SCRIPTURE STUDY

SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY PENTECOST SUNDAY Acts 2:1-11

Today's lesson from the Book of Acts recounts the coming of the Holy Ghost upon Our Lady and the Apostles, manifesting Himself under the form of fire. At Jesus' baptism, by contrast, He manifests himself in the form of a dove (cf. Lk. 3:22). Like the sacraments we receive today, wherein tangible elements both signify and confer grace, so too, the fire simultaneously veils and manifests the divine presence of the Holy Ghost. Fire warms, burns or purifies, and gives light. By way of analogy, the Holy Spirit, like fire, burns or purifies us of our sins by means of baptism and confirmation. In these two sacraments, He simultaneously "warms" us by kindling within us the grace of charity. Like the brightness of fire, He also enlightens our minds and wills with the truth, so that we might know God and live in His grace.

These aspects of the analogy of fire appear in the Alleluia verse and the glorious Sequence hymn, the Veni, Sancte Spiritus. The Alleluia verse is very familiar to many of us: "Come, O Holy Ghost, fill the hearts of Thy faithful: and kindle in them the fire of Thy love." This is a prayer often said before study, especially of the Scriptures. The parts of the Sequence hymn which invoke the analogy of fire and light read thus: "Shed a ray of light divine...within our bosoms shine...melt the frozen, warm the chill, guide the steps that go astray." What a good practice it would be for us to pray this Sequence throughout the year in our devotions, especially when troubled, doubtful, or sorrowful. An appropriate prayer for the Year of Mercy indeed.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church no. 696, we read that "fire symbolizes the transforming energy of the Holy Spirit's actions....[He] transforms what He touches." In the Eastern Churches, a particular devotion to the Holy Spirit has developed in their Epiklesis prayers in various traditions, in which the priest, having already said the words of consecration, calls upon the Holy Spirit to transform the bread and wine into Christ's Body and Blood. Thus, this ancient tradition makes a distinction between the

priest as *Alter Christus*, and the Holy Spirit, noting their equally indispensable roles in confecting the sacrament. In their ancient Divine Liturgy of St. James, our brethren of Our Lady of Mesopotamia Mission here at Mary Immaculate have a beautiful *Epiklesis* prayer. Their Syriac tradition is a continuing witness of devotion to the Holy Spirit and His action in the miracle of Transubstantiation.

In Book 7 of his work, *On the Priesthood*, St. John Chrysostom, still a layman at the time, comments thus on the roles of the Holy Spirit and the priest at the Eucharistic sacrifice: "Imagine in your mind's eye, if you will, Elijah and the vast crowd standing around him and the sacrifice lying upon the stone altar. All the rest are still, hushed in deep silence. The prophet alone is praying. Suddenly fire falls from the skies on to the offering. It is marvelous; it is charged with bewilderment. Turn, then, from that scene to our present rites, and you will see not only marvelous things, but things that transcend all terror. The priests stands bringing down, not fire, but the Holy Spirit. And he offers prayer at length, not that some flame lit from above may consume the offerings, but that grace may fall on the sacrifice through that prayer..."

Thus, we could rightly consider every Mass to be a renewal of the grace of Pentecost, insofar as the Holy Spirit comes down upon the Church and her offering, transforming both by His grace.




