

FROM THE PARISH HISTORY: CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION, 1898

Last Sunday I transcribed in the bulletin a *Boston Globe* newspaper story on St. Mary's Corpus Christi Procession from June, 1897, which our parishioner Martha Phillips had discovered in her archival research. Today, on the day we are holding our own parish Procession, I transcribe the account she found for Corpus Christi, 1898. [St. Mary's was the original name given our parish at its founding in 1870. It was renamed Mary Immaculate of Lourdes upon the dedication of the new church in 1910.]

CORPUS CHRISTI IN NEWTON

Imposing Procession at St. Mary's Church, Upper Falls

NEWTON UPPER FALLS, June 13, 1898: The feast of Corpus Christi was observed by the priests and people of St. Mary's Church in a very impressive manner, yesterday. A Procession of the Blessed Sacrament took place in the afternoon, and the triple Benediction was given. Two altars were erected outside the church in the beautiful groves adjoining the private property of the parish.

The large concourse of worshippers moved first to these two sylvan altars, thence back again to the church, where the concluding service was held. It was an imposing sight, altar boys, Sunday school children, Holy Name Society, married women's Sodality, and the young ladies' Sodality occupying prominent positions. The Sisters from the Wellesley convent, with a large contingent of their pupils, participated, and contributed effectively to the musical portion of the exercises. The congregation of St. Mary's in general and many visitors also joined in the Procession. The historical features added an unusual religious interest to the day. The Blessed Sacrament was borne by Rev. Thomas A. Walsh of St. Patrick's Church, Boston. He was attended by Rev. Cornelius Riordan, the assistant pastor, and by Rev. Florence Halloran of Boston.

The whole exercises were planned and directed by the rector, Rev. Timothy J. Danahy.

CORPUS CHRISTI

Missale Romanum 1970(MR '70)

For weekly examination of the Collects of the Roman Missal, we turn to today's Collect for the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which is identical in both forms of the Mass. The following is the 2010 ICEL translation of this prayer from the MR'70:

“O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of Your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of Your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of Your redemption. Who live and reign, etc. Amen.”

I am oftentimes struck when reading this prayer by the hoped-for outcome clause: *“that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of Your redemption.”*

Ultimately, personal experience of Christ is indispensably integral to living as a Catholic. Such faith means we assent to the articles of the Creed without crossing our fingers behind our back. It likewise means that we cleave to Jesus as our Lord and obey His commandments, *because we love Him* (cf. John 14). When we make such acts of faith in Jesus Christ, we also expect to receive graces from God that will aid us concretely in our daily life, helping us to love Him and our neighbor more (such expectation is the virtue of hope in action).

All of these things together is what is meant by the translation of *sentiamus* in the Latin original as “experience.” We trust we will experience the invisible workings of God's loving Presence in the nitty-gritty of our lives, provided we obey Him in faith, hope and love (cf. Ps. 37:4-5). Such experience of God is not about the changing winds of our emotions or feelings (even if these are important, in some measure). Faith is about *assenting* with our

intellects to the truth God reveals, and then *loving* that truth, and indeed, *loving Him*, no matter how we may be feeling (which, admittedly, may take a bit of work at times).

Saint Teresa of Calcutta (“Mother Teresa”) can help us here, for she deeply loved Christ and the destitute poor, as was evident to all, while at the same time *feeling* quite distant from Christ. We now know from her personal writings that she had precious few feelings of spiritual consolation throughout her time ministering in India, but rather, the “dark night of the soul.” Feelings come and go, they can be negative and positive, and are often influenced by circumstances. Faith, by contrast, rests solidly upon God and what he reveals, no matter how well or badly things may be going (cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church* nos. 144, 150, 156-7).

Consider the following stanzas taken from St. Thomas Aquinas' beloved Eucharistic Hymn *Adoro Te* (translation taken from the Angelus Press edition of the *Roman Catholic Daily Missal*):

*Taste and touch and vision to discern Thee fail, * But the hearing only well may here prevail * I believe whatever the Son of God hath told; * What the Truth hath spoken, that for truth I hold.*

*On the cross lay hidden but Thy Deity, * Here is hidden also Thy Humanity: * But in both believing and confessing, Lord, * Ask I what the dying thief of Thee implored.*

*Thy dread wounds, like Thomas, though I cannot see, * His be my confession, Lord and God, of Thee. * Make my faith unfeigned ever more increase, * Give me hope unfading, love that cannot cease.*

Thus, in light of Aquinas' words here, the notion of *sentiamus* (“that we may experience”) is about the interior discernment of God's grace. It is an intimate and personal spiritual perception of God's Presence in our souls, even though we cannot see Him and may not always feel His closeness. This notion of *sentiamus* is about experiential faith, or active cooperation with God's grace. This is what the



sacramental life, as well as the life of daily prayer accomplish in us and for us as Catholics. This is what we hope to receive from God by adoring Christ in the Blessed Sacrament by faith (the Collect's petition).






