

COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL

MONDAY of the FIRST WEEK of ADVENT

(Missale Romanum 1970)

For this week's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect for Monday in the First Week of Advent in the MR'70. One of the riches of the *Novus Ordo* is the new wealth of prayers and readings added to the season of Advent. Below is the 2010 ICEL translation of this Collect in the third typical edition of the *Roman Missal* (2010):

"Keep us alert, we pray, O Lord our God, as we await the advent of Christ your Son, so that, when He comes and knocks, He may find us watchful in prayer and exultant in His praise. Who lives and reigns, etc. Amen."

This prayer evokes two Scripture passages. The first Scripture passage to which our Collect alludes is Revelation 3:20, in which Our Lord says the following: *"Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if any one hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me"* (RSV). This passage is fitting material for our meditation, for Jesus wants to enjoy closer friendship with us individually by being born anew in our souls each Christmas.

The second Scripture passage this prayer evokes is one of Jesus' parables in Luke 12:35-38: *"Let your loins be girded and your lamps burning, and be like men who are waiting for their master to come home from the marriage feast, so that they may open to him at once when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes; truly, I say to you, he will put on his apron and have them sit at table, and he will come and serve them. If he comes in the second watch, or in the third, and finds them so, blessed are those servants!"*

The alertness for which we ask God in our Collect above is precisely the virtue Our Lord commends in this parable. It is an alertness born of great anticipation. The servants are not waiting around lazily, fidgeting on their phones, bored. They are excited and, at the same time, quite interiorly

focused and single-minded in whatever they are doing to prepare. They are not distracted and disintegrated with lots of extraneous things.

Our Collect provides two items for our consideration in terms of *what* exactly we are to be doing in terms of preparation: watchful prayer and exultant praise.

In some ways, the spiritual alertness which Advent bids us experience is comparable to the joy of a good cup of coffee. The warmth and robust flavor of a pleasing cup stimulates the mind and body first thing in the morning. It makes us more awake, or watchful for the occupations of the day. Similarly, this season is a welcome opportunity to pause, be single-minded and quiet, and take in the nourishment which Holy Mother Church provides in her Liturgy-*the watchful prayer par excellence*- so as to become mentally and spiritually awake.

FEAR IMPLIES THE TRANSGRESSION OF A LAW, AND A LAW IMPLIES A LAWGIVER AND A JUDGE; BUT THE TENDENCY OF INTELLECTUAL CULTURE IS TO SWALLOW UP THE FEAR IN THE SELF-REPROACH, AND SELF-REPROACH IS DIRECTED AND LIMITED TO OUR MERE SENSE OF WHAT IS FITTING AND BECOMING."

Such watchful prayer does not exist for its own sake, then. Rather, it directs us to be attuned to Christ's coming in time and His coming at the end of time. The kind of alertness of mind and body we experience following a good cup of coffee feels good- so, too, should a good Advent be for our souls, getting us ready for what's next.

The second item of preparation: our exultant praise. This may refer especially to our keeping Christmas itself, so familiarly replete with beautiful carols. As the Collect indicates, it is *when* Christ comes and knocks, that He shall find us praying (Advent), and thus, able to burst into praise at His arrival (Christmas).



THE DOGMA OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

"I will put enmities between thee and the woman." In these words the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary was announced to our first parents. It was to be the reversal of the friendship with the serpent contracted by Eve, when she listened to his voice and fell under his power. The second Eve was never to be under the power of the devil; the enmity between them was to admit of no possible exception. This involved the grace of being conceived immaculate. Mary's Immaculate Conception was the foundation of all her graces. The absence of any stain or spot of sin distinguished her from all the rest of mankind. It distinguished her from the holiest of the Saints, since they, one and all, were sinners. Her perfect sinlessness was the source of all her glory and all her majesty; it was this which opened the door to the unlimited graces that she received from God; it was this that qualified her for her divine maternity, and raised her to her throne as Queen of Heaven. "O Queen, conceived without original sin, pray for us, who have recourse to thee."

LATIN MASS PROPERS: IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

INTROIT: Introit (Isaias 61 : 10) I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, and my soul shall be joyful in my God: for He hath clothed me with the garments of salvation, and with the robe of justice He hath covered me, as a bride adorned with her jewels. *Psalm.* I will extol Thee, O Lord, for Thou hast upheld me: and hast not made my enemies to rejoice over me. *V.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — I will greatly rejoice ...

COLLECT O God, who, by the Immaculate Conception of the Virgin, didst prepare for Thy Son a worthy habitation, we beseech Thee, that as Thou didst preserve her from every stain by the foreseen death of this Thy Son, so Thou wouldst grant that we also being cleansed from guilt by her intercession, may come to Thee. Through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who with Thee liveth and reigneth in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: Proverbs 8. 22-35 The Lord possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything, from the beginning. I was set up from eternity, and of old, before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived; neither had the fountains of waters as yet sprung out; the mountains with their huge bulk had not as yet been established: before the hills I was brought forth; He had not yet made the earth, nor the rivers, nor the poles of the world. When He prepared the heavens, I was there; when with a certain law and compass He enclosed the depths; when He established the sky above, and poised the fountains of waters; when He compassed the sea with its bounds, and set a law to the waters that they should not pass their limits; when He balanced the foundations of the earth; I was with Him, forming all things, and was delighted every day, playing before Him at all times, playing in the world: and my delight is to be with the children of men. Now therefore, ye children, hear me: blessed are they that keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man that heareth me, and that watcheth daily at my gates, and waiteth at the posts of my doors. He that shall find me shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.




