Pastor's Note



“SIEMPRE ADELANTE”—ALWAYS FORWARD

One of the most significant parts of Pope Francis's Apostolic Visit to the United States last week was his canonization of the Franciscan Missionary Friar Blessed Junipero Serra outside the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception on September 23rd. In his homily the Pope quoted Fr. Serra's motto: "*Siempre adelante*"—*always forward*, as an inspirational motto for contemporary evangelizing efforts. (Fr. Serra's motto was his personal paraphrase of St. Francis of Assisi's dying words: "*Brothers, let us begin! For up to now we have done nothing.*")

In the secular media the canonization was described as "controversial": "*He is seen by many Native Americans as a colonialist*

who helped establish a system of Spanish subjugation and helped carry disease into their communities." (*New York Times*, Sept. 23, 2015, "25,000 Fill Washington for Canonization") Sunday, September 27th, was to have been a day of special celebration at his shrine in California. During the night, however, vandals defaced it. California police are now investigating it as a hate-crime.

It falls particularly to us as Catholics to know the authentic facts about Fr. Serra's life and to resist the "Black Legend" advanced by those who, for ideological reasons, want to portray the Spanish Missions in the worst possible light.

By any measure Junipero Serra (1713-1784) was a self-sacrificing man who demonstrated extraordinary courage, perseverance and charity in his missionary efforts to preach the Christian Gospel to the native peoples of what is the present-day state of California between 1769 and his death in 1784. To quote one historian, he was, "*one of the great frontiersman of the Americas...a two-fisted fighting man on behalf of the Missions and the Indian.*" (Herbert E. Bolton, quoted in "*Always Forward: Fr. Junipero Serra, OFM*" by Antonine Tibesar, *Portraits in American Sanctity*, Joseph N. Tylenda, SJ, ed., Franciscan Herald Press, A.D. 1982) By public vote, his statue is placed in our National Statuary Hall in Washington, D.C.

Despite the effects of a leg wound which never properly healed, Fr. Serra walked his missionary journeys. He learned the native language so as to preach to the indigenous peoples in their own tongue. He established his first mission at San Diego on July 16th, 1769. Eight more missions were to follow before his death, with about 4,600 Christian native peoples: San Carlos Borromeo, San Antonio, San Luis Obispo, San Gabriel, San Juan Capistrano, San Francisco, Santa Clara and San Buenaventura. He was a man of great humanity as well as a Catholic Saint. His canonization is nothing to apologize for.

SCRIPTURE STUDY



ST. LUKE CHAPTER 23:1-12

Chapter 23 begins with the Sanhedrin's accusations against Jesus before Pontius Pilate: "We found this Man misleading our people; He opposes the payment of taxes to Caesar and maintains that He is the Messiah, a king" (v. 2). As the commentary in the Orthodox Study Bible explains, they put forward

"politically charged accusations in order to persuade Pilate to put Jesus to death." The second of their accusations is particularly ridiculous, since Jesus clearly had *not* opposed paying taxes to Caesar, as many witnesses could corroborate (cf. 20:20-25).

In v. 3, Jesus' response "You say so," to Pilate's question, "Are you the king of the Jews?" is somewhat puzzling on a first reading, for it almost seems as if Jesus is downplaying His Messiahship. As the commentary in the Ignatius Study Bible explains, however, Jesus was avoiding the *misconception* of being considered an insurrectionist. To underline this point, the Ignatius Study Bible cross-references Jesus' conversation with Pilate in St. John's Gospel, wherein He states unequivocally, "My kingdom does not belong to this world" (cf. Jn. 18:36). Similarly, we can see the same stance of Jesus in St. John's account of the feeding of the five thousand, wherein He withdraws from the crowds who want to make Him king (cf. 6:15). Thus, we could read Jesus' answer "You say so" as conveying something like this: "Governor, the words 'king of the Jews' came out of your mouth, not Mine." Consequently, Pilate does not see Jesus as a threat to Roman civil order (v. 4).

Upon finding that Jesus is from Galilee, however, Pilate sends Him to Herod, the Galilean ruler who happened to be in Jerusalem for the Passover feast (vv. 6-7). St. Luke tells us that "Herod was very glad to see Jesus...for he had heard about Him and

been hoping to see Him perform some sign (v. 8)." Earlier in 9:7-9, Herod had inquired into Jesus' identity, perhaps fearful that He was some ghostly manifestation of St. John the Baptist, whom he had just killed. Herod's superficial motives and lengthy questioning do not result in a hoped-for miracle (v. 9). In response to Jesus' silence, "Herod and his soldiers treated Him contemptuously and mocked Him, and after clothing Him in resplendent garb, he sent Him back to Pilate" (v. 11).

This scene of mockery is linked to elements of the Transfiguration. On Mt. Tabor, God the Father confirms the identity of Christ as His "chosen Son" (cf. 9:35). Here, Herod, who for a long time had wondered who Jesus was, ultimately fails to discover His true identity. In the Transfiguration, Jesus' face and His clothes "became dazzling white" (cf. 9:29), revealing His divinity. In Herod's court, the "resplendent garb" mocks kingship. On Mt. Tabor, Moses and Elijah discuss Jesus' Passion (His "exodus," cf. 9:31). In Herod's court, it is already underway, bringing the earlier exchange between Christ, Moses, and Elijah to fulfillment.

In the other Gospel narratives, it is Pilate's soldiers who clothe Jesus in royal garb, while Herod is not mentioned. The Gospel accounts of this detail can nevertheless be harmonized. It is likely that Pilate's soldiers got the idea for such mockery from the clothes Jesus was already wearing from Herod's court, and put different robes on Him after the scourging.

As we continue to meditate on Our Lord led as a lamb to slaughter and opening not His mouth (cf. Is. 53:7), may He grant us the following graces: (1) the grace to avoid gossip and slander, (2) the grace to endure wrongs patiently, united to His Passion, and finally, (3) the grace always to speak the truth in love (cf. Eph. 4:15).

COLLECT: O God, whose only-begotten Son by His Life and death and resurrection has won for us the rewards of eternal salvation, grant, we pray, that we who meditate on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Proverbs 8: 22-24, 32-35* The Lord possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything, from the beginning. I was set up from eternity, and of old, before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived. Now therefore, ye children, hear me: blessed are they that keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man that heareth me, and that watcheth daily at my gates; and waiteth at the posts of my doors. He that shall find me, shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.

GRADUAL: *Psalm 44:5, 11, 12* Because of truth, and meekness, and justice: and thy right hand shall conduct thee wonderfully. V. GOSPEL: *Luke 1:26-38* **At** that time, the Angel Gabriel was sent from God into a city of Galilee, called Nazareth, to a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the House of David: and the virgin's name was Mary. And the angel being come in, said unto her: Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women. Who, having heard, was troubled at his saying and thought with herself what manner of salutation this should be. And the angel said to her: Fear not, Mary, for thou hast found grace with God. Behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb and shalt bring forth a Son: and thou shalt call His name Jesus. He shall be great and shall be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of David His Father: and He shall reign in the House of Jacob forever, and of His Kingdom there shall be no end. And Mary said to the angel: How shall this be done since I know not man? And the angel answering, said to her: The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee. And therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God. And behold thy cousin Elizabeth, she also hath conceived a son in her old age: and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren; because no word shall be impossible with God. And Mary said: Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word.

OFFERTORY: *Ecclus. 24: 25; 39:17* In me is all grace of the way and of the truth; in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Like a rose planted on the rivers I have budded forth.
