# SCRIPTURE STUDY

## SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST I Corinthians 1:4-8

In today's Epistle, St. Paul tells the Christians in Corinth that, on account of "the grace of God...[they] are not lacking in any spiritual gift" (vv. 4, 7, RSV). Recently, I was listening to an archived show of Mother Angelica on Catholic radio, and she was answering call-in questions. Although I didn't hear the question (I had just tuned in), I heard the answer. Mother's response appeared to be addressing certain Protestant teachings which claim that those who don't have certain gifts of the Holy Spirit, such as speaking in tongues, are somehow lacking spiritually. [It is important to note that *most* Protestants do *not* teach this, and it is certainly not the teaching of our Church, or of the Orthodox Churches].

Mother Angelica's response highlighted the Catholic teaching that all the faithful who are confirmed receive *all* of the Holy Spirit. In other words, God the Holy Ghost gives Himself fully to each of the baptized in His sevenfold gifts. No one should be made to feel as if they are lacking the presence or grace of God in their life if they don't manifest certain charisms or gifts, such as speaking in tongues. If we read chapter 13 of 1 Corinthians, we see that charity is the charism of the Holy Spirit that matters most, not speaking in tongues, or other kinds of more extraordinary charisms.

This is the sense in which St. Paul begins his long letter to the Corinthians. In Christ and his Church, we have everything we need to become saints and get to heaven, "as [we] wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ, who will sustain [us] to the end" (vv. 7-8, RSV). Jesus offers us every means of grace to know and experience His love for the long haul.

Blessed Pope Paul VI, in his Apostolic Constitution *Divinae consortium naturae*, says that the sacrament of Confirmation "perpetuates the grace of Pentecost in the Church" (quoted in *Catechism of the Catholic Church* no. 1288). Accordingly, each baptized

person "sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit" [the official formula for imposing the Sacred Chrism] receives each of the seven gifts, and is equipped by Christ for the life of grace.

In this vein, Dr. Peter Kreeft, on p. 315 of his excellent book *Catholic Christianity*, says the following regarding Confirmation:

*The reason for the Sacrament of Confirmation is the same as the reason for Pentecost. Confirmation 'confirms', that is, 'firms up' or strengthens, the supernatural life within us that we received in Baptism; it strengthens us to be mature, adult witnesses for Christ...[it] prepares us for spiritual warfare, for an active mission.*

No baptized person is excluded from this enlistment. God provides the spiritual weaponry we need to be victorious in Christ.

To cultivate these gifts for victory in the spiritual life requires attentiveness and obedience to the directives of the Holy Spirit. The following Anglican Collect (one of my favorites growing up), frames the whole of the Christian life in just such a way:

*O God, forasmuch as without Thee we are not able to please Thee: mercifully grant, that Thy Holy Spirit may in all things direct and rule our hearts. Through Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee, in the unity of the same Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen."*

## LATIN MASS PROPERS: EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**INTROIT:** Ecclesiasticus 36:18. Give peace, O Lord, to them that patiently wait for Thee, that Thy prophets may be found faithful: hear the prayers of Thy people Israel. *Psalm 121: 1* I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: We shall go into the house of the Lord. *V.* Glory be to the Father...

**COLLECT:** In Thy tender mercy, direct our hearts, we beseech Thee, O Lord, because without Thee we are not able to please Thee. Through our Lord.

**EPISTLE:** I Corinthians 1:4-8 Brethren, I give thanks to my God always for you, for the grace of God that is given you in Christ Jesus, that in all things you are made rich in Him, in all utterance and in all knowledge, as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you, so that nothing is wanting to you in any grace, waiting for the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ. Who also will confirm you into the end without crime, in the day of the coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

**GRADUAL:** *Psalm 71: 1. 7.* I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: We shall go into the house of our Lord. *V.* Let peace be in thy strength, and abundance in thy towers. **ALLELUIA:** Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* The nations shall fear Thy name, O Lord: and all the kings of the earth Thy glory. Alleluia.

**GOSPEL:** Matthew 9:1-8 **At** that time, Jesus entering into a boat, passed over the water and came into His own city. And behold they brought Him one sick of the palsy lying in a bed; and Jesus seeing their faith, said to the man sick of the palsy: Be of good heart, son, thy sins are forgiven thee. And behold some of the scribes said within themselves: He blasphemeth. And Jesus seeing their thoughts said: Why do you think evil in your hearts? whether is it easier to say: Thy sins are forgiven thee; or to say: Arise and walk? But that you may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins (then said He to the man sick of the palsy): Arise, take up thy bed, and go into thy house. And he arose and went into the house. And the multitude seeing it, feared, and glorified God who had given such power to men.

**OFFERTORY:** Exodus 24: 4. 5. Moses consecrated an altar to the Lord, offering upon it holocausts, and sacrificing victims: he made an evening sacrifice to the Lord God for an odor of sweetness, in the sight of the children of Israel.

**SECRET** O God who, through the communion in this venerable sacrifice, dost make us partakers of the one supreme Godhead: grant, we beseech Thee, that having come to the knowledge of Thy truth, we may obtain it by worthy lives. Through our Lord.

### Preface of the Holy Trinity

**COMMUNION:** *Psalm 95:8-9* Bring up sacrifices, and come into His courts: adore ye the Lord in His holy court.

**POSTCOMMUNION** Nourished by Thy sacred gift, we return thanks unto Thee, O Lord; beseeching Thy mercy to make us worthy to partake of them. Through our Lord.




