his bishop. We are grateful for his priestly assistance at Mary Immaculate of Lourdes.


DEACON STEPHEN WOLFE, S.J.

SCRIPTURE STUDY

SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY FIFTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST Galatians 5:25-6:10

Today's Epistle picks up where last week's Epistle ended, contrasting life in the Spirit with the "works of the flesh." St. Paul continues to offer moral instruction that applies both to the life of the Church and to the interior life. The key to observing his instructions, of course, is found in 5:25: "If we live by the Spirit" (RSV). This little conditional clause implies that his readers *do* in fact live by the Spirit, by virtue of their baptism. The Spirit of God dwells in our bodies and souls through baptism, giving us the grace to become saints. So many Christians mistake the Holy Spirit for a religious version of George Lucas's notion of "the force." Nothing could be further from the truth (and it doesn't help that the New American Bible translation mistakenly uses impersonal pronouns for the Holy Spirit such as "it" instead of "he" and "him"). Our life in the Holy Spirit is not some abstract hypothesis, but a personal communion with each Person of the Trinity in and through the Body of Christ, the Church.

In light of this, then, we can think about "walking in the Spirit," and thus, St. Paul's moral exhortations, as ways of bearing the Presence of the Holy Spirit and His grace to fellow believers and our neighbors (he exhorts us to care for both categories of persons in v. 10, but especially our fellow-believers). For example, in 6:1, St. Paul commends the spiritual work of mercy that we call "admonishing sinners," and it is to be done with "gentleness." Living as we do in an overly-sensitive age wherein many tend to get unduly offended at the moral demands of religion, it is particularly important to approach such interactions with family and friends with complete reliance upon the mercy and convicting power of the Holy Spirit. *He* is the One who will work in the person's heart who has fallen from or wounded the life of grace. But for the grace of God, we, too, might be in the same state of fallenness, which is why St. Paul continues in the second half of v. 1, "Look to yourself, lest you too be tempted" (RSV).

Indeed, all of the spiritual works of mercy are collectively *the way* to "walk by the Spirit." Counseling the doubtful, instructing the ignorant, comforting the afflicted, forgiving offenses, bearing wrongs patiently, and praying for the living and the dead are the other spiritual works of mercy which are equally as important as admonishing sinners. These works of mercy are the various ways we can help others to "bear [their] burdens," as St. Paul instructs us in v. 2, allowing us to "fulfil the law of Christ" (RSV). This "law of Christ" is simply to "love your neighbor as yourself," as he explains earlier in 5:14, referencing Lev. 19:18 and Mt. 22:39.

The other components of today's Epistle challenge us to think about our own particular judgment at the moment of death. St. Paul compares our moral life in Christ to planting and harvesting. If we practice the "works of the flesh," we are sure to "reap corruption" (v. 8, RSV). As we heard last week, "those who do such things [i.e., practice the "works of the flesh"] shall not inherit the kingdom of God" (cf. 5:21, RSV). Rather, we want to have "a good defense before the awesome judgment seat of Christ," as the Byzantines pray at every liturgy. Hence, if we sow in the Spirit (i.e., "walk by the Spirit," cf. 5:25), we will "reap eternal life" (v. 8, RSV). We should not discount even the smallest good deed, interior sacrifice, or suffering we endure, if it is offered in love to Jesus. These all contribute to our salvation and heavenly reward. As Blessed Mother Teresa said, "How do we love? Not in big things, but in small things with great love."







Brethren, and if any man be overtaken in any fault, you, who are spiritual, instruct such a one in the Spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens, and so you shall fulfill the law of Christ. For if any man thinks himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. But let everyone prove his own work, and so he shall have glory in himself only, and not in another. For everyone shall bear his own burden. And let him that is instructed in the word, communicate to him that instructeth him, in all good things. Be not deceived: God is not mocked; for what things a man shall sow, those also shall he reap. For he that soweth in his flesh, of the flesh shall reap corruption: but he that soweth in the spirit, of the spirit shall reap life everlasting. And in doing good, let us not fail; for in due time we shall reap, not failing. Therefore, whilst we have time, let us work good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of the faith.




