



SCRIPTURE STUDY

SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY ST. JOHN THE APOSTLE ECCLESIASTICUS 15:1-6

The Epistle for today's Mass is a lesson taken from the book of Ecclesiasticus (to be distinguished from the book of Ecclesiastes). This book is also known as the book of Sirach, after the name of its author. It is one of the many books in the Old Testament which comprise the "Wisdom Literature" section. In these books, the virtue of wisdom is sometimes personified as a woman and given feminine pronouns. In today's selection from Sirach, justice is also personified in this way. The reason for this frequent motif is metaphorical: the sacred writer presents the virtues as beautiful and desirable, because they are pure and good.

The literal sense of this passage indicates that the acquisition of the virtue of justice bestows certain rewards. The entire passage is taken up with listing them: understanding, wisdom, fortitude, glory, joy, and gladness. In other words, when someone gives God and neighbor their due (this is the definition of justice), these other things can often follow. All of this is eminently practical. When we love, honor and obey God by our prayer, tithing, and sacrifices, and acts of mercy, God bestows other spiritual graces in return to help us to become holier. This is different from the "health and wealth" Gospel, wherein temporal blessings are presumptuously expected as a reward for our good works. Rather, this passage clearly shows us that the graces given to those who fear the Lord are *spiritual*. They are given so that we may acquire more virtue. God responds to our sincere effort to advance in holiness by bestowing more grace according to His good pleasure. We cannot manufacture *which* graces God gives us, nor *when* we receive them, because they are gifts. However, these graces can and do come, because they are ordered to God's express will for us: our growth in holiness (cf. 1 Thes. 4:3, 5:23-24).

The spiritual sense of this text may be applied to Our Lady, following the liturgical tradition of the Church. She is the embodiment of

wisdom and all the virtues. There is special unctio in interpreting the just man in this passage as St. John himself. The graced relationship between Justice and the virtuous man in this passage is not only a prototypical one, but is truly the graced relationship between Our Lady and St. John. In light of this, verse 2 is particularly poignant: "*she will meet him as an honorable mother.*" Likewise v. 3: "*With the bread of life and understanding she shall feed him.*" This verse should immediately bring to mind St. John's beautiful "Bread of Life" discourse in chapter 6 of his Gospel. As his spiritual mother (cf. Jn. 19:26-27), Mary bestows special graces on St. John, her spiritual son. Fortunately for us, we are all included in this maternal embrace, a gift which Jesus Himself bestowed on us as he hung dying on the cross. She is our mother too, and she invites us to receive cascading graces and virtues from her Immaculate Heart.

Verse 5 is particularly beautiful in light of the apostolic preaching of St. John, as well as his Gospel, his letters, and his Apocalypse: "*in the midst of the Church she shall open his mouth, and shall fill him with the spirit of wisdom and understanding.*" One cannot underestimate the singular influence of Our Lady on St. John's mystical understanding of the life of Christ and Our Lady. In addition to the glorious infancy narratives of St. Luke, St. John's writings teach us about Our Lady in stunningly beautiful and mystical ways (cf. Jn. 2:1-11; Rev. 12:1-17).






