Pastor's Note



SAINT PATRICK AND THE “PILGRIMAGE SEASON”

During this month of June our lay Pastoral Associate David Allen is conducting a

weekly Thursday night book-study on Saint Patrick Apostle of Ireland (*St. Patrick: His Confession and Other Works*, edited by Fr. Neil Xavier O'Donoghue—details in page 6 of this week's Bulletin). A St. Patrick's study has a particular resonance for this time of year since the summer months are the Pilgrimage Season for two important holy places associated with St. Patrick's 5th Century Mission: Croagh Patrick in County Mayo (the date of the Annual Pilgrimage from time immemorial is the last Sunday in July) and Lough Derg, “St. Patrick's Purgatory”, where the Pilgrimage Season begins on June 1st and ends on August 15th.

Croagh Patrick is a mountain on Ireland's Atlantic coast in County Mayo. Known as the “Sinai of Ireland” it rises to a height of 2,510 ft. According to the traditional accounts St. Patrick was careworn and fatigued when he arrived at this remote part of the island in A.D. 441, the 8th year of his Mission to Ireland.

Desiring to retire in solitude in order to refresh his soul Patrick climbed this forbidding mountain on the Saturday before Ash Wednesday and there he spent the days of Lent “chastising his body with fasts, pouring out his heart to God, and entreating Him with prolonged importunity and with tears that the Faith might never fail in the land of Erin.” Since this same mountain was considered a holy place by the heathen druids Patrick was assaulted by attacks of sorcery during his long vigil.

While he was on the Mountain, Patrick received word that a new Pope had been elected in Rome.

That Pope was Leo I—*Leo Magnus*. Patrick sent one of his disciples named Munis to go to Rome with Patrick's homage to the Vicar of Christ, to render an account of the Mission so far in Ireland, and to beg the new Pope's blessing for this infant church. Munis returned with Leo's blessing and sacred relics for the altars which Patrick was erecting everywhere throughout the island. Thus the first tribute of loyalty from the Irish Church to the Chair of Peter was sent from the summit of Croagh Patrick.

On Holy Saturday A.D. 441 atop the mountain “Patrick with outstretched hands solemnly blessed the men of Erin that they might cling to the Faith, and the land of Erin that no poisonous reptile might infest it. Then refreshed with Divine grace and comforted with the assurance that his labors would fructify forever, he came down from the mountain to celebrate Easter with the little flock he had left at Aughagower.” Thereafter pilgrims began to do penance on this same mountain, now named for Patrick, making it one of the oldest pilgrimage sites in Europe.

St. Patrick's Purgatory at Lough Derg is found well inland in County Donegal near the border with County Fermanagh. This too is an ancient pilgrimage site associated with Patrick's missionary journeys.

Pilgrims to Lough Derg undergo a strenuous 3-day penitential exercise: barefoot, fasting, and without sleep.

“The three-day retreat from the world is a sharing in the paschal mystery of Christ who died to the world and rose again on the third day. The crossing by water is a reminder of the Baptism ceremony which is the beginning of Christian life. Bare feet for Moses and Joshua in the Old Testament were a sign of reverence and respect for the presence of God. The gathering of pilgrims for Mass is a real experience of belonging to the Church through which we work out our salvation.” (Joseph Duffy, *Lough Derg Guide*. A.D. 1980)

SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: JUNE 4th, A.D. 2017 PENTECOST

For this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Feast of Pentecost (MR 1962). This Collect is also found in the MR 1970 as the Collect for a Votive Mass to the Holy Spirit. Below is the unofficial translation provided in the Angelus Press edition of the *Roman Catholic Daily Missal*:

"O God, Who this day hast taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Ghost, grant that by the gift of the same Spirit we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in His consolation. Through our Lord Jesus Christ Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the same Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen."

Broken down into its five-part structure, the Collect looks like this:

1. O God (address),
2. Who this day hast taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Ghost (ascription),
3. grant that we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in His consolation (petition),
4. by the gift of the same Spirit (motive for the petition),
5. Through the same our Lord, etc. (concluding doxological formula).

