NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

Pastor's Note

THE POPE'S CHURCH

It comes as a surprise to many people to learn that the Pope's true Church as Bishop of Rome is not St. Peter's at the Vatican but the Lateran Basilica, commonly known as St. John Lateran (its second title, the first being the Most Holy Savior), which was dedicated on this day, November 9th, in A.D. 324 by Pope St. Sylvester.

I insert some of the text from the lessons of the Roman Breviary which give the background to this important event in the development of Christianity:

When the Emperor Constantine had received health and salvation through the sacrament of Baptism, he promulgated a law allowing

Christians throughout the world for the first time to build churches. This holy work he encouraged not only by his edict but also by his example. For in his own Lateran palace he dedicated a church to the Savior, and adjoining it built a basilica named for St. John the Baptists, in that spot where he had been cleansed from the leprosy of unbelief when he was baptized by St. Sylvester. Pope Sylvester himself consecrated the basilica on the 9th of November. We celebrate the anniversary of this consecration today, since it was the first time that a church in Rome was publicly consecrated and the image of the Savior, depicted on the wall, appeared to the Roman people.

While blessed Sylvester later decreed, when he consecrated the altar of the Prince of the Apostles, that altars henceforth should be built only of stone, the altar of the Lateran basilica was made of wood. But this is not strange, since because of the persecutions the Popes from St. Peter to Sylvester could not remain in one place, but celebrated the holy mysteries wherever necessity compelled them to do so, in crypts or in the homes of good people, on that wooden altar, which was hollow like a box. When peace had returned to the Church, St. Sylvester placed this altar in the Lateran, the first of all churches, to honor the Prince of the Apostles, who is said to have offered sacrifice upon it, and the other Popes who up to that time had used it for celebrating the holy mysteries, and he decreed that no one except the Roman Pontiff should henceforth offer sacrifice upon it.

This wooden altar is encased within the marble altar shown in the picture here.

KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH



GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY *(Luke 13:10-17)*

Jesus always works miracles in conjunction with His teachings, because they demonstrate the authenticity of His identity and message (cf. Jn. 5:36). On one occasion, He heals a crippled woman on a sabbath. His word to the woman,

"Woman, you are set free of your infirmity," as well as the gesture of the laying on of His hands (vv. 12-13), hearkens back to His inaugural sermon on Nazareth, in which He quoted Isaiah 61:1-2, and declared, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me...to proclaim liberty to captives...to let the oppressed to free" (cf. 4:18). In other words, Jesus confers the Holy Spirit for healing. Herein is the origin of the Sacrament of the Sick.

This particular healing narrative is somewhat unique, for St. Luke indicates that the root of the woman's illness was diabolical in nature: "for eighteen years [she] had been crippled by a spirit; she was bent over, completely incapable of standing erect" (v. 11). This is very mysterious, and we do not have any indication as to how or why this happened to her, but it does say something about man's body-soul unity. St. Luke certainly does *not* lead us to believe that this woman was demon-possessed; her problem was more an issue of *oppression*. There must

have been some sort of spiritual wound by which she gave partial consent to the devil's oppressive presence in her life, and this was manifested in her dramatically crippled state.

Episodes like this one challenge us to consider the underlying, un-healed wounds in our lives. Fr. Mark Toups, in an article for the Institute of Priestly Formation entitled "Understanding Our Sinfulness," addresses this subject. He explains that it is in relation to our wounds that the devil tempts us to believe lies about ourselves, God, and others. If we believe these lies, then we will fall into patterns of sin. If we fail to confront both the sins and the lies behind them, we will go on for eighteen-plus years being needlessly oppressed by the devil. Christ came "to destroy the works of the devil," and to give us "abundant life" (cf. 1 Jn. 3:8; Jn. 10:10). Abundant life does not promise an abundance of good feelings or the absence of suffering. Rather, it means receiving the healing and forgiveness of everything that prevents us from being perfected in charity. To this end, St. Paul prays the following in his epistle to the Ephesians: "...that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, rooted and grounded in love, may have strength to comprehend with all the holy ones what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God" (cf. Eph. 3:17-19). God's love for every human person far exceeds the limits of man's understanding, yet is fully available in Christ. The more we grasp the extent of God's love for us, the more we can allow him to heal us.

After the healing of the woman, the synagogue leader objects to it being done on the sabbath, falsely interpreting the prohibition against working on the sabbath. This approach is inadequate, as Jesus notes in his response in vv. 15-16: "*Hypocrites! Does not each one of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his ass from the manger and lead it out for watering? This daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound for eighteen years now, ought she not to have been set free on the sabbath day from this bondage?*" The answer to this question is obvious, and the accusers are "humiliated" (v. 17). The Lord's Day is a particularly appropriate day for healing and forgiveness. Let us continue to embrace Sunday Mass as the privileged time in the week for receiving Jesus' healing love for us, and for interceding for others' healing, as well.


