Pastor's Note

DOMINIC GUNDRUM, AGE 2

Among the Christmas cards that came to the rectory this year I received a lovely card and letter from Mrs. Mary Gundrum on the progress of her son Dominic, now aged 2, over the past year. As many of you will recall, Dominic was the little baby we had prayed for as a parish family over the Christmas season of 2012-13. Dominic had been born with a serious birth defect and the family had come from Wisconsin in order to have a surgeon at Children's Hospital perform the corrective operation. It was highrisk and the child almost died from postoperative complications (*The Boston Globe* did a front-page story on the case at the time.)

As his mother's letter indicates, Dominic is is thriving:

Dominic continues to brighten the room with his infectious smile. He plays basketball like a madman and can make many baskets, I think his record was twelve in a row. Mark [the father] tells our older boys he has better form than them. Dominic knows all of the letters in the alphabet and the sounds they make. He points them out wherever we go. The same goes for numbers, colors, and shapes. After his last surgery he has started to talk (a lot), he struggles with consonants but we feel that is just a matter of time. Dominic runs and crawls all over, but does not like messes. Dominic struggles with some peripheral vision and sensory issues but otherwise is a very normal little guy that is very loved!

In the 1962 Missal, the Mass for this Sunday is the Mass of the Holy Family. As we pray for God's grace to sustain and sanctify our own parish families, let us make a special prayer of thanks and petition for Mark and Mary Gundrum and their eight children, especially for this youngest of their children Dominic Pio, that he may continue to grow and to thrive, to the praise and glory of God.

GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY (Luke 15:1-7)

Luke 15 consists of three parables that are familiar to most church-goers: the parable of the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son (or the prodigal son). We might be tempted to gloss over these, because we have heard them several times, but their content is never out of season.

St. Luke sets the stage in vv. 1-2: "The tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Him, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, 'This man welcomes sinners and eats with them.'" Some background information can prove helpful here. The Jews considered tax collectors to be traitors, because they facilitated the Roman occupation, and were often greedy and dishonest. "Sinners" were labeled as such because of their manifest sinful behavior. such as prostitution. In Jesus' culture, table fellowship had more connotations than it does today: for Jesus to eat with such people appeared to indicate His acceptance of their behaviors. In light of this, the Pharisees' and scribes' critique does not seem entirely off base.

Jesus' parables, however, demonstrate that their criticism is a misunderstanding. By eating with public sinners, Jesus does not condone their sins, but manifests His desire to call them to conversion. In

fact, it may be that the tax collectors and sinners drew near to Him, precisely because they were willing to embrace His challenging words on discipleship a few verses earlier. There does not appear to be a break in context between the end of chapter 14 and the beginning of chapter 15. The tax collectors and sinners were likely already alienated from their families, so they were somewhat prepared to embrace Christ, and serve Him above all (cf. 14:26).

In the first of the three parables, Jesus poses a question: "What man among you having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it?" (v. 4). The implication in Jesus' question, is that no sheep is insignificant enough to be left to its own devices in the wilderness. Jesus continues in vv. 5-6: "And when he [the shepherd] does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and, upon his arrival home, he calls together his friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep."

In Jesus' day, shepherds corrected erring sheep by binding their legs, and carrying them on their shoulders. In this way, the sheep would develop familiarity with the shepherd: his voice, his smell, his presence. After a sufficient amount of time on the shepherd's shoulders, the sheep could walk with the flock again, and would be less likely to stray. Applied to human beings, the parable teaches us that none of us is beyond the reach of God's grace in this life. As Jesus explains in v. 7, "I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance."

God spares no effort in bringing man back to Himself. Once we are within His grace, we need to stop listening to the suggestions of the devil that cause us to err. Instead, we need to rest on Christ's shoulders: we must develop a sincere reliance upon Him, and a docile spirit in order to hear His voice. As Jesus says, "My sheep hear My voice; I know them, and they follow Me" (cf. In. 10:27). In order to hear His voice, we need to familiarize ourselves with His words. Quality time resting on Christ's shoulders means reading the Gospels, in particular, and responding with prayer. The Rosary is an especially helpful method of prayer for resting in Christ's presence.




