THE VIRTUE OF PEACE

In the beginning of July the Calendar of Saints celebrates the Feast of St. Elizabeth Queen of Portugal who lived from 1271-1336. In the 1970 Missal her Feast is on July 4th (transferred to July 5th in the USA) and in the 1962 Missal it is on July 8th. Her life was a beautiful witness to the power of Christ's Peace.

The happy occasion of her birth brought an end to the quarrel which had been going on between her father and grandfather. From the way in which her life unfolded, this reconciliation within the royal family of Aragon at her birth is seen as a foreshadowing of God's plans for her. Married to King Dennis of Portugal, Elizabeth the Queen was outstanding for her charity to the poor, the simplicity of her own personal life, and her role as a peacemaker. The dramatic moment of her life was when she rode on horseback between the lines of battle about to engage between her son and son-in-law.

The liturgical prayer for her feast-day makes

allusion to this event:

O God of mercy, among the excellent gifts with which You endowed the Queen St. Elizabeth was the privilege of calming the violence of war. At her intercession, after granting us the peace for which we ask You in this mortal life, permit us to attain joys everlasting. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.


St. Peter Chrysologus (+450 A.D.) expounds upon Christ's Beatitude: *"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God."*

"No-one can be called a child of God without first deserving the name of peacemaker. It is peace, my dear brethren, which frees a man from slavery, and ennobles him...Peace in the community is God's will; it is the sweetness of Christ and the perfection of sanctity. Peace is the rule of justice, the mistress of learning, the guardian of morals; its restraining influence is everywhere to be commended. It is the goal of our prayers, an easy and effective way of making atonement, the complete fulfilment of all our longings. Peace is the mother of love, the bond of friendship, the clearest proof of that innocence which craves satisfaction of God, which seeks fulfilment and has its longings satisfied."

We live in the midst of a world where aggressive behavior is given a wide range of tolerance if not actually praised as being important for "getting what's yours". Political culture is more and more synonymous with confrontation, hurling of insults, and threats. As much as defending the dignity of human life and witnessing to the virtues of chastity and innocence of life, we Christians need to be advocates and practitioners of the virtue of peace. Again, in the words of St. Peter Chrysologus: *"We should guard peace before all the virtues, for God is always present in peace. Love peace and all is peaceful."*

SCRIPTURE STUDY COLUMN



GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY (Luke 10:17-20)

The return of the seventy-two marks a contrast with the inability of some of the Twelve to perform an exorcism in chapter 9. Here, men *outside* of the inner circle of the Twelve return "rejoicing" at the efficacy of their work in Jesus' Name (v. 17). In

response, Jesus describes the fall of Satan, "like lightning," this is, dramatically and definitively. Alluding to Ps. 91:13, Jesus tells them that He has given them plenary authority over the devil's works: "power to tread upon serpents and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy" (v. 19).

As Christian believers, we need to be reminded that satanic attacks in the form of pernicious temptations remain a daily reality for all of us. Likewise, we need to be fortified in our belief that all the graces for gaining victory in spiritual warfare are available to us in Christ and His Church. Beyond the scope of scientific/psychological disciplines and their treatments (which are indispensable for certain conditions, of course), we need the proper spiritual weaponry. Mercifully, God has supplied it.

Firstly, Christ has ultimately defeated the devil by His cross and resurrection (1 Jn. 3:8).

Secondly, the fruits of this victory are generously (and daily) available in Holy Communion and Confession (1 Jn. 1:7-9). Jesus himself comes to us to share His divine life. Nothing is more powerful than being in close communion with Him. Thirdly, we have the Word of God, whose truths can be used as a sword to cut through the deception of temptation (cf. Eph. 6:17). Fourthly, we have so many hundreds of prayers and sacramentals which repel the evil one and open us up to receiving "grace for timely help" (Heb. 4:16). For example, as both Fr. Higgins and one of my professors have taught me, merely by saying the Rosary aloud, and thus, invoking the Names of Jesus and Mary, one is engaging in what is called a minor exorcism. A minor exorcism is a non-dramatic, everyday form of protection from the devil's influence. Thus, these are all ways that we can "resist the devil," so that he will "flee" from us (cf. Jam. 4:7).

The rest of Jesus' response to the seventy-two places the whole discussion of spiritual warfare in its proper context. He tells them, "do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven" (v. 20). The focus of the seventy-two was *not* to be on their having the upper hand in supernatural struggles. Rather, the goal of victory in spiritual warfare is the salvation of souls, and being in communion with the Trinity. Having one's "name written in heaven" is an expression Jesus uses to illustrate one's status in the family of God, that is, being accounted for as a member of the covenant, as the commentaries indicate. We can find this expression in Exodus 32, when Moses pleads with God for the idolatrous people, asking that he be struck out of the Book of Life so that they might be spared (cf. Ex. 32:32). We find it also in Daniel 12, in which the prophet describes the *eschaton*, or end times, in which the Book of Life contains the names of all the elect, or the saved (cf. Dan. 12:1). Our Lord and St. John invoke this image, too, in Revelation 3:5 and 21:27. The devil does everything he can to prevent every human person from achieving communion with God, whereas, everything God does for us is precisely for our coming into communion with Him. Thus, all the aforementioned graces are directly concerned with maintaining this close communion with God, and eventually, getting into heaven.


WEEKLY BIBLE STUDY: "THE GOSPEL OF LUKE"



FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

And be not afraid of their fear, and be not troubled; but sanctify the Lord Christ in your hearts.






