SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: THE ENGLISH MARTYRS MAY 7th, A.D. 2017

For this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Feast of the English Martyrs (May 4). This Feast is particular to the Catholic dioceses of England, as well as the Personal Ordinariates throughout the world. Below is the official ICEL translation of this Collect in the third typical edition of the *Roman Missal* (2010):

"Almighty God, who in our country raised up martyrs from every walk of life to vindicate the authority of Your Church in teaching and worship, grant through their intercession, we pray, that all our people may be gathered once again to celebrate the same sacraments under the one Shepherd, Jesus Christ Your Son. Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen."

Broken down into its five-part structure, the Collect looks like this:

1. Almighty God (address),
2. who in our country [i.e., England] raised up martyrs from every walk of life to vindicate the authority of Your Church in teaching and worship (ascription),
3. grant, we pray, that all our people may be gathered once again to celebrate the same sacraments under the one Shepherd, Jesus Christ Your Son (petition),
4. through their intercession (motive for the petition),
5. [Christ], who lives and reigns, etc. (concluding doxological formula).

Re-fashioned into a syllogism, we may interpret the Collect like this:

- A. If God raised up the English Martyrs during a terrible time of schism to witness to the divine origin of His Church's rule of faith and sacramental discipline,
- B. And if these martyrs intercede for us,
- C. Then God will heal the schisms in His Church, bringing His flock to the fullness of visible sacramental communion willed by Christ, the Good Shepherd.

The English Martyrs are those many Catholics (clerical, lay, and monastic), who were tortured and executed during the time of the English Reformation in the 16th-17th centuries. Bl. Paul VI authorized a collective commemoration of forty of them on May 4, the date on which some of them were martyred [there are more than 300 martyrs in total].

After Henry VIII broke from the fullness of Catholic communion, England progressively became more Protestant (sometimes precipitously, other times more gradually). Those who held onto the "old religion" were accused of treason, because they refused to acknowledge the monarch as the "Supreme Head of the Church in England," with all that that entailed. They were unshakably committed to the divine authority and primacy of the Pope of Rome as the Successor to St. Peter, and supreme head of the Church. For the English Martyrs, fidelity to the Holy Father was non-negotiable.

Joined to this fidelity to Peter was their fidelity to the Mass, which they celebrated secretly in homes, risking death if they were caught. Their witness raises the notion of "active participation" in the Mass to a nobler plane. Having adored and received Our Lord, these ordinary Catholics had the distinct (albeit un-sought-for) possibility of participating in His Passion by the shedding of their blood!

While the Reformation brought great devastation to England, many graces survived in Anglicanism, most fundamentally, the Sacrament of Baptism. From this unity in Christ springs the hope that the schism will be healed, resulting in full sacramental communion (cf. Second Vatican Council, *Lumen Gentium* no. 8). Our Collect prays for the fulfillment of this hope.

Our Collect also leads us to trust in the merits of the martyrs. Bl. John Henry Newman attributed to the English Martyrs many graces for the Church in his day (cf. *The Second Spring*). May these saints' prayers contribute to the fulfillment of Christ's High Priestly Prayer in our times (cf. Jn. 17). May we, like them, always be faithful to the Holy Father and to the Mass. LATIN MASS PROPERS: THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

INTROIT: Psalm 65: 1-2 Shout with joy to God, all the earth, alleluia: sing ye, a psalm to His name, alleluia: give glory to His praise, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm 65: 3* Say unto God: How terrible are Thy works, O Lord! In the multitude of Thy strength Thy enemies shall lie to Thee. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, who dost show to them that are in error the light of Thy truth, that they may return into the way of righteousness; grant to all those who profess themselves Christians to reject those things which are contrary to that name, and follow such things as are agreeable to the same. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: 1 Peter 2: 11-19 Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, to refrain yourselves from carnal desires, which war against the soul, having your conversation good among the Gentiles: that whereas they speak against you as evildoers, they may, by the good works which they shall behold in you, glorify God in the day of visitation. Be ye subject therefore to every human creature for God's sake: whether it be to the king as excelling, or to governors as sent by him for the punishment of evildoers and for the praise of the good: for so is the will of God, that by doing well you may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men: as free, and not as making liberty a cloak for malice, but as the servants of God. Honour all men: love the brotherhood: fear God: honour the king. Servants, be subject to your masters with all fear, not only to the good and gentle, but also to the forward. For this is thankworthy before God: in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Amen, amen, I say to you, that you shall lament and weep, but the world shall rejoice: and you shall be made sorrowful, but your sorrow shall be turned into joy. A woman, when she is in labour, hath sorrow, because her hour is come; but when she hath brought forth the child, she remembereth no more the anguish, for joy that a man is born into the world. So also you now indeed have sorrow: but I will see you again and your heart shall rejoice: and your joy no man shall take from you.
