


# SCRIPTURE STUDY



## ST. LUKE CHAPTER 20:9-19

Jesus' parable of the vineyard and the wicked tenants follows immediately upon the episode in which the scribes and priests question His authority. Having just exposed their impenitence and pride, Jesus gains momentum against His adversaries through this parable,

because it echoes a prophetic motif of judgment in the "vineyard song" of Isaiah 5:1-7.

In the Isaian passage, the vineyard owner (God) does everything he possibly can to make his vineyard (Israel) fruitful and yet it produces foul fruit, contrary to all logic (in Isaiah's time, Israel was enmeshed in idolatry and sin). In the Lucan parable, the vineyard owner's tenants (the established religious leadership) abuse the vineyard owner's servants (the prophets) who are sent to collect the fruit. In both passages, the vineyard owner is denied his rightful harvest (a holy people devoted to God and His commandments).

In vv. 13-15, Jesus describes how, in the wake of the increasing problem of the tenants' abuse of the servants, the vineyard owner contemplates sending his son to rectify the problem: *"The owner of the vineyard said, 'What shall I do? I shall send my beloved son; maybe they will respect him.' But when the tenant farmers saw him they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Let us kill him that the inheritance may become ours.' So they threw him out of the vineyard and killed him."* The dialoging of the tenants among themselves recalls the dialoging of the priests and scribes in the previous passage, making the association between the tenants and Jesus' adversaries clear. More importantly, however, there are several links between Jesus and the vineyard owner's son. Firstly, the greater authority of the son in comparison to the lesser authority of the servants points to Jesus' divine

authority as the Son of God, which is intrinsically greater than the authority of the prophets. Secondly, in calling the vineyard owner's son "beloved," St. Luke links this parable to Jesus' baptism, wherein the Father declares Jesus to be His "beloved Son" (cf. Lk. 3:22). Thirdly, as the commentaries indicate, the murder of the vineyard owner's son outside of the vineyard foreshadows Jesus' crucifixion outside the city walls of Jerusalem.

In view of these connections, Jesus issues judgment against his adversaries in vv. 17-18: *"What then does this scripture passage mean: 'The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone'? Everyone who falls on that stone will be dashed to pieces; and it will crush anyone on whom it falls."* Jesus here quotes Ps. 118:22, which He interprets to be a foreshadowing Israel's rejection of Him. St. Luke tells us that the priests and scribes understood his meaning clearly: *"they knew that He had addressed this parable to them"* (v. 19).

Jesus addresses not only His adversaries, but us, too. St. Bede the Venerable instructs us to examine our own consciences by putting ourselves in the parable, and considering God's providence in our lives. In Baptism, he explains, God has entrusted us with His grace, and throughout Scripture, His prophets, His apostles, and His beloved Son all teach us to cultivate lives of holiness. As St. John the Baptist says, we must *"produce good fruits as evidence of [our] repentance"* (cf. Lk. 3:8). Perhaps we could take one lesson from each of the readings at Mass every Sunday, and meditate on them during the week. In so doing, God will help us to be good "tenants" of His grace and bear fruit. Like Our Lady, let us *"hear the word of God and observe it"* (cf. Lk 11:28).



And when she hath found it, call together her friends and neighbors, saying: Rejoice with me, because I have found that groat which I had lost? So I say to you, there shall be joy before the angels of God upon one sinner doing penance.
