
# ABOUT OUR PARISH

## Parish Mission Statement




“What then is a parish? It is the smallest section of the one universal flock which has been entrusted to Peter by the Lord.

## OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

### Pastor's Note

#### A MONTH OF "RESPECT FOR LIFE"

In the United States each year the Month of October is designated as the particular month of the year in which we ought, as Catholics, to focus on the "Life Issues". Our Christian Catholic faith and our supernatural view of things enable us to recognize human life as a great good, possessing an essential value which nothing can take away.

This essential value of human life applies to each *individual* human life as well as to humanity as a whole. Human life cannot be reduced or downgraded to its practical utility. There is no such thing as "*life unworthy of life*", as the advocates of euthanasia and sterilization of the disabled in the early 20th century claimed.

Each human being, possessing an immortal soul, is a unique, special creation of God and infinitely loved by Him. Every person should be helped to understand this about himself: you are a unique, special creation of God and infinitely loved by Him. You are not a "mistake". Your essential value does not depend on the circumstances of your origins. You do not lose your value by becoming a "burden" on others.

Yes, we come to this conclusion on the absolute value of each human life as a matter of Christian faith-belief. But that is nothing to apologize for! Its truth is still engraved in every heart, and if we are faithful in bearing witness to it in the "public square"—and do it in the manner of the charity of Christ—then others will recognize it too.

It was Pope John Paul II who framed the contemporary debate in terms of the "Culture of Life" versus the "Culture of Death". This is an inspired juxtaposition. We can easily be distracted in policy debates by the utilitarian arguments (e.g., having too many disabled

people in society is a drain on public resources), or the anti-human philosophical ideas which abound (e.g., in order to preserve the eco-system of the planet, the human presence on the earth must be drastically reduced).

Stewardship of the earth and the organization of society with a just allocation of goods are indeed part of the challenge in building up a Culture of Life, but their claims cannot be allowed to supersede the intrinsic value of each and every human life.

During this Month of October, both from the pulpit and in my Pastor's Note I will be emphasizing the "Life Issues". There is so much "Culture Smog" that it is easy for us to become numbed to what is at stake. The whole spectrum of the Life Issues is vast but I will enumerate some:

- The manipulation of human life at its origins.
- Abortion of unborn children.
- Disability.
- Euthanasia: the deliberate killing of the disabled and the mortally ill before they are naturally dying.
- The Primary Duty of keeping oneself alive.
- Suicide.
- Acceptance of natural death.

We come from God and we are going back to God over the course of this brief life's journey. Let us not fail to recognize the great dignity we have as special creations of God the Heavenly Father.

# SCRIPTURE STUDY

## SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY PROVERBS 8:22-24, 32-35

The Fathers of the Church interpret today's lesson from Proverbs as an image of Christ the Word, who "was in the beginning with God" (cf. Jn. 1:2, RSV). The text speaks of Our Lord's divine, pre-eternal existence with the Father. Unfortunately, the Arian heretics of the 4th century misinterpreted it as referring to a mere created existence of Christ before time, like the Angels, and not to a divine, and therefore, *uncreated* existence. This historical example of exegetical disagreement demonstrates why we as Catholics do not consider the Bible to be the sole authority in matters of faith or morals. We also need Sacred Tradition (cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church* nos. 81-82). Additionally, the Church's Magisterium is divinely instituted to render "an authentic interpretation of the Word of God," that is, an interpretation that allows us to know Christ authentically, and His revelation of the Father (cf. *Catechism* nos. 85-86).

In today's liturgy, the Church presents this passage from Proverbs to us in the context of a Marian feast, not a Christological one. In this case, it would appear that the passage refers to Our Lady's predestination, that is, her singular call to be God's choice instrument of grace in salvation history. In other words, the Old Testament prophesies look forward not only to Christ, but also to His Mother. One prominent example of this is the *protoevangelion*, or the "first Gospel" of Genesis 3:15, which foretells the decisive victory of the offspring of "the woman." Another familiar example of this kind of Old Testament prophecy about Our Lady is the virginal conception of Emmanuel in Isaiah 7:14. There is something perhaps more basic, however, that we can draw out of this passage from Proverbs, especially as it relates to this feast day.

