Pastor's Note

MOTHER TERESA OF CALCUTTA AND THE "LITTLE WAY" OF ST. THERESE OF LISIEUX



As the Church throughout the world rejoices in the canonization of Mother Teresa of Calcutta we would do well to consider the link between Mother Teresa's Apostolate and the spirituality of St. Therese of Lisieux.



During the last decades of her life when she was world-renowned, Mother Teresa would remind people that the name she had taken in religion "Teresa" (her baptismal name was "Agnes") was not for the "great Teresa", St. Teresa of Avila, but for the little Teresa—St Therese of Lisieux, the "Little Flower".

The connection between St. Therese's "Little Way" (*"La Petite Voie"*) and Mother Teresa's spirituality is obvious. The provenance is very direct. Think, for example, of Mother Teresa's description of the work of the Missionaries of Charity: *"do little things, with great love."*

In the early days of the spread of the accounts of life of Sister Therese, the young Carmelite nun of Lisieux, France, and her autobiography *Story of a Soul*, Therese's life and spirituality found a particularly receptive community among the Irish Sisters of Loreto. The Sisters of Loreto was the religious community which Mother Teresa joined as a young Albanian Catholic girl in the 1920s. She taught at a Sisters of Loreto School in India until the late 1940s until she asked for permission to leave the Community and begin an apostolate to the street people of Calcutta.



This permission was in response to a mystical experience she had of Christ's thirst on the Cross, which was an expression of the thirst of His love.

St. Therese of Lisieux had a great desire to be a missionary, but she had to content herself with being an intercessor in prayer for the missionaries of her day. In Mother Teresa of Calcutta, however, it is as if we have seen the extension of Therese's life as an active missionary: her spirituality, her "Little Way", now put into concrete action in a missionary nun's service to the *"poorest of the poor"*, serving them as serving *"Jesus in distressing disguise."*

Mother Teresa of Calcutta died on September 5th, 1997, in the centennial year marking the death of St. Therese of Lisieux, who died on September 30th, 1897.

SCRIPTURE STUDY

SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY SIXTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST Ephesians 3:13-21

In the past two weeks, we have considered the Person and work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of the faithful, basing our meditations on St. Paul's instructions to the Galatians. In today's passage from Ephesians 3, St. Paul once again highlights the Person and work of the Holy Spirit. In vv. 16-17, he prays that God the Father "may grant [them] to be strengthened with might through His Spirit in the inner man, and that Christ may dwell in [their] hearts through faith" (RSV).

The Holy Spirit's indwelling of a believer imparts a certain form of strength. What kind of strength? It would not appear to be physical, for St. Paul envisions this strengthening taking place "in the inner man," that is, in the soul, wherein are our powers of intellect and will (knowing and loving). The Spirit gives us the strength, the divine power, to know and love the Father like Jesus, and to think and act with the mind and heart of Jesus. This is the strength of the Holy Spirit, which results in "Christ dwelling in our hearts through faith." Our thoughts, will, and actions become His. This is what it means to become a Christian, a "little Christ."

Such Christ-like knowing and loving is impossible apart from the grace of the Spirit. Hence, St. Paul acclaims God's power in vv. 20-21: "Now to Him who by the power [same Greek word as v. 16] at work within us is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, to Him be glory in the Church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever. Amen" (RSV). The Holy Spirit supplies what we need for God's will to be done, and this power of His terminates in praise of the Father.

How is it, then, that we are strengthened in this power of the Holy Spirit? The principal channel is the *Epiclesis* prayer contained in each sacrament, wherein the priest (or bishop), asks God to send down the Holy Spirit upon the sacramental matter and the people

(cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church* nos.1105-1109). [In the Roman Canon, the *Epiclesis* is not explicit, but rather, is implied in the prayer immediately preceding the words of consecration, the *Quam oblationem*- cf. Walsh, *In Memory of Me*, pp. 88-94].

The following full quotation of Catechism no. 1109 gives an excellent sense of the purpose and power of the *Epiclesis*:

The epiclesis is also a prayer for the full effect of the assembly's communion with the mystery of Christ. 'The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit' have to remain with us always and bear fruit beyond the Eucharistic celebration. The Church therefore asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit to make the lives of the faithful a living sacrifice to God by their spiritual transformation into the image of Christ, by concern for the Church's unity, and by taking part in her mission through the witness and service of charity.

These are words which truly capture the dynamic at work in Ephesians 3 and the liturgy. [My inspiration for these latter thoughts, in particular, is owed to Fr. Jean Corbon, a Melkite Catholic priest, in his excellent book, *The Wellspring of Worship*, published by Ignatius Press. Chapters 10-12 are especially instructive on the power and grace of the *Epiclesis*.]





LATIN MASS PROPERS: SIXTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 85: 3, 5. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I have cried to Thee all the day; for Thou, O Lord, art sweet and mild, and plenteous in mercy to all that call upon Thee. *Psalm 85:1* Bow down Thy ear to me, O Lord, and hear me; for I am needy and poor. *V.* Glory be to the Father...

COLLECT: O Lord, we pray Thee that Thy grace may always precede and follow us, and make us continually intent upon all good works. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Ephesians 3:13-31 Brethren: I pray you not to faint at my tribulations for you, which are your glory. For this cause I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of whom all paternity in heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened by His Spirit with might unto the inward man. That Christ may dwell by faith in your hearts; that being rooted and founded in charity, you may be able to comprehend with all the saints, what is the breadth and length, and height, and depth. To know also the charity of Christ, which surpasseth all knowledge; that you may be filled unto all the fullness of God. Now to Him who is able to do all things more abundantly than we desire or understand, according to the power that worketh in us: to Him be glory in the Church, and in Christ Jesus, unto all generations, world without end. Amen.

But they held their peace: but He taking him, healed him, and sent him away. And answering them, He said: Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit, and will not immediately draw him out on the Sabbath-day? And they could not answer Him these things. And He spoke a parable also to them that were invited, marking how they chose the first seats at the table, saying to them: When thou art invited to a wedding, sit not down in the first place, lest perhaps one more honorable than thou be invited by him; and he that invited thee and him, come and say to thee: Give this man place; and then thou begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when thou art invited, go, sit down at the lowest place: that when he who invited thee cometh, he may say to thee: Friend, go up higher: then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at table with thee: because every one that exalteth himself shall be humbled, and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.




