



Pastor’s Note

WHITSUNTIDE

The celebration of Easter progresses through three distinct phases: Eastertide, Ascensiontide, and Pentecost, or, as the English custom has it, “Whitsuntide”. Eastertide is the thirty-nine days between Easter Sunday up to the Vigil for Ascension Thursday, when the Risen Christ appeared visibly to His disciples. Ascensiontide encompasses the ten days between Ascension Day itself (the 40th day) and the Saturday Vigil for Pentecost. Pentecost Sunday is the culmination of the Easter Feast, the 50th day. In the reformed calendar of 1970, Pentecost ends abruptly on the Sunday itself. Traditionally, however, Pentecost is celebrated throughout the following week. Paschaltide does not end until the Saturday of Pentecost Week.


The term “Whitsunday” was the popular name in England from at least the 12th century for Pentecost. It means “White Sunday”. The white refers to the baptismal garments worn by

babies who were baptized at that time. Baptismal Regeneration is highlighted both at Easter and Pentecost, and so we can see how all of the elements of the Christian Redemption story are brought together in a marvelous whole. St. Augustine says: “*Easter was the beginning of grace, and Pentecost is its crown, since the Holy Ghost then completes the work accomplished by Christ.*”

What the Holy Ghost did for the disciples in Jerusalem on the Day of Pentecost when He descended with the rush of a mighty wind and tongues of fire over their heads, He essentially continues to do for us as well: “*He enlightens their understanding, cleanses their hearts, and endows them with strength to bear witness to Christ.*” (St. Andrew’s Missal Note, 1952)

This is a joyous feast-day, and not one to be overlooked for its religious significance just because we lack the popular association of Pentecost with holidays and vacation time as is true in much of Europe. “*Come, Holy Spirit, and send down from Heaven the ray of Thy Light.*”

SCRIPTURE STUDY COLUMN



GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY (Luke 9:28-36)

We cannot fully imagine what it must have been like to see Jesus transfigured as the disciples did on Mt. Tabor. St. Luke says that Jesus' "face changed in appearance and His clothing became dazzling white" (v. 29). St.

Matthew's account has a more intense description: "His face shone like the sun and His clothes became white as light" (cf. Mt. 17:2). Staring into the sun is beyond our natural capacity. When, by God's grace, we reach heaven, He will enable us to behold His glory, and to bask in the fire of His love. In the meantime, when we receive Holy Communion, we can be confident that the infinite splendor of Jesus in His Transfiguration, while hidden in the ordinary species of bread and wine, is still fully present. When we receive Holy Communion with faith and love, Jesus Himself, by the flame of His transfiguring Presence, burns away our venial sins, and cauterizes our wounds.

The account of Jesus' Transfiguration mirrors the account of His Baptism, for on both occasions—as He is praying—the Father declares Him His "beloved/chosen Son." As many commentators indicate, whenever St. Luke portrays Jesus at prayer, a revelation of some kind is about to occur. In this passage, the

revelation is two-fold: Jesus' glory, and the Father's declaration. Note that it is during their intimate converse of prayer that the Father reveals Jesus' sonship. This is critically important, because the kind of communion that the Father shares with His beloved Son is the kind of communion He wants to share with all of us. It is only through Jesus the Son that we can become beloved sons and daughters of the Father (cf. Jn. 1:12-13, Eph. 1:3-6). As the collect for the feast of the Transfiguration reads, God "wonderfully prefigured our full adoption to sonship" in this event.

The Transfiguration also confirms St. Peter's declaration of Jesus' messianic identity, recounted a few verses earlier (cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church* no. 555). If we look at St. Matthew's version of St. Peter's confession, we can see clearly how the Transfiguration reinforces Jesus' pronouncement: "whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven" (Mt. 16:19). The Father literally ratifies St. Peter's declaration. And He does not do this because St. Peter is a great guy or particularly smart, but only because he articulates a revealed truth (Mt. 16:17). Herein are the seeds of the doctrine of papal infallibility.

The Transfiguration is also linked closely to the Passion. As the commentary in the Orthodox Study Bible explains, quoting one of the Byzantine rite hymns for the Transfiguration, Jesus allowed His disciples to see His glory, so that they might know that His Passion was undertaken freely. Christ goes to Jerusalem fully consenting to the Father's plan. Indeed, as St. Luke tells us later, "He resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem" (cf. 9:51). St. Luke is the only evangelist who tells us what Moses and Elijah were talking about with Jesus on the mountain: His "exodus...in Jerusalem," which clearly refers to His Death and Resurrection, as we can see from His first prediction of these events a few verses earlier (cf. vv. 22, 31). Moses and Elijah represent the Law and the Prophets bearing witness to His forthcoming suffering. Jesus explains to His disciples on two occasions after His Resurrection, that He has fulfilled Old Testament prophecies in His Paschal Mystery (cf. 24:25-27, 44-45).


WEEKLY BIBLE STUDY: "THE GOSPEL OF LUKE"




FOSTER CARE IN MASSACHUSETTS:



PENTECOST SUNDAY

INTROIT: Wisdom 1: 7 The Spirit of the Lord hath filled the whole world, alleluia; and that which containeth all things hath knowledge of the voice, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm 67:2* Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered: and let them that hate Him flee from before His face.

COLLECT O God, who on this day didst teach the hearts of Thy faithful people by the light of Thy Holy Spirit, grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgment in all things and ever rejoice in His holy consolation. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Acts of the Apostles 2: 1-11 When the days of the Pentecost were accomplished, they were all together in one place; and suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a mighty wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues as it were of fire, and it sat upon every one of them; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they began to speak with divers tongues, according as the Holy Ghost gave them to speak. Now there were dwelling at Jerusalem Jews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven. And when this was noised abroad, the multitude came together, and were confounded in mind, because that every man heard them speak in his own tongue. And they were all amazed, and wondered, saying: Behold, are not all these that speak Galileans? And how have we heard every man our own tongue wherein we were born? Parthians and Medes, and Elamites, and inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia, and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the parts of Libya about Cyrene, and strangers of Rome, Jews also, and Proselytes, Cretes, and Arabians: we have heard them speak in our own tongues the wonderful works of God.

PASCHAL ALLELUIA: (*Psalm 103:30*) Alleluia, alleluia. V. Send for Thy Spirit, and they shall be created, and Thou shalt renew the face of the earth. (*All kneel*) Alleluia. V. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful: and kindle in them the fire of Thy love.

Come, Holy Ghost, send down those beams,
Which sweetly flow in silent streams
From Thy bright throne above.
O, come, Thou Father of the poor,
O, come, Thou source of all our store,

GOSPEL: John 14: 23-31 **At** that time Jesus said to His disciples: If any one love Me, he will keep My word, and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and will make Our abode in him: he that loveth Me not keepeth not My words. And the word which you have heard is not Mine; but the Father's who sent Me. These things have I spoken to you, abiding with you. But the Paraclete, the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring all things to your mind, whatsoever I shall have said to you. Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, do I give unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, nor let it be afraid. You have heard that I said to you: I go away, and I come unto you. If you loved Me, you would indeed be glad, because I go to the Father: for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you before it come to pass: that when it shall come to pass you may believe. I will not now speak many things with you. For the prince of this world cometh, and in Me he hath not any thing. But that the world may know that I love the Father, and as the Father hath given Me commandment so do I.






