

SCRIPTURE STUDY



ST. LUKE CHAPTER 22: 1-6

We now move into the final segment of our study of St. Luke's Gospel: the Passion and Resurrection narratives of chapters 22-24. St. Luke introduces this last section with his description of Judas conspiring with the religious leaders against Jesus in vv. 1-6: "*Now the feast of Unleavened Bread,*

called the Passover, was drawing near, and the chief priests and the scribes were seeking a way to put Him to death, for they were afraid of the people. Then Satan entered into Judas, the one surnamed Iscariot, who was counted among the Twelve, and he went to the chief priests and temple guards to discuss a plan for handing Him over to them. They were pleased and agreed to pay him money. He accepted their offer and sought a favorable opportunity to hand Him over to them in the absence of a crowd." This catalyst event sets everything in motion, and the dramatic narrative of the Triduum unfolds.

There are two points for our consideration in this brief introduction. The first concerns the timing of the Passion. It is highly significant that Jesus' approaching Passion takes place during the Passover. This feast commemorates Israel's deliverance from the final plague in Egypt by means of the blood of the lamb, and the beginning of their Exodus from slavery to Pharaoh (cf. Ex. 11-12). St. John the Baptist links Jesus to the Passover lamb when he hails Him as "*the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world*" (cf. Jn. 1:29). As St. John Chrysostom explains, Jesus delivers man from slavery to the devil, and inaugurates the definitive Exodus from sin. In his Passion narrative, St. John the Apostle intentionally links Jesus to the Passover lamb when he indicates that the issuing of Jesus' death sentence occurred at noontime on Good Friday (the time that the Passover lambs were slaughtered,

cf. Jn. 19:14-16).

The second significant point for consideration in this introduction is that the instigation of the betrayal is explicitly diabolical. St. Luke does not tell us what led to Satan entering Judas, but it is likely due to him being deeply entrenched in mortal sin. In other words, Judas would have had to consent consciously to the devil's presence in his life in order to engage in this wicked plot. In St. John's Gospel, we hear that Judas was the treasurer for Jesus and the other apostles, but often stole from their common funds (cf. Jn. 12:4-6). According to St. John Chrysostom, the grave sin in question was greed, or covetousness, and this is confirmed by the fact that Judas accepts the money the chief priests give him to do their dirty work (thirty pieces of silver, as St. Matthew's Gospel specifies- cf. Mt. 26:15).

We do not know how long the devil had been wearing Judas down with the sins of greed and theft, but he was patient and calculating, waiting for an opportunity to strike at Our Lord. Certain commentaries rightly link this passage with the temptation in the wilderness. St. Luke tells us that after Jesus' victory over the devil in the wilderness, the devil left Him "*until an opportune time,*" that is, the moment of Judas' betrayal (cf. Lk. 4:13, RSV). As Christian believers, we need to be on guard against temptation, lest the devil lead us into the devastation of mortal sin. Frequent recitation of the prayer to St. Michael, especially in the heat of temptation, can be helpful in this regard. Let us entrust ourselves to God's merciful protection, and "*take every thought captive in obedience to Christ*" (cf. 2 Cor. 10:5).






