Pastor's Note

THE "GREAT COMMISSION"

Shortly before His Ascension, the Lord Jesus gave to His Apostles what is called "The Great Commission": *All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age.* (Matt. 28:19-20).

Here we see manifest the Church's self-understanding of her ability to transmit the Gospel of Jesus Christ faithfully. The Risen Christ has Peter and the other Apostles gathered before Him when He solemnly gives them their Commission. They are to teach *all* that Christ has taught, both during their years together in His Public Life and especially the teaching He gave them over their course of the Great Forty Days after Easter. They are to teach the whole of His doctrine and all of His commandments, not just "faith" in itself, or a faith or a strong emotional appeal based on some of His words or miracles. Therefore, the Holy Scriptures which emerged within the life of the primitive apostolic Church cannot be properly understood in

isolation from the oral traditions handed down through the apostolic teaching. Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition together make up the Deposit of Faith.

Peter and the Apostles on Ascension Day, receiving the Great Commission and the assurance of Christ's abiding presence with them, are an image to us of the Pope in Rome and the Bishops of the world in Communion with him (the successors of the college of Apostles throughout the generations). What they definitively teach in matters of faith and morals is, by divine protection, not going to be in error. This is an act of faith with us as Catholics. It gives us the peace and steadiness of mind to shape our lives according to the beliefs and ideals of Catholicism, and to be consoled by its promises.



KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH



GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY *(Luke 9:21-27)*

As I explained in last week's bulletin notes, Jesus begins to reveal explicitly the central purpose of His mission (His death and resurrection), only after St. Peter has correctly identified him as the Messiah. St. Luke tells us that Jesus "rebuked" His disciples, and told them not to tell anyone about this (v. 21). The Greek original is more properly translated as "He strongly ordered" the disciples not to tell anyone. This is an important distinction, because He was not scolding them, as if they had gotten it wrong. In St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus *praises* St. Peter for answering correctly (cf. Mt. 16:17). As the commentaries indicate, Jesus wanted the disciples to keep His identity secret, so as to prevent the people from misinterpreting His messiahship as something political or revolutionary, and then seek to make Him a king (cf. John 6:15). This would have derailed His path to the cross, which was and is the essence of His Messiahship.

In foretelling His death and resurrection, Jesus underlines two very important things: 1) that His death was voluntary (cf. John 10:15-18), and 2) that He is God. Only God can rise from the dead, and thereby prove that He had the capacity to atone

for our sins in the first place (no mere man can do this). The resurrection validates His sacrifice. As St. Paul says, "if Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins...[but] Christ has been raised from the dead...in Christ shall all be brought to life" (1 Cor. 15:17, 20, 22). Thus, Eastertide is the crown of the liturgical year.

After proclaiming His death, Jesus then invites His disciples to share in His cross: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (v. 23). What does it mean to carry one's cross? Firstly, it means being willing to suffer persecution for Jesus' sake, and for the sake of His Church. Thousands of Christians around the world experience intense suffering daily for their faith, and the list of martyrs grows continually longer. I recommend including these brethren in your morning offering, as an act of solidarity. They are truly gaining their lives by losing them for Jesus' sake (v. 24). "All ye holy martyrs, pray for us."

Secondly, carrying the cross means mortifying (putting to death) our sinful habits and passions. This is an essential aspect of discipleship, for we cannot serve two masters, as Jesus tells us later in 16:13. Essentially, it is a call to observe the first commandment: to put God first, without any qualification. Only the true God can claim such allegiance from us. This is what Jesus means by setting forth this wager: "What profit is there for one to gain the whole world yet lose or forfeit himself [literally, "his soul"]?" (v. 25).

Are we proud to be Catholics, or are we "ashamed" of Jesus' words, or the teaching of his Church (v. 26)? According to Jesus, it is a matter of eternal consequence that we *not* shrink back from His words. As the Roman Canon reminds us, our faith identity consists in "holding to the truth...the catholic and apostolic faith." The dogmatic and moral truth that the Church teaches is none other than the Truth that God Himself has revealed, indeed, that God Himself *is* (cf. John 14:6). He desires for us to live by the teaching of his Church, to be one (cf. John 17:17-23), and so to live in communion with Him, so that our "joy might be complete" (cf. John 15:11). Jesus gives three of His disciples a foretaste of this joy in His Transfiguration, alluding to it in v. 27.


WEEKLY BIBLE STUDY: "THE GOSPEL OF LUKE"

The Catholic Cemetery is a place of consolation and hope.


