'TE DEUM" FOR THE SAFE RELEASE OF FR. PIERLUIGI MACCALLI, S.M.A.

Just before the 5:30 P.M. Mass on Thursday, October 8th, I

received a text message and a voicemail from Fr. Desiré Salako in Africa, relaying the joyful news that his missionary priest Fr. Pierluigi Maccalli had been freed.

On Saturday, October 10th, the *New York Times* reported from Dakar, Senegal, on the story: "4 HOSTAGES ARE RELEASED BY MALI ALLIES OF AL QUAEDA."


Four hostages held by armed insurgents in Mali were freed on Thursday after the country's newly-formed government released around 200 prisoners, including some suspected of being jihadists.

The four hostages released included Soumaila Cissé, a prominent Malian politician, Sophie Pétronin, a French aid worker who had been held for almost four years, and two Italians: Pierluigi Maccalli, a priest abducted in neighboring Niger in 2018, and Nicola Chiacchio, who was kidnapped last year during a solo bicycle trip.

...In Italy, Foreign Minister Luigi Di Maio welcomed the "good news" of the release. "Father Pierluigi Maccalli and Nicola Chiacchio are finally free and well," Mr. DiMaio said on Twitter.

The Malian authorities said the four hostages had been held by Jama'at Nusrat al-Islam wal-Muslimin, or the Group for the Support of Islam and Muslims, a coalition of Al-Quaeda aligned groups in Mali.

On this World Mission Sunday we give thanks to God in "Te Deum" for Fr. Maccalli's deliverance, and we do not forget to pray for the intentions of all captives throughout the world.




COVER: Symbol of St.



<u>MYSTERIUM FIDEI</u> ("MYSTERY OF FAITH", ENYCLICAL LETTER OF POPE PAUL VI)

Christ Our Lord Is Present in the Sacrament of the Eucharist by Transubstantiation (continued)

The Fathers took special care to warn the faithful that in reflecting on this most august Sacrament, they should not trust to their senses, which read only the properties of bread and wine, but rather the words of Christ which have power to transform, change and transmute the bread and wine into His Body and Blood. For as those same Fathers often said, the power that accomplishes this is that same power by which God Almighty, at the beginning of time, created the world out of nothing.

"We have been instructed in these matters and filled with an unshakeable faith," says St. Cyril of Alexandria, at the end of a sermon on the mysteries of faith, "that that which seems to be bread, is not bread, though it tastes like it, but the Body and Blood of Christ, and that which seems to be wine, is not wine, though it too tastes as such, but the Blood of Christ...draw inner strength by receiving this bread as spiritual food and your soul will rejoice."

St. John Chrusostom emphasizes this point, saying: "It is not the power of man which makes what is put before us the Body and Blood of Christ, but the power of Christ Himself who was crucified for us. The priest standing there in the place of Christ says these

"words but their power and grace are from God. 'This is My Body,' he says, and these words transform what lies before him."

Cyril, Bishop of Alexandria, is in full agreement with the Bishop of Constantinople when he writes in his commentary on the Gospel of Matthew: "Christ said indicating (the bread and wine): 'This is My Body,' and 'This is My Blood,' in order that you might not judge what you see to be a mere figure. The offerings, by the hidden power of God Almighty, are changed into Christ's Body and Blood, and by receiving these we come to share in the life-giving and sanctifying efficacy of Christ."


Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, dealing with the Eucharistic change, says: "Let us be assured that this is not what nature formed, but what the blessing consecrated, and that greater efficacy resides in the blessing than in nature, for by the blessing nature is changed." To confirm the truth of this mystery, he recounts many of the miracles described in the Scriptures, including Christ's Birth of the Virgin Mary, and then turning to the work of Creation, concludes thus: "Surely the word of Christ, which could make out of nothing that which did not exist, can change things already in existence into what they were not. For it is no less extraordinary to give things new natures than to change their natures."




