# SCRIPTURE STUDY



## ST. LUKE CHAPTER 20:21-47

Having definitively silenced His enemies, Jesus proceeds to affirm His Messianic identity in His typical teaching style (asking penetrating questions). St. Luke reports His words in vv. 41-44: "How do they claim that the Messiah is the Son of David? For David himself in

the Book of Psalms says: 'The Lord said to my lord, "Sit at my right hand till I make your enemies your footstool." Now if David calls him 'lord,' how can he be his son?' Jesus quotes the first verse of Ps. 110 (Ps. 109, Vulgate and LXX), which presents a seeming paradox. King David has a prophetic vision wherein he sees the future Messiah as possessing a divine status. And yet, as other Scriptures affirm, this figure is a descendant (a son) of David, and thus, a human being. How can both be true? Jesus' question to the crowds highlights the tension in the mystery of His Incarnation: He is fully God and fully man.

Jesus' placement of this paradox before the crowd is similar to the question He asks St. Peter: "Who do you say that I am?", a question which centers on His identity. In faith, St. Peter makes the correct response: "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God" (cf. Mt. 16:15-16). St. Peter's answer is crucial, for if Jesus is fully God, all of His words are absolutely trustworthy (including the harder sayings), and He has the power to rise from the dead- which He said He would do multiple times- and to raise others as well (cf. Jn. 6:39-40, 44). Likewise, by means of His divinity and sacred humanity, Jesus can both fully share in our human condition, and take upon Himself the full weight of human sin as a sacrificial victim, a weight God alone is capable of bearing. If Jesus is only partly God or partly man, none of these things are possible. The very existence of Christian faith hangs upon the central truth of Christ's

identity as a divine Person who has assumed a human nature. He alone can rectify man's sinful condition.

Immediately after His teaching on Ps. 110, Jesus turns to the Twelve, and rebukes the religious leaders "within the hearing of all the people" (v. 45). Notably briefer than the "woes" of Mt. 23:1-36, this rebuke is no less grave. St. Luke reports Jesus' words in vv. 46-47: "Be on guard against the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and love greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets. They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext, recite lengthy prayers. They will receive a very severe condemnation." Jesus pinpoints four serious sins on the part of the scribes in his list of their behaviors: vanity, hypocrisy, greed, and excessive cruelty towards the vulnerable. The scribes' hypocrisy, in particular, increases the gravity of the other sins, because they use their religious status and praxis as a cloak for sin.

On the one hand, we detest these sins when they are manifested in other people. On the other hand, some of these sins can often go undetected within our own hearts, or, if detected, we find various ways to cloak them, like the scribes (they can still manifest themselves from time to time, however, in precipitous and ugly ways). In view of their pernicious quality, then, we do well to note traces of them (large and small) in ourselves and uproot them with vigor. Although the "green" season of "Sundays after Pentecost" or "Ordinary Time" is non-penitential in character, it nevertheless can be a wonderful opportunity to frequent the confessional, so as to destroy these sinful weeds and water the seeds of virtue. We can think of the green color of the vestments as a sign of the growth in holiness God continues to expect from us.



## LATIN MASS PROPERS: SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**INTROIT:** *Psalm 27: 8-9* The Lord is the strength of His people, and the protector of the salvation of His anointed: save, O Lord, Thy people, and bless Thy inheritance, and rule them for ever. *Psalm 27: 8-9* Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent to me, lest if Thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

**COLLECT** O God of all power and might, who art the giver of all good things; implant in our hearts the love of Thy name, increase in us true religion, nourish us with all goodness and by Thy mercy keep us in the same. Through our Lord.

**EPISTLE:** *Romans 6: 3-II* Brethren, all we who are baptized in Christ Jesus are baptized in His death. For we are buried together with Him by baptism unto death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with Him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, and that we may serve sin no longer. For he that is dead is justified from sin. Now if ye be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall live also together with Christ. Knowing that Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more, death shall no more have dominion over Him. For in that He died to sin He died once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God. So do you also reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin.

**GRADUAL:** *Psalm 89: 13, 1* Return, O Lord, a little; and be entreated in favour of Thy servants. *V.* Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation. **ALLELUIA:** *Psalm 30: 2-3* Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and release me; bow down Thy ear to me, make haste to deliver me. Alleluia.

**GOSPEL:** *Mark 8: 1-9* **At** that time, when there was a great multitude with Jesus, and had nothing to eat, calling His disciples together, He saith to them: I have compassion on the multitude, for behold they have now been with Me three days, and have nothing to eat; and if I shall send them away fasting to their home, they will faint in the way: for some of them came from afar off. And His disciples answered Him: From whence can any one fill them here with bread in the wilderness? And He asked them: How many loaves have ye? Who said: Seven. And He commanded the people to sit down on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, giving thanks, He broke and gave to His disciples to set before the people. And they had a few little fishes, and He blessed them, and commanded them to be set before them. And they did eat, and were filled; and they took up that which was left of the fragments, seven baskets: and they that had eaten were about four thousand: and He sent them away.

**OFFERTORY:** *Psalm 16: 5, 6-7* Perfect Thou my goings in Thy paths, that my footsteps be not moved: incline Thy ear, and hear my words: show forth Thy wonderful mercies, Thou who savest them that trust in Thee, O Lord.
