Pastor's Note



Fr. Higgins DOM PROSPER GUARANGER, O.S.B. AND THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

The spiritual joy of this Gaudete Sunday converges with the joy of the Immaculate Conception on this Sunday within its Octave. Dom Prosper Guéranger, O.S.B., is one of the great figures of the Catholic Restoration in France during the 19th Century. He is considered to be the founder of what became the Liturgical Renewal Movement, a Movement which reached its apogee at the time the Second Vatican Council convened. His theological scholarship played an important rôle in the two solemn definitions of Pope Pius IX, the Immaculate Conception (1854) and Papal Infallibility (1870).

As a young monk at the age of 18, he received a special grace of inspiration for grasping the mystery of Our Lady's Immaculate Conception. He writes of it:

It was then when the merciful and compassionate Queen, Mother of God, came to my assistance in a way which was as triumphant as it was unexpected. On December 8th, 1823, while I was doing my meditation with the Community, and I approached my argument—the mystery of the day—with my rational viewpoints as usual, suddenly I was led to believe in Mary Immaculate in her conception. Speculation and effort were united effortlessly in this mystery.

I felt a sweet joy in my consent, without rapture, with a gentle peace and sincere conviction. Mary deigned to transform me with her blessed hands without anxiety, without vehemence: one nature disappeared to leave room for another. I did not say anything to anyone, especially because I did not imagine the significance that this revelation would have




for me. I was undoubtedly overwhelmed; but today I am still overwhelmed when understanding the scope of the favor that the Holy Virgin deigned to grant me that day.

It is so crucial for us to have a clear idea of what the Church means by her dogma and doctrine of the Immaculate Conception. There are three important points.

- Mary, by a singular privilege of God, was conceived without any stain of Original Sin, therefore <u>Immaculate</u>.
- Mary also never committed any personal sin over the course of her life. She was not only conceived without sin, but she also lived without sin.
- Mary was free of all concupiscence. She had the *donum integritatis*—the "gift of integrity". She did not have the inclinations to lust and anger and vainglorious pride with which everyone else (under the law of sin as we are) has to contend.

MIRACLES OF LOURDES AND THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

(Msgr. Robert Hugh Benson, an Anglican convert to Catholicism, made a pilgrimage to Lourdes on its 50th Jubilee Year, 1908. Here he describes watching the Procession of the Blessed Sacrament moving along the lines of very sick people and the miracles which occurred on that day.)

A sudden cry had broken out and it ran through the whole space; waxing in volume as it ran, till the heads beneath my window shook with it also; hands clapped, voices shouted: "Un miracle! Un miracle!"

I was on my feet, staring and crying out. Them, quietly the shaking ceased, and the shouting died to a murmur; and the ombrellino moved on, and again the voice of the priest thrilled thin and clear, with a touch of triumphant thankfulness: "Vous êtes la Resurrection and la Vie" (You are the Resurrection and the Life). And again, with entreaty once more since there were two thousand sick untouched by that Power, and time pressed—that infinitey moving plea" "Seigneur, celui qui vous aime est malade!" And: "Seigneur, faites que je marche! Seigneur, faites que j'entende!" (Lord, he whom You love is sick...Lord, grant that I may walk! Lord, grant that I may hear!)

And then the finger of God flashed down, and again and again; and each time a sick and broken body sprang from its bed of pain and stood upright; and the crowd smiled and roared and sobbed. Five times I saw that swirl and rush; the last when the Te Deum pealed out from the church steps as Jesus in His Sacrament came home again. And there were two that I did not see. There were seven in all that afternoon.
