





## JUNE IS THE MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

### Pastor's Note



### AD MULTOS ANNOS, FATHER STEPHEN

Today we welcome our former parish deacon Stephen Wolfe back to Mary Immaculate of Lourdes as a newly ordained priest. As a transitional deacon, Father Stephen served our parish faithfully since September of last year, even while he was still completing his theological studies at Boston College. I thank him on behalf of the whole parish for his dedication to the ministry. He served in the liturgical role as deacon at the Mass, principally at the 9 AM and 10:30 AM Masses each Sunday morning and on Holy Days. He preached, he baptized, and he became very much a part of our parish life just in these few months. I personally enjoyed very much his presence and his fellowship in the ministry. He will be much missed!

What a perfect day for us to celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving for a newly ordained priest from our parish—this day of Corpus Christi which gives itself over to rejoicing for the gift of the Eucharist. The link between the priesthood-of-the-ordained and the “Mystery of Faith” of the Holy Eucharist is made especially clear to us. Christianity depends on its priests for bringing the Eucharistic Jesus into the world.

Over the last five years we have had occasion to celebrate five newly-ordained Masses of Thanksgiving here at Mary Immaculate of Lourdes, three of them for our Jesuit deacon-interns from Boston College—Fr. William Blazek, S.J. (2012), Fr. Juan Carlos Rivera Castro, S.J. (2016), and Fr. Stephen Wolfe, S.J. (2017). Last year we celebrated two other Masses of Thanksgiving for men who had belonged to our parish: Fr. Stephen LeBlanc for

the Archdiocese of Boston and Fr. Jon Tveit for the Archdiocese of New York. This is, to say the least, a great blessing for any parish to experience. It ought to stimulate us to pray God to send us good priests and to support those men who have taken what is, nowadays, a far-from-easy step to present themselves for seminary formation.

May the good God give Father Stephen Wolfe many years in the ordained ministry. May his faithful service as a priest reflect his Jesuit order’s Ignatian motto: *Ad maiorem Dei gloriam (to the greater glory of God)*. Thank you, Father Stephen. *Ad multos annos!*

### “DISCIPLES IN MISSION” AND MARY IMMACULATE OF LOURDES PARISH:

I have been asked by the Archdiocese to make the following announcement this Sunday regarding the place of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes in the strategic plan for parish re-organization know by its title “*Disciples in Mission*”. For the past six years the Archdiocese of Boston has been undergoing a dramatic transformation by having parishes combined into a parish-collaborative, where the parishes remain distinct but are served by one Pastoral Team. It has been decided to announce now what the final configuration of all of the remaining parishes will be over the next six years until 2023 when the whole project is expected to be complete. This is the so-called “Road Map”.

Although the strategic plan called for the reconfiguration of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes with Corpus Christi/St. Bernard parish in West Newton, I am pleased to be able to announce today that Cardinal Sean has revised that plan. The final decision for the “Road Map” is this: that Mary Immaculate of Lourdes parish will officially be designated as a “stand-alone” parish at the end of Phase 11 in 2023, and will thus remain on its own. I will speak more about this next Sunday.

# SCRIPTURE STUDY

## THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: JUNE 18th, A.D. 2017 CORPUS CHRISTI

For this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Feast of *Corpus Christi*, which is identical in both forms of the Mass, and is also used at Benediction. Below is the official ICEL translation of this Collect in the third typical edition of the *Roman Missal* (2010):

*"O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption. Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen."*

Broken down into its five-part structure, the Collect looks like this:

1. O God (addressed to Jesus),
2. who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of Your Passion (ascription),
3. grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of Your Body and Blood (petition),
4. that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of Your redemption (hoped-for outcome),
5. Who live and reign, etc. (concluding doxological formula).

Re-fashioned into a syllogism, we may interpret the Collect like this:

- A) If Jesus gives us his very self in the Eucharist as a perpetual commemoration of his Passion,
- B) And if we adore Him in the Blessed Sacrament with living faith and fervent charity.
- C) Then the effects of His Passion will deepen in us as we receive Him in Holy Communion.

In the petition (part 3 above), we ask Christ that we may always revere His Body and Blood in the Eucharist, so that we may experience more fully the fruits of the redemption He wrought on our behalf (part 4, the hoped-for outcome). Living faith in Christ and sincere love for Him (being in the state of grace) are constitutive elements of worthy participation in Mass, worthy reception of Holy

Communion, and consequent fruitfulness in the life of grace. What are the fruits of a worthy reception of Holy Communion? The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* lists six in nos. 1391-1398. What follows are direct quotations with my summary of these paragraphs in brackets.

1. *"Holy Communion augments our union with Christ."* [Nothing is more important than union with Jesus on earth, for union with Him is the life of heaven, our destiny as baptized Christians.]
2. *"Holy Communion separates us from sin"...* [i.e., it] *"wipes away venial sins."*
3. *"[Holy Communion]...preserves us from future mortal sins."* [We need sacramental grace to help us remain in the state of grace.]
4. *"The unity of the Mystical Body: the Eucharist makes the Church."* [Union with Jesus' Body automatically renders us united to all the baptized who partake of Him, forming the Body of the Church of which St. Paul speaks so eloquently in 1 Cor. 12, among other passages.]
5. *"The Eucharist commits us to the poor."* [Union with Jesus' Passion should lead us to a deeper compassion and care for the sufferings of others with and for whom Jesus suffers in solidarity (cf. Mt. 25:31-46).]
6. *"The Eucharist and the unity of Christians."* [Linked to no. 4, our participation in the Eucharist should lead us to desire and foster authentic unity with our separated brethren.]

In some ways, this list acts both as an examination of conscience and a litany. Let us beseech the Lord for an abundance of these fruits. Let us commit ourselves to being good stewards of sacramental grace.






