SCRIPTURE STUDY

SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY SEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST Romans 6:19-23

Today's Epistle is drawn from the same chapter as last week's Epistle. St. Paul uses the analogy of slavery to illustrate the drastically different rewards one earns from different masters (sin and God, respectively). Prior to baptism, one is a slave to sin, in the sense that he is subjugated to its destructive power, and consequently, merits death (vv. 16, 21). After baptism, however, the Christian is a "*slave of God*," in the sense that he belongs now to a benevolent Lord, and owes him his complete loyalty and obedience. Consequently, the reward for service to God is "*sanctification*" and "*eternal life*" (vv. 16-17, 22, RSV).

In light of this, we do well to think about aspects of our lives that are not always wholly given over to the service of God. Where are we still backsliding into the service of sin? The entire spiritual tradition of the Church would appear to agree that regular sacramental confession and frequent and worthy reception of Holy Communion are the greatest helps to us in battling against and overcoming these areas of servitude to sin. Additionally, the Church urges us to develop a keen sense of the triggers or the *"near occasions of sin"* which precipitously lead us into servitude to sin. Awareness of these triggers and diligent avoidance of them can help to prevent us from falling.

The Collect for today's Mass proves helpful in this regard. With the directness and clarity so characteristic of a Roman Collect, it petitions God for protection and for all necessary graces: "O God, whose providence faileth not in its designs, we humbly entreat Thee: put from us all that might be harmful and give us all that will be profitable. Through Our Lord Jesus Christ, etc." While this prayer is quite simple, there is much richness here, if we but take the time to examine it and meditate on its contents.

Prior to making our request, we acclaim God's ultimate and benevolent control over all things. This act of faith inspires our confidence in literally bowing down and begging (supplices exoramus) His protection from "all that might be harmful," including temptation, for instance. Trust in God's benevolent providence also inspires us to ask him to give us "all that will be profitable." Since this prayer teaches us to trust in God as the giver of all good gifts (cf. Jam. 1:17), we cast ourselves upon His infinite gratuity to aid us in our needs. We trust Him to provide the grace we need to withstand temptation and to overcome concupiscence, i.e., our disordered desires (cf. James 1:14-15). We trust also that He will help us when we encounter unavoidable temptations and trials, all of which are permitted by God in His good providence in order to strengthen our faith, hope, and charity. We cannot forget that the Father permitted Jesus to be tempted in the wilderness (cf. Mt. 4:1-11).

In v. 23, St. Paul reaffirms that death is the reward of slavery to sin, while he exalts the gratuity of God: "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (RSV). St. Paul so accentuates God's gratuity that it proves to be an analogy for Christian faith that is superior even to the analogy of servitude to righteousness. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the "vocation to eternal life is supernatural. It depends entirely on God's gratuitous initiative, for He alone can reveal and give Himself" (cf. CCC no. 1998).
