Pastor's Note



FATHER SALAKO'S MISSION APPEAL

This Sunday Father Desiré Salako is preaching a Mission Appeal at all of our parish Masses on behalf of the S.M.A. Benin-Niger Province of which he is presently the Father Provincial.

Three summers ago, when Fr. Salako first came to our parish, he was the pastor of St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception Parish in Sennequellie, northern Liberia. This was a territory in the epicenter of the Ebola epidemic of 2015 and he, as pastor, had risked his own life to be with the people and to try to help those stricken with the disease.

Last summer while he was with us he was appointed Father Provincial of a new province of his missionary congregation the S.M.A. (*Société des Missions Africaines*, the Society of the African Missions.) The territory of the new Province is in the West African countries of Benin and Niger, but he is also responsible for the missionary priests who belong to his Province but are stationed in posts in other African countries, included the parish in Liberia where he was formerly pastor.

The heart of Fr. Salako's missionary work is the work of "primary evangelization"—bringing the preaching of the Gospel to places in Africa which have not yet received it and to plant there the seeds for a new, indigenous Catholic Church as a part of the one Catholic Church of Jesus Christ.

The missionaries must bring with them the means to support themselves and also to offer

help to the people whom they find often in situations of extreme need. The Corporal Works of Mercy as well as what else goes under the name of social work are important and necessary components of their underlying spiritual mission: the establishment of mission schools, for example. Also, in Niger, the S.M.A. Fathers have a mission within the mission to help those migrants who end up stranded in this poorest of the poor country, often victimized by the smuggler rings who had promised to bring them to Europe but stole all their money instead.

Within Fr. Salako's Province the Missionaries are on the front-line of the Islamic jihad which has brought such violence to North Africa in recent years. (The S.M.A. Missions, together with all other Christians, were destroyed by jihadist mob-violence in 2015.) They also have to contend with the overwhelming forces of nature—prolonged drought—and underdevelopment of the countries (lack of good roads).

In addition to "primary evangelization", Fr. Salako and the S.M.A. Fathers are working towards the upbuilding of the Catholic Church where it is already established in Africa. Their goal is to see a Church in Africa which is able to support itself and to support its missions from the resources of African Catholic parishes. Right now they still need the fraternal help of Catholics in other parts of the world. A important project underway at present in the Benin-Niger Province is the building of a seminary for the education of their future priests.

Fr. Salako has been able to give us a very personal testimony of what life is like in the Church of Africa. Through today's Mission Appeal we have an opportunity to be of real assistance to these good works by a sacrificial gift, given for the love of God and for the sake of the spread of the Gospel.

SCRIPTURE STUDY

THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: AUGUST 27th, 2017 SAINT AUGUSTINE

For this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Feast of St. Augustine (MR '62) celebrated on August 28. Below is the translation of this Collect in the Baronius Press edition of the *Roman Catholic Daily Missal*:

"Give heed, O almighty God, to our humble prayers, and since Thou givest us confident assurance in Thy loving kindness, deign to grant us, through the intercession of blessed Augustine, Thy Confessor and Bishop, the effect of Thy wonted mercy. Through our Lord, etc. Amen."

Broken down into its five-part structure, the Collect looks like this:

1. O almighty God (address),
2. N/A n/a (no ascription clause following the address),
3. Give heed to our humble prayers and deign to grant us the effect of Thy wonted mercy (dual petition),
4. Since Thou givest us confident assurance in Thy loving kindness (first motive clause which functions secondarily as an ascription of God), through the intercession of blessed Augustine, Thy Confessor and Bishop (second motive),
5. Through our Lord, etc. (concluding doxological formula).

Re-fashioned into a syllogism, we may interpret the Collect like this:

- A) If God assures us of His loving kindness through His mercy shown to St. Augustine,
- B) And if St. Augustine himself prays for us,
- C) Then God will hear our prayers and show us how inclined He truly is to show us His mercy.

The first motive clause for today's Collect evoke St. Augustine's autobiography, the *Confessions*. His circuitous life-story shows us how tender God is with the wayward. If anyone is struggling to understand or accept the doctrine of the faith, feeling guilty for sin, or needing encouragement to

approach the Sacramental life of the Church, St. Augustine is a trustworthy patron. He spent many years in grave sin and intellectual darkness before being baptized and accepting the Catholic faith. St. Augustine's conversion manifests how much God is *inclined* to show mercy to sinners and to those who seek Him sincerely with their whole heart and mind.

