

FRONT COVER:

The Ascension of Our Lord: The Blessed Virgin Mary and the Apostles are in awe as the Lord Jesus ascends into Heaven from the Mount of Olives in His glorified Humanity. For nine days following, Mary and the Disciples prayed together perseveringly until the Jewish Feast of Pentecost, on which day the power of the Holy Ghost descended upon them all. Their vigil of prayer for nine days is the first “novena” in the Church

SCRIPTURE STUDY

SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY SUNDAY AFTER ASCENSION 1 Peter 4:7-11

Today's Epistle from 1 Peter 4 provides fitting instruction for us during this novena (nine days) between Our Lord's Ascension into Heaven and the descent of the Holy Ghost on Pentecost. To begin with, St. Peter tells us that we should "*be prudent and watch in prayers*" (v. 7). St. Peter knew the value of insistent prayer, since he, the other Apostles, and Our Lady were immersed in such prayer prior to the grace of Pentecost (cf. Acts 1:13-14). Such prayer prepared them to be worthy vessels for the Spirit's gifts.

The first part of v. 7 (not included in today's Epistle) gives a justification for this attentive kind of prayer: "*The end of all things is at hand*" (RSV). In view of the second coming of Christ (the time of which is unknown to us), the best form of preparation is prayer. St. Peter's charge calls to mind the parable of the wise virgins, who kept vigil for the coming of the Bridegroom (cf. Mt. 25:1-13). We can certainly apply his admonition to our liturgical preparation for the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. In addition to prayer, the equally important form of preparation is growth in the virtue of charity. As St. Peter explains, "*before all things have a constant mutual charity among yourselves: for charity covereth a multitude of sins*" (v. 8). The rest of the passage fleshes out what this should look like in a church community with practical examples of ministry and service (vv. 9-11).

Showing Christ-like love for one another challenges our sinful habits. Hence St. Peter makes an explicit injunction against "*murmuring*" in v. 9. The RSV translates v. 9 in the following way: "*Practice hospitality ungrudgingly to one another.*" Another translation for this word could be "*complaining.*" Perhaps when we are tempted to murmur, we can think of one of our more content-laden confessions, and how Christ treated us with loving compassion, lifting the weight of guilt and shame. He did not murmur, or impart His forgiveness grudgingly. How disarming his welcome to sinners! Would that we could more easily let the memory of His grace

smother the impulse to murmur. Again, "*charity covereth a multitude of sins*" (v. 8).

In v. 10, the Greek word St. Peter uses for "*grace*" or "*gift*" is the same word from which "*charism*" is derived. In English, we often use the word "*charism*" to describe the special kind of apostolate or ministry of a religious order. Franciscans have a charism for serving the poor, for example. We know that we receive charisms of the Holy Spirit especially in Confirmation (Chrismation, in the Eastern Churches). The Holy Spirit imparts His own gifts to us for the benefit of the Church. While it is good to discern what particular kinds of gifts He has given us, the one gift that should occupy all our efforts of sanctification is charity. As we have already seen in today's Epistle, St. Peter commands that the laity should serve one another with whatever kind of charism God has given them, but like St. Paul, he affirms the primacy of charity (cf. 1 Cor. 13:13). This gift of the Holy Spirit matters most, and all can learn to exercise it more fully.

In our Collect today, we ask God that we may "*always bear towards [him] a devoted will, and serve [his] Majesty with a sincere heart.*" The root and foundation of a devoted will is the gift of charity. We cannot be devout or sincere in our service of God without this chief charism of the Holy Spirit. May this theological virtue be the object of our prayer this week as we move closer to Pentecost. May God help us to acquire and nurture it more fully during this season.
