SCRIPTURE STUDY



ST. LUKE CHAPTER 20:27-40

One would think that after the religious leaders had attempted to ensnare Jesus, only to be utterly stumped or silenced by Him on three occasions, they would refrain from giving it another go. And yet, St. Luke describes another confrontation in 20:27-40. This time, the Sadducees, the priestly

class, seek to trap Jesus in His words by presenting a ridiculous hypothetical scenario. St. Luke begins his account with an important comment, namely, that the Sadducees do not believe in bodily resurrection (v. 27). This deficiency in their belief system is ultimately the cause of their downfall in this confrontation with Jesus.

The Sadducees preface their question with the following preamble: "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, 'If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother'" (v. 28). This is a reference to the practice of levirate marriage (cf. Deut. 25:5). They begin to describe a series of consecutive childless marriages of seven brothers to one woman (vv. 29-32). Then, they present their question: "Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be?" (v. 33). One can discern a disrespectful tone, for they do not care about the dogmatic significance of their question; they just want to stump Jesus.

Any merely human rabbi might easily be tempted to unscramble the scenario and come up with a brilliant answer, only to get trapped in a convoluted or erroneous explanation. Jesus demonstrates that the issue is less about the heavenly status of the woman's childless marriages, and more about the resurrection of the body. His penetrating response is recounted in vv. 34-36: "Jesus said to them, 'The children of this age marry and remarry;

but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise.'" In other words, there is no marriage in heaven, because there is no more need for sexual relations, and there is no more death, and thus, no need to propagate the human race. Immortal human souls will be reunited to their indestructible resurrected bodies.

Additionally, there is no need for marital intimacy in heaven, because the beatific vision of God infinitely outweighs the communion of the marital embrace (cf. Catechism nos. 1024, 1027, 1048). Marriage, for all its goodness and beauty, is a sacramental sign of the far greater fulfillment of the life of heaven.

That marriage no longer exists in heaven is not a cause for thinking that spouses who are in heaven will no longer be able to cherish each other's company. Rather, we trust that their earthly communion will be elevated, healed, and transformed" by Christ in the life of heaven, along with every other aspect of this present world. This encouraging hope should "spur us on" toward the joy of heaven (cf. Catechism nos. 1042-1050, 1642, 1690).

At the end of this passage, in vv. 37-38, Jesus instructs the Sadducees on the doctrine of bodily resurrection with his exegesis on the familiar passage of the burning bush (cf. Ex. 3-4): "That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called 'Lord' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and He is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him all are alive." The scribes, who believe in the resurrection, congratulate Jesus for this answer, even though they are His enemies (v. 39). In any event, "they no longer dared to ask Him anything" (v. 40). As always, Jesus' authoritative interpretation of the Law is stunningly illuminating and unassailable.




