

JANUARY 18th—25th: OCTAVE WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

Cach year between January 18th -25th the Church observes an

Octave Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. In the Catholic Sanctoral Calendar the week is buttressed by two important feasts of the Apostles Peter and Paul: January 18th is the (traditional) Feast of St. Peter's Chair at Rome and January 25th is the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. Thus, the Octave Week of Prayer is symbolically grounded in the authority of the two Princes of the Apostles Peter and Paul who share a Martyrs' Feast Day on June 29th.

The Feast of St. Peter's Chair at Rome on January 18th was instituted by Pope Paul IV in 1558. The earlier date of a Feast of St. Peter's Chair on February 22nd was kept but distinguished as the Feast of St. Peter's Chair at Antioch where Peter had earlier acted as Bishop. The "Chair" of Peter was a literal piece of furniture upon which Peter sat to teach. The remains of this venerable Chair are preserved in a huge reliquary, which was the work of the artist Bernini. The "Chair of Peter" is also the intangible charism of Peter's authority, the "Petrine Office" in the Church which is part of God's Providential Plan. It is summed up by the pithy Latin phrase: "Ubi Petrus, ibi Ecclesia." (Where Peter is, there is the Church). Christian unity finds its magnet in the Chair of St. Peter. It is good for us to begin the Octave Week of Prayer for Christian Unity with a clear affirmation of the Petrine Office as Christ's own.

LATIN MASS PROPERS: SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

INTROIT: Psalm 65. 4, 1-2 Let all the earth adore Thee, O God, and sing to Thee: let it sing a psalm to Thy Name, O Most High. Psalm. Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His Name: give glory to His praise. V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth to the bridegroom, and saith to him: Every man at first setteth forth good wine, and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse; but thou has kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee: and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him. —

ON ACCOUNT OF THE PANDEMIC CARDINAL SEAN HAS EXTENDED THE JUBILEE YEAR TO JUNE 2022



MIRACLES OF LOURDES AND THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

(Msgr. Robert Hugh Benson, an Anglican convert to Catholicism, made a pilgrimage to Lourdes on its 50th Jubilee Year, 1908. Here he describes watching the Procession of the Blessed Sacrament moving along the lines of very sick people and the miracles which occurred on that day.)

IN FACT, LOURDES, AS A WHOLE, IS AN EXCELLENT LITTLE COMPENDIUM OF CATHOLIC THEOLOGY AND GOSPELTRUTH. There was once a marriage feast, and the Mother of Jesus was there with her Son. There was no wine. She told her Son what He already knew; He seemed to deprecate her words; but He obeyed them, and the water became wine.

There is at Lourdes not a marriage feast, but something very like a deathbed. The Mother of Jesus is there with her Son. It is she again who takes the initiative. "Here is water," she seems to say; "dig, Bernadette, and you will find it." But it is no more than water. Then she turns to her Son. "They have water," she says, "but no more." And then He comes forth in His power. "Draw out now from all the sick beds of the world and bear them to the Governor of the Feast. Use the commonest things in the world physical pain and common water. Bring them together, and wait until I pass by." Then Jesus of Nazareth passes by; and the sick leap from their beds, and the blind see, and the lepers are cleansed, and devils are cast out. Oh, yes! the parallel halts; but is it not neat enough?




