SCRIPTURE STUDY

SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST Romans 6:3-11

In today's Epistle from Romans 6, St. Paul expects his flock to be deeply aware of how one's life is fundamentally changed by dying and rising sacramentally with Christ. St. Paul explains in v. 4: "We were buried therefore with Him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life" (RSV). The spiritual death of Original Sin has been swallowed up by the atoning death of Jesus, and man can now be in a living relationship with God. The baptized have received the gift of sanctifying grace, that is, a sharing in God's own divine life. This gift, of course, also entails *remaining* in His love (Jn. 15:9-14), for "walk[ing] in newness of life," means keeping the commandments.

The long-term effect of baptism for Christ's faithful who die in His friendship likewise means a share in bodily resurrection and eternal life in heaven. As St. Paul explains further on, "if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him" (v. 8, RSV). St. Paul lays out the theological virtue of hope quite clearly here. The truth of the hope of eternal life is set forth by means of a conditional clause, e.g., "if this, then that." The implied term between the two parts of the sentence is affirmative. Thus, we may read v. 8 like this: "if we have died with Christ- and we have- then we believe that we shall also live with Him." The plain meaning of the text is that those who are baptized can legitimately hope for resurrection and eternal life.

Someone might object: "Is this not a sin of presumption? No one knows whether he will get to heaven." In a similar vein, some have criticized the post-conciliar funeral rites of speaking perhaps too boldly of this kind of hope. I would answer these charges firstly by making a crucial distinction between presumption, which originates in man's mis-placed self-confidence, and the divine gift of hope, which leads one to rest entirely on the authority of God's promises, as well as His mercy and grace which

enable man to attain eternal life. I would also encourage one to examine both forms of the rites themselves. The prayers which Holy Mother Church provides us in both her old and revised rites proclaim boldly the Good News of Christian hope for life after death, and are in complete alignment with the teaching of Scripture and the Church regarding death, prayer for the departed, heaven, and resurrection. This should fill us with great gladness.

The following two prayers from the Roman Missal (1970 edition) are taken from a memorial Mass for the departed on their year's mind (Prayer over the Gifts and Post-communion). They tie in quite well with St. Paul's words in today's Epistle. Here is the Prayer over the Gifts:

"Almighty and merciful God, by means of these sacrificial offerings, wash away, we pray, in the Blood of Christ, the sins of your departed servant N., for You purify unceasingly by Your merciful forgiveness those you once cleansed in the waters of Baptism. Through Christ our Lord. Amen."

Here is the Post-communion:

"Having received the Sacrament of your Only Begotten Son, who was sacrificed for us and rose in glory, we humbly implore You, O Lord, for Your departed servant N., that, cleansed by the paschal mysteries, he (she) may glory in the gift of the resurrection to come. Through Christ our Lord."



LATIN MASS PROPERS: SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 27: 8-9 The Lord is the strength of His people, and the protector of the salvation of His anointed: save, O Lord, Thy people, and bless Thy inheritance, and rule them for ever. Psalm 27: 8-9 Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent to me, lest if Thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God of all power and might, who art the giver of all good things; implant in our hearts the love of Thy name, increase in us true religion, nourish us with all goodness and by Thy mercy keep us in the same. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Romans 6: 3-11 Brethren, all we who are baptized in Christ Jesus are baptized in His death. For we are buried together with Him by baptism unto death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with Him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, and that we may serve sin no longer. For he that is dead is justified from sin. Now if ye be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall live also together with Christ. Knowing that Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more, death shall no more have dominion over Him. For in that He died to sin He died once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God. So do you also reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin.

GRADUAL: Psalm 89: 13, 1 Return, O Lord, a little; and be entreated in favour of Thy servants. V. Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation. **ALLELUIA:** Psalm 30: 2-3 Alleluia, alleluia. V. In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and release me; bow down Thy ear to me, make haste to deliver me. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Mark 8: 1-9 **At** that time, when there was a great multitude with Jesus, and had nothing to eat, calling His disciples together, He saith to them: I have compassion on the multitude, for behold they have now been with Me three days, and have nothing to eat; and if I shall send them away fasting to their home, they will faint in the way: for some of them came from afar off. And His disciples answered Him: From whence can any one fill them here with bread in the wilderness? And He asked them: How many loaves have ye? Who said: Seven. And He commanded the people to sit down on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, giving thanks, He broke and gave to His disciples to set before the people. And they had a few little fishes, and He blessed them, and commanded them to be set before them. And they did eat, and were filled; and they took up that which was left of the fragments, seven baskets: and they that had eaten were about four thousand: and He sent them away.

OFFERTORY: Psalm 16: 5, 6-7 Perfect Thou my goings in Thy paths, that my footsteps be not moved: incline Thy ear, and hear my words: show forth Thy wonderful mercies, Thou who savest them that trust in Thee, O Lord.

SECRET Be appeased, O Lord, by our supplications, and graciously accept these offerings of Thy people: neither suffering the hope of anyone to be in vain, nor his prayer to remain unheard, that we may obtain that for which we faithfully pray. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION: Psalm 26: 6 I will go round, and offer up in His tabernacle a sacrifice of jubilation; I will sing, and recite a psalm to the Lord.

POSTCOMMUNION Grant, O Lord, that we who have been filled with Thy gifts may be cleansed by their virtue and strengthened by their help. Through our Lord.




