Pastor's Note

THE CLOSE OF THE CHURCH'S YEAR OF GRACE 2014

Today is the last Sunday in the cycle of the Church's Year of Grace, 2014 in the Year of Salvation. Next Sunday, November 30th, we renew the Church's cycle with the beginning of the Advent season. Even while the calendar year is still reading "2014", we will already have crossed over the threshold into the Year of Salvation 2015.

In the 1962 Roman Missal it is the Last Sunday after Pentecost, and in the 1970 Missal the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King is observed. Together, they both manifest a powerful symbol of Christ's Redemption: the end of the world at the Second Coming of Christ and the present reality of Christ's sovereign rule over the universe.


As in past years I am using this last Sunday of the Church's Year to present to you the Annual Report for our parish of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes and its cemetery of St. Mary's. Photocopies of the Parish and Cemetery reports are available to you in the pamphlet rack of the front vestibule. I encourage you to take these reports home with you as a help to understanding the finances of our parish, which you are supporting by your donations.

I summarize some of the important points related to this year's report:

1. For the third straight year we have seen an increased Sunday Offertory (2012, 8.13%, 2013, 10.11%, & 2014 4.31 %). This is a testament to the dedication of you the parishioners to the support of your church.
2. Our deficit this Fiscal Year was \$324,422 compared to last year's \$252,206. Our total expenses, however, were down by \$118,579. Last Fiscal Year we were blessed with legacies and very large donations totaling \$214,354 compared to this year's total of \$11,978. Our revenue shortfall was made up by drawing down on our general funds which remain substantial.
3. The financial health of St. Mary's Cemetery has greatly improved. This Fiscal Year we had to transfer \$39,917 from the parish to the cemetery compared to \$134,916 last Fiscal Year. We are on track for the cemetery to cover its costs.
4. The challenge we face is substantially the same that other parishes similar to us face ("medium-small"-sized congregations with large, beautiful and expensive-to-maintain properties), i.e., the commitment of the parishioners to real stewardship as part-and-parcel of living our Christian faith. Even modest increases in the percentage that our Offertory covers of the total expense each year makes our savings last longer, thus extending the life of our parish and giving the Holy Ghost the room to maneuver in building up our Christian community.

KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH



GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY (Luke 13:22-30)

From time to time, either through the news or through direct experience, we come across people who claim that certain other people will go to hell. Common sense remind us, however, that no one can know the eternal fate of another person. The only exception, of course, is

the sum of canonized saints whom we know are in heaven. In their case, we rely on reasonable proofs, and the moral certainty scrupulously determined by the Church's authority. Beyond the saints of heaven, however, we do well to leave all judgment in these eternal matters to Christ, desiring the salvation of all, but not forgetting the real possibility of hell for those who choose it.

In the middle of chapter 13 of St. Luke's Gospel, a person in the crowd asks Jesus, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" (v. 23). Jesus ignores the presumptuous request, and issues a challenge: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough" (v. 24). Thus, rather than having us worry about who will be saved, Jesus points to the necessity of striving for one's own salvation, lest one come short of the goal.

Jesus elaborates on his challenge with a parable in vv. 25-27. Its bluntness serves as a warning against the complacency that causes many to feel as if heaven were a given: "After the master of the house has arisen and locked the door, then will you stand outside knocking and saying, 'Lord, open the door for us.' He will say to you in reply, 'I do not know where you are from.' And you will say, 'We ate and drank in your company and you taught in our streets.' Then he will say to you, 'I do not know where you are from. Depart from me, all you evildoers!'" Jesus directs his parable pointedly at the crowd, linking them to those cast outside in the parable.


Just as many interacted with Jesus during His 33 years on earth without real faith, so also today do thousands go about ordinary parochial life remaining unconverted. Many people insist that a merciful God could not possibly send people to hell, and that everyone will end up fine in the end. Jesus' teaching, however, stands in stark contrast to this common misunderstanding. Jesus does not mince words when describing the tragic pain of those who are excluded from the banquet of heaven (v. 28). At the same time, Jesus speaks about a decision rendered in the final judgment- not a decision rendered in the present. There is still the possibility for repentance. Nevertheless, unaddressed complacency can lead to hell.

Mere association with Christ or His Church is not enough; discipleship is required. The parable's expression of being "known" by the master echoes Jesus' words in St. John's Gospel: "I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me...My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me" (cf. Jn. 10:14,27). Knowing about Jesus is not comparable to knowing Him as one's Lord, and following His Church's teachings with informed faith.

Jesus finishes His parable by describing people coming to the master's banquet from all four corners of the earth, and then He says, "For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last" (vv. 29-30). Jesus refers here to the Gentiles becoming members of God's covenant people- a most unlikely prospect in the minds of the Jews at that time. Thus, we should never assume to know the final tally of heaven's members, but we can thank God for His universal salvific will, and strive to be among heaven's blessed assembly... (over)



SYRIAC RITE




OUR LADY OF MESOPOTAMIA MISSION: IRAQI CATHOLICS

LATIN MASS PROPERS: LAST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: *Jeremias 29: 11, 12, 14* The Lord saith: I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction: you shall call upon Me, and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places. *Psalm 84: 2* Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Stir up the wills of Thy faithful people, we beseech Thee, O Lord: that more earnestly seeking the fruit of good works, they may receive more abundantly the gifts of Thy loving kindness. Through Our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Colossians 1: 9-14.* Brethren: We cease not to pray for you, and to beg that you may be filled with the knowledge of the will of God, in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; that you may walk worthy of God, in all things pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God; strengthened with all might according to the power of His glory, in all patience and long suffering with joy; giving thanks to God the Father; who hath made us worthy to be partakers of the lot of the saints in light; who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the remission of sins.

GRADUAL: *Psalm 43: 8-9* Thou hast delivered us, O Lord, from them that afflict us: and hast put them to shame that hate us. *V.* In God we will glory all the day: and in Thy name we will give praise for ever.

GOSPEL: *Matthew 24: 15-35* **At** that time, Jesus said to His disciples: When you shall see the abomination of desolation, which was spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place; (he that readeth, let him understand) then they that are in Judea, let them flee to the mountains; and he that is on the house-top, let him not come down to take anything out of his house; and he that is in the field, let him not go back to take his coat. And woe to them that are with child, and that give suck, in those days. But pray that your flight be not in the winter, or on the sabbath: for there shall be then great tribulation, such as hath not been found from the beginning of the world until now neither shall be: and unless those days had been shortened, no flesh should be saved; but for the sake of the elect, those days shall be shortened. Then if any man shall say to you: Lo, here is Christ, or there; do not believe him; for there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall show great signs and wonders, insomuch as to deceive (if possible) even the elect. Behold I have told it to you beforehand: if therefore they shall say to you: Behold He is in the desert, go ye not out; behold He is in the closets, believe it not. For as lightning cometh out of the east, and appeareth even into the west, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. Wheresoever the body shall be, there shall the eagles also be gathered together. And immediately after the tribulation of those days, the sun shall be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of heaven shall be moved; and then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven, and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn; and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with much power and majesty; and He shall send His angels with a trumpet and a great voice, and they shall gather together His elect from the four winds, from the farthest parts of the heavens to the utmost bounds of them. And from the fig-tree learn a parable: when the branch thereof is now tender, and the leaves come forth, you know that summer is nigh. So you also, when you shall see all these things, know ye that it is nigh even at the doors. Amen I say to you that this generation shall not pass till all these things be done. Heaven and earth shall pass away, but My words shall not pass away.