Oftentimes, the devil tempts us to doubt God's mercy. Our Collect today has an important word, however, that can help us if we are experiencing such doubt or despair: it says that God's mercy is *consuetae*, or "wonted," as we see in the translation above. Another way of saying this is that God's mercy is "customary," or usual. Mercy is His primary inclination, His normal way of doing things, His *modus operandi*. As one classic Anglican prayer of my youth puts it, "[His] property is always to have mercy" when He is approached with sincere repentance. Our Collect spurs us on to trust in God's forgiveness, and to believe firmly in the Sacramental grace He gives each of us to become a saint. This truth is at the heart of St. Augustine's *Confessions*.

The second motive clause of our Collect is found in the Collects of many other saints days: "*through the intercession of...[saint of the day]*." The Church is always drawing upon the graces of her saints' prayers. The Third Eucharistic Prayer in the MR 1970 sums it up well: "*...and with all the Saints, on whose constant intercession in your presence we rely for unfailing help.*" The Saints strengthen and protect the Church on earth by their prayers and specific interventions in the lives of individuals, families, and communities. Today, we rely on St. Augustine's "constant intercession" before God so that we may experience the "unfailing help" of His mercy, as well as His grace to conquer vice and build up virtue for eternal life.



LATIN MASS PROPERS: TWELFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 69:2-3. O GOD, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me: let mine enemies be confounded and ashamed, who seek my soul. *Ps. ibid.* 4. Let them be turned backward and blush for shame, who desire evils to me. *V.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — O God, come to my assistance ...

COLLECT O ALMIGHTY and merciful God, of whose gift it cometh that Thy faithful do unto Thee worthy and laudable service: grant us, we beseech Thee, that we may run without stumbling towards the attainment of Thy promises. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the Second Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians, 3. 4-9. **BRETHREN:** Such confidence we have through Christ towards God. Not that we are sufficient to think anything of ourselves, as of ourselves: but our sufficiency is from God. Who also hath made us fit ministers of the new testament, not in the letter, but in the spirit: for the letter killeth, but the spirit quickeneth. Now if the ministration of death, engraven with letters upon stones, was glorious, so that the children of Israel could not steadfastly behold the face of Moses, for the glory of his countenance; which is made void: how shall not the ministration of the Spirit be rather in glory? For if the ministration of condemnation be glory, much more the ministration of justice aboundeth in glory.

GRADUAL: Psalm 33:2-3. I WILL bless the Lord at all times; His praise shall ever be in my mouth. In the Lord shall my soul be praised: let the meek hear, and rejoice. **ALLELUIA:** Psalm 87:2. Alleluia, Alleluia. O Lord, the God of my salvation, I have cried in the day and in the night before Thee. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Luke, 10. 23-37. **AT THAT TIME,** Jesus said to His disciples: Blessed are the eyes that see the things which you see. For I say to you, that many prophets and kings have desired to see the things that you see, and have not seen them; and to hear the things that you hear, and have not heard them. And behold a certain lawyer stood up, tempting Him, and saying: Master, what must I do to possess eternal life? But He said to him: What is written in the law? how readest thou? He answering, said: Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbor as thyself. And He said to him: Thou hast answered rightly: this do, and thou shalt live. But he, wishing to justify himself, said to Jesus: And who is my neighbor? And Jesus answering, said: A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among robbers, who also stripped him, and having wounded him went away, leaving him half dead. And it chanced that a certain priest went down the same way, and seeing him, passed by. In like manner also a Levite, when he was near the place and saw him, passed by. But a certain Samaritan being on his journey, came near him, and seeing him, was moved with compassion, and going up to him, bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine; and setting him upon his own beast, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. And the next day he took out two pence, and gave to the host, and said: Take care of him, and whatsoever thou shalt spend over and above, I, at my return, will repay thee. Which of these three, in thine opinion, was neighbor to him that fell among robbers? But he said: He that showed mercy to him. And Jesus said to him: Go and do thou in like manner.

OFFERTORY: Exodus 32: 11. 13. 14. **MOSES** prayed in the sight of the Lord his God, and said: Why, O Lord, is Thine indignation enkindled against Thy people? Let the anger of Thy mind cease; remember Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, to whom Thou didst swear to give a land flowing with milk and honey. And the Lord was appeased from doing the evil which He had spoken of doing against his people.

SECRET: GRACIOUSLY look upon the offerings, we beseech Thee, O Lord, which we present upon Thine altar: that while they obtain pardon for us, they may give honor to Thy name. Through our Lord ...

COMMUNION: Psalm 103: 13. 14-15 **THE** earth shall be filled with the fruit of Thy works, O Lord, that Thou mayest bring bread out of the earth, and that wine may cheer the heart of man; that he may make the face cheerful with oil; and that bread may strengthen man's heart.

POSTCOMMUNION: MAY the holy reception of this Mystery quicken us, we beseech Thee, O Lord: and may it win for us both pardon and protection. Through our Lord ...






