OUR LADY'S GARDEN

The Feast of Our Lady's Assumption each year is a time when the Church's Blessing of Produce is used. According to the tradition of the ancient Christian Jerusalem church, when the Apostles opened Mary's tomb on the third day after her burial in order to show it to Thomas who had been absent at her "dormition", they did not find her body anymore but discovered in its place the most beautiful fragrant roses and radiantly white lilies.

In the Blessing of Herbs from the ritual of Constance the connection to Mary's Assumption is made explicit:

These healing herbs are blessed in memory of the glorious triumph over the world, the flesh and the Devil, which the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrated in her Assumption.

Thus the produce of late summer is blessed, including its flowers and plants, as bouquets for Mary the Queen of Heaven upon her entry into glory and in token of all-nature healed and re-hallowed through the Redemption of Christ Our Lord.



CATECHESIS: ON-GOING INSTRUCTION IN THE FULLNESS OF CHRISTIAN FAITH

2020 Jubilee 2021 YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST



<u>MYSTERIUM FIDEI</u> ("MYSTERY OF FAITH", ENYCLICAL LETTER OF POPE PAUL VI)

The Mystery of the Eucharist Is Verified in the Sacrifice of the Mass

For the inspiration and consolation of all, We wish to review with you, venerable brothers, the doctrine which the Catholic Church has always transmitted and unanimously teaches concerning the Mystery of the Eucharist.

We desire to recall at the very outset what may be termed the very essence of the dogma, namely, that by means of the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist, the Sacrifice of the Cross, which was once offered on Calvary, is remarkably re-enacted and constantly recalled, and its saving power exerted for the forgiveness of those sins which we daily commit.

Just as Moses with the blood of calves had sanctified the Old Testament, so also Christ Our Lord, through the institution of the Mystery of the Eucharist, with His own Blood sanctified the New Testament, whose Mediator He is. For, as the Evangelists narrate, at the Last Supper "He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them, saying: 'This is My Body, given for you: do this for a commemoration of Me.' And so with the cup, when supper was ended. This cup, He said, is the New Testament in My Blood which is to be shed for you." And by bidding the Apostles to do this in memory of Him, He made clear His will that the same sacrifice be forever repeated.

This intention of Christ was faithfully executed by the primitive Church through her adherence to the teaching of the Apostles and through her gatherings summoned to celebrate the Eucharistic Sacrifice. As St. Luke carefully testifies, "These occupied themselves continually with the Apostles' teaching, their fellowship in the breaking of bread, and the fixed times of prayer." From this practice, the faithful used to derive such spiritual strength that it was said of them that "there was one hear and soul in all the company of believers."

Moreover, the Apostle Paul, who has faithfully transmitted to us what he had received from the Lord, is clearly speaking of the Eucharistic Sacrifice when he points out that Christians, precisely because they have been made partakers at the table of the Lord, ought not to take part in pagan sacrifices.

LATIN MASS PROPERS: TWELFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 69:2-3. O GOD, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me: let mine enemies be confounded and ashamed, who seek my soul. *Ps. ibid. 4.* Let them be turned backward and blush for shame, who desire evils to me. $\rlap{/}{V}$. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — O God, come to my assistance ... COLLECT O ALMIGHTY and merciful God, of whose gift it cometh that Thy faithful do unto Thee worthy and laudable service: grant us, we beseech Thee, that we may run without stumbling towards the attainment of Thy promises. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the Second Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians, 3. 4-9. BRETHREN: Such confidence we have through Christ towards God. Not that we are sufficient to think anything of ourselves, as of ourselves: but our sufficiency is from God. Who also hath made us fit ministers of the new testament, not in the letter, but in the spirit: for the letter killeth, but the spirit quickeneth. Now if the ministration of death, engraven with letters upon stones, was glorious, so that the children of Israel could not steadfastly behold the face of Moses, for the glory of his countenance; which is made void: how shall not the ministration of the Spirit be rather in glory? For if the ministration of condemnation be glory, much more the ministration of justice aboundeth in glory.

GRADUAL: Psalm 33:2-3. I WILL bless the Lord at all times; His praise shall ever be in my mouth. In the Lord shall my soul be praised: let the meek hear, and rejoice. ALLELUIA: Psalm 87:2. Alleluia, Alleluia. O Lord, the God of my salvation, I have cried in the day and in the night before Thee. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Luke, 10. 23-37. AT THAT TIME, Jesus said to His disciples: Blessed are the eyes that see the things which you see. For I say to you, that many prophets and kings have desired to see the things that you see, and have not seen them; and to hear the things that you hear, and have not heard them. And behold a certain lawyer stood up, tempting Him, and saying: Master, what must I do to possess eternal life? But He said to him: What is written in the law? how readest thou? He answering, said: Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbor as thyself. And He said to him: Thou hast answered rightly: this do, and thou shalt live. But he, wishing to justify himself, said to Jesus: And who is my neighbor? And Jesus answering, said: A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among robbers, who also stripped him, and having wounded him went away, leaving him half dead. And it chanced that a certain priest went down the same way, and seeing him, passed by. In like manner also a Levite, when he was near the place and saw him, passed by. But a certain Samaritan being on his journey, came near him, and seeing him, was moved with compassion, and going up to him, bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine; and setting him upon his own beast, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. And the next day he took out two pence, and gave to the host, and said: Take care of him, and whatsoever thou shalt spend over and above, I, at my return, will repay thee. Which of these three, in thine opinion, was neighbor to him that fell among robbers? But he said: He that showed mercy to him. And Jesus said to him: Go and do thou in like manner.