In Old Testament Wisdom Literature, the virtue of Wisdom is often personified with feminine pronouns as a way of indicating its innate beauty and goodness. On the feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, the Church bids us interpret this passage in

such a way as to hear Our Lady herself calling us to holiness and virtue: "Now therefore, ye children, hear me: Blessed are they that keep my ways" (v. 32). Liturgically speaking, the feast day calls us to link "Mary's ways" here to her Rosary. In today's Collect (which is the same prayer we use to conclude every Rosary), we ask God that we may imitate the mysteries upon which we meditate in the recitation of the Rosary. In other words, we ask that we might grow in heavenly virtues, in imitation of Jesus and Mary. Such virtues are often specified as particular, sought-for intentions or "fruits" of each mystery, according to some methods of praying the Rosary. For example, when meditating on one of the sorrowful mysteries of Jesus' Passion, we might pray for the gift of humility.

St. Louis De Montfort catalogues such intentions in his classic work, *The Secret of the Rosary*, which is a short, inexpensive, and readily available book. Many other prayer books and manuals on the Rosary provide similar meditations and prayer intentions. One such book that stands out is a newly published volume by Fr. Donald H. Calloway, MIC, entitled *Champions of the Rosary: The History and Heroes of a Spiritual Weapon*. I highly recommend this book as a comprehensive overview of the Rosary's history, theology, and praxis. Make this month of October dedicated to the Holy Rosary fruitful, both in its recitation, as well as in a deepened study of its content and meaning. "He that shall find me, shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord" (Prov. 8:35).

## LATIN MASS PROPERS: OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

**INTROIT:** Let us all rejoice in the Lord, celebrating a festival-day in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, for whose solemn festival the Angels rejoice and give praise to the Son of God. *Psalm 44:2* My heart hath uttered a good word: I speak my works to the King V. Glory be to the Father...

**COLLECT:** O God, whose only-begotten Son by His Life and death and resurrection has won for us the rewards of eternal salvation, grant, we pray, that we who meditate on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise. Through our Lord.

**EPISTLE: Proverbs 8: 22-24, 32-35** The Lord possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything, from the beginning. I was set up from eternity, and of old, before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived. Now therefore, ye children, hear me: blessed are they that keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man that heareth me, and that watcheth daily at my gates; and waiteth at the posts of my doors. He that shall find me, shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.

**GRADUAL: Psalm 44:5, 11, 12** Because of truth, and meekness, and justice: and thy right hand shall conduct thee wonderfully. V. Hearken, O daughter, and see, and incline thine ear, for the King hath greatly desired thy beauty. **ALLELUIA:** Alleluia, alleluia. V. The solemn festival of the glorious Virgin Mary of the seed of Abraham, sprung from the tribe of Judah, of David's royal race. Alleluia.

**GOSPEL: Luke 1:26-38** At that time, the Angel Gabriel was sent from God into a city of Galilee, called Nazareth, to a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the House of David: and the virgin's name was Mary. And the angel being come in, said unto her: Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women. Who, having heard, was troubled at his saying and thought with herself what manner of salutation this should be. And the angel said to her: Fear not, Mary, for thou hast found grace with God. Behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb and shalt bring forth a Son: and thou shalt call His name Jesus. He shall be great and shall be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of David His Father: and He shall reign in the House of Jacob forever, and of His Kingdom there shall be no end. And Mary said to the angel: How shall this be done since I know not man? And the angel answering, said to her: The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee. And therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God. And behold thy cousin Elizabeth, she also hath conceived a son in her old age: and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren; because no word shall be impossible with God. And Mary said: Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word.

**OFFERTORY: Eccus. 24: 25; 39:17** In me is all grace of the way and of the truth; in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Like a rose planted on the rivers I have budded forth.

**SECRET** Make us worthy, O Lord, we beseech Thee, to offer Thee this sacrifice; and by means of the mysteries of the most holy Rosary may we so keep in mind the life, passion and glory of Thine only-begotten Son, that we may be made worthy of His promises. Who with Thee liveth.


