SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD MAY 21st, A.D. 2017

For this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord (celebrated this year on Thursday, May 25). This Collect is the same for both forms of the Mass. Below is the official ICEL translation of this Collect in the third typical edition of the *Roman Missal* (2010):

"Grant, we pray, almighty God, that we, who believe that your Only Begotten Son, our Redeemer, ascended this day to the heavens, may in spirit dwell already in heavenly realms. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen."

Broken down into its five-part structure, the Collect looks like this:

1. Almighty God (address),
2. whose Only Begotten Son, our Redeemer, ascended this day to the heavens (ascription),
3. grant that we may dwell in spirit already in heavenly realms (petition),
4. we, who profess our faith in the Ascension (motive),
5. [Christ] who lives and reigns, etc. (concluding doxological formula).

Re-fashioned into a syllogism, we may interpret the Collect like this:

- A) If God's Only Begotten Son, our Redeemer, ascended this day into heaven,
- B) And if we entrust ourselves by faith to this part of our Redeemer's plan of salvation,
- C) Then God will enable us to begin to experience the life of heaven even now on earth.

The significance of Jesus' Ascension into heaven is not often stressed enough in Catholic life apart from the recitation of the glorious mysteries of the Rosary. Unfortunately, attendance at this holy day of obligation is sometimes light, as some Catholics consider it a strain on their busy Spring schedules. People will often show up in droves on Ash

Wednesday for ashes (incidentally, *not* a holy day of obligation), but they might fail to adore and receive the Risen Christ in Holy Communion on Ascension. This is quite sad, since ashes merely signify the mortality of this present life, whereas Ascension Day leads us to focus on how we experience "*already*," in the words of the Collect, the joyful and vivid hope of eternal life, that is, *real* life.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church provides a succinct treatment of the Ascension in nos. 659-667. In summary, it is necessary for Christ to have ascended into heaven in order for *us* to come to heaven also. He has taken his Sacred Humanity, His risen and glorified Body, *into the very heart of the Godhead*, where He lives and reigns with the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit forever. The concluding doxological formula of every Collect is not incidental, but a dogmatic affirmation of the Trinity, the Ascension of Christ, and of Jesus' high priesthood before the Father (cf. Chupungco, *The Prayers of the New Missal*, 12-13). The Church enters mystically into this heavenly reality at every Mass. Every Collect in the Roman Rite, in its formulaic conclusion, affirms what is of the very essence of our worship as Catholic Christians.

We may argue that Ascension Day is more significant than Christmas (!), because it is the completion of the drama of the Incarnation. "*God became man, so that man might become god*," said St. Athanasius famously. With Christ reigning bodily in heaven, human nature can now begin to share in His glorified life in heaven through the Sacraments. Prior to the Ascension, this was not possible (the mysterious cases of Enoch and Elijah notwithstanding). Through Baptism, and especially in Holy Communion, we are truly united to the Sacred Humanity of the Risen Lord in heaven. At Mass, we already dwell with Him in spirit in heavenly realms. Deo gratias!

LATIN MASS PROPERS: FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

INTROIT: *Isaias 48: 20* Declare it with the voice of joy, and make it known, alleluia: declare it even to the ends of the earth: The Lord hath delivered His people, alleluia, alleluia. *Psalms 65: 1-2* Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: give glory to His praise. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, from whom all good things do proceed, grant unto Thy humble servants, that by Thy holy inspiration, we may think those things that are right, and under Thy guidance may perform the same. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: *James 1: 22-27* Dearly beloved, be ye doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves. For if a man be a hearer of the word and not a doer, he shall be compared to a man beholding his own countenance in a glass: for he beheld himself and went his way, and presently forgot what manner of man he was. But he that hath looked into perfect law of liberty and hath continued therein, not becoming a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work: this man shall be blessed in his deed. And if any man think himself to be religious, not bridling his tongue but deceiving his own heart, this man's religion is vain. Religion pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: To visit the fatherless and widows in their tribulation and to keep one's self unspotted from this world.

FIRST ALLELUIA Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* Christ is risen, and hath shone upon us, whom He redeemed with His blood. **SECOND ALLELUIA:** *John 16: 28* Alleluia. *V.* I came forth from the Father, and am come into the world: again I leave the world and I go to the Father. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *John 16: 23-30* **At** that time Jesus saith to His disciples: Amen, amen, I say to you: If you ask the Father any thing in My name, He will give it you. Hitherto you have not asked any thing in My name: Ask, and you shall receive, that your joy may be full. These things I have spoken to you in proverbs. The hour cometh when I will no more speak to you in proverbs, but will show you plainly of the Father. In that day you shall ask in My name: and I say not to you that I will ask the Father for you: for the Father Himself loveth you, because you have loved Me and have believed that I came out from God. I came forth from the Father and am come into the world: again I leave the world and I go to the Father. His disciples say to Him: Behold now Thou speakest plainly and speakest no proverb. Now we know that Thou knowest all things and Thou needest not that any man should ask Thee: by this we believe that Thou camest forth from God.

OFFERTORY: *Psalms 65: 8-9, 20* O bless the Lord our God, ye peoples, and make the voice of His praise to be heard: who hath set my soul to live, and hath not suffered my feet to be moved. Blessed be the Lord, who hath not turned away my prayer, nor His mercy from me, alleluia.

SECRET Receive, O Lord, the prayers and sacrifices of the faithful, that by these offices of loving devotion we may attain to heavenly glory. Through our Lord.




