

Pastor's Note

THE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE CENTENARY: 1915/2015

Pope Francis incurred the wrath of the Turkish government on Divine Mercy Sunday this year when he celebrated a Mass at St. Peter's to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the genocidal massacres of the Armenian nation at the hands of the Ottoman Turks. The Pope used the word "genocide" to characterize these massacres and said that the killing of the Armenians is "*widely considered the first genocide of the 20th Century.*" He then went on to compare it to the Nazi Holocaust against the Jews and the mass-murders committed by Soviet Russia under Josef Stalin. He furthermore drew the comparison to the violence being directed now against Christian communities in the Middle East and Africa by Islamist zealots.

For his candor, the Turkish government retaliated by recalling its ambassador to the Holy See. The Turkish foreign minister accused the Pope of spreading "*hatred and animosity.*"

The facts of the Armenian genocide, however, are well-established. Even as it was happening, it was known.

The *Encyclopedia Britannica* (1939 edition) states:

When the Turks entered the [World] War [in 1914], the Armenian leaders assured them of their loyalty. Harsh Turkish requisitions and ill-treatment of Armenian troops in the Turkish army caused racial friction. Armenian peasants in the war areas were driven from their homes and murdered. The successful self-defence of the Armenians on Van in April 1915, and Allied declarations of war aims induced the Turks to murder the Armenian people in Turkey. The scheme was carried out in June-July 1915, with unparalleled brutality: men,

women, and children were robbed and murdered indiscriminately and the remainder were deported to the desert to fend for themselves.

This genocidal massacre was policy at the highest level. In a September 1915 dispatch the Ottoman interior minister Talaat Pasha prodded officials in Aleppo not to weaken in their killing:

The Government...has decided to destroy completely all the indicated [Armenian] persons living in Turkey. An end must be put to their existence...and no regard must be paid to either age or sex, or to conscientious scruples. (Jeff Jacoby: "Armenian Genocide Was also a Jihad", Boston Globe, April 15th, 2015.)

The United States Ambassador Henry Morgenthau protested to Talaat based on the reports he was getting and received a cold-blooded answer:

It is no use for you to argue. We have already disposed of three quarters of the Armenians ... The hatred between the Turks and the Armenians is now so intense that we have got to finish them. If we don't, they will plan their revenge...We will not have the Armenians anywhere in Anatolia. (Jacoby)

The death-toll from these massacres was 1.5 million (out of roughly 2 million Armenians living within the Ottoman Empire in 1914). Ninety-percent were gone by 1918, either by death or flight. The large Armenian population in Massachusetts is due in large part to the refugees who arrived here after World War I.

Our Holy Father showed respect for the truth as well as compassion for the victims when he did not temporize on the centenary of the Armenian Genocide.

SCRIPTURE STUDY



ST. LUKE CHAPTER 18:35-43

The final episode in St. Luke 18 is the healing of the blind beggar by the roadside in Jericho. Interestingly, the city of Jericho is last mentioned in Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan, which also happens to involve a man in need by the side of the road leading to this city (cf. 10:30). St. Luke

sets the scene in vv. 36-38: *"and hearing a crowd going by, he [the blind man] inquired what was happening. They told him, 'Jesus of Nazareth is passing by.' He shouted, 'Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me!'"* The title "Son of David" is a Messianic ascription, and the blind man's use of it manifests his faith.

Upon hearing the blind beggar's shouting, St. Luke tells us in v. 39 that *"[t]he people walking in front rebuked him, telling him to be silent, but he kept calling out all the more, 'Son of David, have pity on me.'"* We can easily imagine the annoyance some of these people felt upon seeing a street person crying out after Jesus. The sinful instinct is to ignore such people as much as possible, but this man was making it impossible for anyone to ignore him.

St. Augustine, in his commentary on this passage, helps us to understand that this might have been the *only* opportunity for the blind man to encounter Jesus and be healed. This explains why he would not back down when the crowd tried to silence him. His physical handicap likely prevented him from traveling easily to neighboring towns to meet Jesus. As a beggar, too, he may not have had any family support. Pride, discouragement, or embarrassment did not prevent him from seeking the healing he needed. His persistence in seeking Jesus can be compared to that of the persistent widow, whom Jesus commended as a model of prayer and faith (cf. 18:1-8).

Jesus hears the man's cry, stops, and asks him

what he wants, to which the blind man replies, *"Lord, please let me see"* (v. 41). Jesus responds by saying *"Have sight; your faith has saved you"* (v. 42). The simplicity of this encounter is striking. Jesus' words to the blind man, *"Your faith has saved you,"* recall earlier instances of healing and reconciliation in this Gospel: the forgiveness of the sinful woman (cf. 7:50), the healing of the woman with the hemorrhage (cf. 8:48), and the healing of the ten lepers (cf. 17:19). This kind of saving faith commended by Jesus is an act of total abandonment to God and His will. It enlarges one's capacity to receive grace, because it recognizes God's providential love as the highest Good, regardless of the way one's prayer is answered. The blind man demonstrates such faith by his persistent cries, as well as his total abandonment to Jesus' mercy.

We may not always feel the blind man's desperation for mercy in our day to day activities, but we are just as dependent upon God's grace as He was. It is usually only in sickness or during a crisis that we are faced with this truth, but is important to acknowledge this reality in ordinary circumstances, too. Like the blind man, we do well to cry out to Jesus with frequent pleas for mercy: *"Lord, show thy mercy upon us, and grant us thy salvation. Lord, hear my prayer, and let my cry come unto thee"* (emphasis mine). Our prayer at Mass differs little from that of the blind man: we cry out for mercy, and Jesus gives us His saving grace. In Eastertide, we add Alleluias to the first versicle and response, because Jesus' Resurrection gives us the joyful assurance of this prayer's fulfillment. What a privilege it is to encounter Jesus directly and personally at Mass and in our prayers, and to make our heartfelt requests with His full attention.




