## SCRIPTURE STUDY

### THE COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL: FEBRUARY 4th, 2018 THE FEAST OF ST. BLAISE

For this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for the Feast of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, celebrated on both calendars on February 3rd. The MR '70 contains a newly composed prayer for this day, whereas the MR '62 uses one from a general Mass formulary (a "common") for a Martyr Bishop. Below is the official ICEL translation of the new Collect in the third typical edition of the Roman Missal (2010):

*"Hear, O Lord, the supplications Your people make under the patronage of the Martyr Saint Blaise, and grant that they may rejoice in peace in this present life, and find help for life eternal. Through our Lord, etc. Amen."*

Every year, on or around St. Blaise's feast day, many Catholics receive the traditional blessing of throats. This blessing involves a prayer for the saint's intercession with the placing of a pair of crossed candlesticks on one's scapular bones (thus, encompassing one's throat). It recalls a miracle in which St. Blaise prayed for a boy who was choking on a fish bone and was in danger of death. Having been prayed for by the holy bishop, the boy was able to cough up the lodged fish bone and recovered.

Our invocation of the saints leads us to recognize our utter dependence upon God's grace for all things, including his help against moral and physical evil. Given the intensity of this flu season, this blessing is most auspicious. When we speak of the intercession of the saints, such as St. Blaise, we are led to consider what the Church teaches about "actual graces." These are specific "interventions" which bestow spiritual blessings that strengthen the state of sanctifying grace, that is, our friendship with God and the presence of His divine life in our souls (cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church* nos. 1996-2000). In addition, the Church also speaks of "special graces"

or "charisms," which, like actual graces, are "oriented toward sanctifying grace" (cf. *Catechism* no. 2003). Graces of healing or of protection from "ailments of the throat," as the text of the throat blessing goes, fall under this category (the throat blessing also envisions actual graces against other moral evils).

Our Collect under consideration today envisions actual graces in connection with St. Blaise's intercession which are of a strictly spiritual quality: we hope to (1) "rejoice in peace in this present life" and (2) "find help for life eternal." In other words, the motive clause invoking St. Blaise's patronage is constitutive to the granting of these two forms of actual grace which will strengthen us in the state of sanctifying grace.

In the first item, the Collect recalls St. Paul's words in Colossians 3:15: "let the peace of Christ rejoice in your hearts" (Douai-Rheims, emphasis mine). This peace that "rejoices" in our hearts refers to the indwelling presence of sanctifying grace, our union with God, which can bring us deep joy, even during moments of great suffering. What the Collect is asking for, then, is the actual grace that will enable us to rejoice more fully in our friendship with God, in short, the ability to cherish sanctifying grace more deeply. The saints, especially martyrs like St. Blaise, continually cherished their friendship with God, and they pray for us to live this way, too.

In the second item, the Collect asks for the actual grace of St. Blaise's patronage for entering heaven. In this way, the Church envisions the saint's prayers as an actual grace that will help to *keep us* in the state of sanctifying grace, so that we may enter heaven.

Friendship with God is not "once and done," like some Christians believe. We must constantly strive to grow in God's grace, and we need the saints to help us to do just that, especially in navigating the more difficult trials of life.

## LATIN MASS PROPERS: SEXAGESIMA SUNDAY

**INTROIT:** *Psalm 43. 23-26, 2* Arise, why sleepest Thou, O Lord? arise, and cast us not off to the end. Why turnest Thou Thy face away, and forgettest our trouble? our belly hath cleaved to the earth: arise, O Lord, help us and deliver us. *Psalm.* We have heard, O God, with our ears: our fathers have declared to us. *℟.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — Arise ...

**COLLECT:** O God, who seest that we put not our trust in any thing that we do: mercifully grant, that by the protection of the Doctor of the Gentiles we may be defended against all adversities. Through our Lord ...

**EPISTLE:** From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians, (II) 11. 19-33; 12. 1-9 Brethren: You gladly suffer the foolish: whereas yourselves are wise. For you suffer if a man bring you into bondage, if a man devour you, if a man take from you, if a man be lifted up, if a man strike you on the face. I speak according to dishonor, as if we had been weak in this part. Wherein if any man dare (I speak foolishly), I dare also. They are Hebrews, so am I. They are Israelites, so am I. They are the seed of Abraham, so am I. They are the ministers of Christ (I speak as one less wise), I am more: in many more labors, in prisons more frequently, in stripes above measure, in deaths often. Of the Jews five times did I receive forty stripes save one. Thrice was I beaten with rods, once I was stoned, thrice I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I was in the depth of the sea: in journeying often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils from my own nation, in perils from the Gentiles, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils from false brethren: in labor and painfulness, in much watching, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness; besides those things which are without: my daily instance, the solicitude for all the churches. Who is weak, and I am not weak? who is scandalized, and I am not on fire? If I must needs glory, I will glory of the things that concern my infirmity. The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is blessed for ever, knoweth that I lie not. At Damascus, the governor of the nation under Aretas the king, guarded the city of the Damascenes, to apprehend me: and through a window in a basket was I let down by the wall, and so escaped his hands. If I must glory (it is not expedient indeed) but I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord. I know a man in Christ above fourteen years ago, whether in the body I know not, or out of the body I know not, God knoweth, such a one caught up to the third heaven. And I know such a man, whether in the body or out of the body I know not, God knoweth: that he was caught up into Paradise, and heard secret words which it is not granted to man to utter. For such a one I will glory: but for myself I will glory nothing but in my infirmities. For, though I should have a mind to glory, I shall not be foolish: for I will say the truth: but I forbear, lest any man should think of me above that which he seeth in me, or anything he heareth from me. And lest the greatness of the revelations should exalt me, there was given me a sting of my flesh, an angel of Satan, to buffet me. For which thing, thrice I besought the Lord that it might depart from me. And He said to me: My grace is sufficient for thee, for power is made perfect in infirmity. Gladly therefore will I glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may dwell in me.

**GRADUAL:** *Psalm 82. 19, 14* Let the Gentiles know that God is Thy Name: Thou alone art the Most High over all the earth. O my God, make them like a wheel, and as stubble before the wind. **TRACT** *Psalm 59. 4, 6* Thou hast moved the earth, O Lord, and hast troubled it. Heal Thou the breaches thereof, for it has been moved. That they may flee from before the bow: that Thine elect may be delivered.

**GOSPEL:** Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Luke 8. 4-15 At that time, when a very great multitude was gathered together and hastened out of the cities unto Jesus, He spoke by a similitude: The sower went out to sow his seed: and as he sowed, some fell by the wayside, and it was trodden down, and the fowls of the air devoured it. And other some fell upon a rock: and as soon as it was sprung up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. And other some fell among thorns, and the thorns, growing up with it, choked it. And other some fell upon good ground: and being sprung up, yielded fruit a hundredfold. Saying these things, He cried out: He that hath ears to hear, let him hear. And His disciples asked Him what this parable might be. To whom He said: To you it is given to know the mystery of the Kingdom of God, but to the

rest in parables: that seeing they may not see, and hearing may not understand. Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. And they by the wayside are they that hear: then the devil cometh, and taketh the word out of their heart, lest believing they should be saved. Now they upon the rock, are they who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no roots: for they believe for a while, and in time of temptation they fall away. And that which fell among thorns are they who have heard, and going their way, are choked with the cares and riches and pleasures of this life, and yield no fruit. But that on the good ground, are they who in a good and perfect heart, hearing the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit in patience. —




