John the Baptist, Elijah, or some other prophet (v. 7). Herod is told that Jesus is an apparition of some kind. Paranoid as he often was, he may have feared that John the Baptist's ghost had returned to haunt him after the beheading, as one professor noted, regarding Jewish belief about ghosts. Interestingly enough, Herod desires to see Jesus (v. 9), and in chapter 23, he finally does get his chance. He is disappointed, however, because he does not recognize who Jesus *really* is. Jesus' identity is the issue St. Luke brings to the fore in this chapter. St. Peter's confession, placed after the feeding of the five thousand, is the response to Herod's perplexity.

After the feeding of the five thousand, we see Jesus "praying in solitude" (v. 18). As the commentaries explain, whenever St. Luke portrays Jesus praying, it means that an important revelation


of some kind is about to happen. Two critical examples are the Father's declaration that Jesus is His Son, both at Jesus' baptism and His transfiguration (cf. 3:21-22, 9:28-36). As these and other examples demonstrate, the revelations that occur in conjunction with Jesus at prayer always concern His identity and mission.

In this instance, St. Peter is the instrument of the revelation. Jesus asks His disciples who the people say He is. Note the continuity with the litany they give him and the litany given to Herod earlier in the chapter: John the Baptist, Elijah, or one of the other prophets. Jesus directs the question more pointedly toward His disciples: "But who do you say that I am?", to which St. Peter replies, "The Messiah of God" (v. 20). This is the hinge point of the Gospel, for from this point on, Jesus begins to speak about His Passion, and He begins to travel gradually to Jerusalem for the events of Holy Week.

What is the significance of this? As the Catechism explains, all of Jesus' signs, healings, teachings, and exorcisms point to the reality of His ultimate mission: redemption from sin. It is through His death and resurrection that man is delivered from the devil, and human nature is fundamentally transformed and healed (cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church* nos. 515-518, 542, 1505). Thus, Jesus' public ministry (which we have been tracking now for many weeks), is geared toward helping others recognize Him as the Messiah and Son of God. By recognizing His identity through His signs, His disciples can begin to discover the deeper reality in all the signs: His Paschal Mystery (death and resurrection).

Who do you say that Jesus is? This is a question that we might not think we need to be asked, especially if we have been Catholics or Christians all our lives. All of the Lord's disciples, however, can stand to be reminded of the *implications* of St. Peter's correct answer. If Jesus is the Christ, and the Son of God, then 1) He has ultimate, rightful, and benevolent sovereignty in each of our lives (including such things as fertility and finances), 2) His truth claims trump the social script we so easily imbibe (such things as "all religions are the same," or "do what feels good"), 3) His resurrection is the thing that matters most in the end (His love is stronger than our death).



FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

But he that hath looked into perfect law of liberty and hath continued therein, not becoming a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work: this man shall be blessed in his deed. And if any man think himself to be religious, not bridling his tongue but deceiving his own heart, this man's religion is vain. Religion pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: To visit the fatherless and widows in their tribulation and to keep one's self unspotted from this world.

The hour cometh when I will no more speak to you in proverbs, but will show you plainly of the Father. In that day you shall ask in My name: and I say not to you that I will ask the Father for you: for the Father Himself loveth you, because you have loved Me and have believed that I came out from God. I came forth from the Father and am come into the world: again I leave the world and I go to the Father. His disciples say to Him: Behold now Thou speakest plainly and speakest no proverb. Now we know that Thou knowest all things and Thou needest not that any man should ask Thee: by this we believe that Thou camest forth from God.