Re-fashioned into a syllogism, we may interpret the Collect like this:

- A) If God infused the light of faith into the disciples' hearts by the descent of the Holy Spirit,
- B) And if the same Holy Spirit bestows His gifts on us,
- C) Then we may hope to receive the gift of wisdom in particular, and take joy in the Holy Spirit's comfort, just as Jesus promised on Holy Thursday.

Scripture and Tradition often compare divine revelation to light. God illuminates the soul by the descent of the Holy Spirit through the preaching of the Gospel and Baptism. This accords with what we hear in St. John's Gospel. On Holy Thursday, in particular, Jesus promised that the Holy Spirit

would bear witness to Him, and bring the light of faith and consolation to human hearts (cf. Jn. 14:15-26, 15:26, 16:7-15).

In our petition, we ask God to continue fulfilling this promise, and to renew the gifts of Pentecost in our day and time. Specifically, we ask for the gift of Wisdom, which is one of the traditional seven gifts of the Holy Spirit first enumerated in Isaiah 11 (this passage describes the Messiah, who is endowed with the gifts of the Spirit). In the Old Testament, Wisdom is the cherished virtue that enables the righteous to know God, and to apply the truths of His law to the particularities of everyday life. For the prophets, the wise man or woman manifests God's presence on earth by his or her fidelity to the covenant. None of this changes in the New Testament. In fact, the faithful's obligation to a life of wisdom is only enhanced.

Wisdom has as its object the *truths* of the faith, and ultimately through them, *God Himself*. Through the Holy Spirit's gift of wisdom, infused at Baptism and Confirmation, the faithful may penetrate the beauty and depths of divine revelation, and thereby come to know and love God more truly and fully. God *wants* to be known and loved by us, and to that end, He has given us everything we need. Perhaps the question which our Collect presents to us, then, is how we may strengthen and improve our prayer life, the study of Scripture, and spiritual reading. Having asked God for the gift of Wisdom, let us exercise it!

In the petition, we also ask God that we may rejoice in the consolation of the Holy Spirit. According to St. Paul, joy is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit (cf. Gal. 5:22). Joy is often elusive in this world of suffering and sin. Nevertheless, if we treasure the gift of sanctifying grace, that is, the gift of God's own divine life inside of us, we may take joy in the comfort of His love for us (cf. Dolan, *To Whom Shall we Go?*, pp. 23-25). Jesus promised this joy to His disciples, a joy which none may take away, for it is the joy of His risen Presence (cf. Jn. 16:22).





LATIN MASS PROPERS: PENTECOST SUNDAY

INTROIT: Wisdom 1: 7 The Spirit of the Lord hath filled the whole world, alleluia; and that which containeth all things hath knowledge of the voice, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm 67:2* Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered: and let them that hate Him flee from before His face. **COLLECT** O God, who on this day didst teach the hearts of Thy faithful people by the light of Thy Holy Spirit, grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgment in all things and ever rejoice in His holy consolation. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Acts of the Apostles 2: 1-11 When the days of the Pentecost were accomplished, they were all together in one place; and suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a mighty wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues as it were of fire, and it sat upon every one of them; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they began to speak with divers tongues, according as the Holy Ghost gave them to speak. Now there were dwelling at Jerusalem Jews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven. And when this was noised abroad, the multitude came together, and were confounded in mind, because that every man heard them speak in his own tongue. And they were all amazed, and wondered, saying: Behold, are not all these that speak Galileans? And how have we heard every man our own tongue wherein we were born? Parthians and Medes, and Elamites, and inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia, and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the parts of Libya about Cyrene, and strangers of Rome, Jews also, and Proselytes, Cretes, and Arabians: we have heard them speak in our own tongues the wonderful works of God. **PASCHAL ALLELUIA:** (*Psalm 103:30*) Alleluia, alleluia. V. Send for Thy Spirit, and they shall be created, and Thou shalt renew the face of the earth. (*All kneel*) Alleluia. V. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful: and kindle in them the fire of Thy love.

Alleluia. **GOSPEL: John 14: 23-31** **At** that time Jesus said to His disciples: If any one love Me, he will keep My word, and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and will make Our abode in him: he that loveth Me not keepeth not My words. 


